WHEAT SMOKING DOES FOR BOYS.

A medical man, struck with the large number of boys under fifteen years of age whom he observed smoking, was led to inquire into it. He took for his purpose thirty-eight, aged from nine to fifteen, and carefully examined them. In twenty-seven he discovered injurious traces of the habit.

In twenty-two there were various disorders of the circulation and digestion, palpitation of the heart, and more or less taste for strong drink. In two there were frequent bleedings of the nose, and in one had slight ulceration of the mucous membrane of the mouth, which disappeared on ceasing the use of tobacco for some days. The doctor treated them all with weakness, but with little effect until the smoking was discontinued, when health and strength were restored.—Medical Journal.

FARMERS' FLOCKS.

The farmer has plenty of room on his farm for poultry, and the land so devoted will return as large, if not larger profits than will an equal area planted to a crop, or used for other stock. Cheap houses can be built which will bring in the cash in the winter season, by producing eggs, thus largely aiding him to purchase many necessities while waiting for this crop to grow.

This is the best time to build a house for poultry, and the risk of loss in keeping them is very large percentage upon the cost. The certain return that may be realized by a farmer, on a small or large scale, where the business is conducted properly. There is more profit in raising poultry, and making a specialty of eggs, considering the cost and outlay, and which can be had annually, than from many other sources, not excepting the raising of sheep and pigs, as the animals are fed and cared for at an expenditure for labor that would be appalling if bestowed on the hens, which will pay cash individually daily for the receipts.

Farmers would do well to look into this matter, and now is the time to consider it before winter sets in. The early part of the year is the best time to begin, as the birds may be sold at a very reasonable price, and we call the attention of those who have the facilities for keeping fowls, of taking advantage of their opportunities.

DOUBLE WALL PROTECTION TO HOUSES.

Walls that are so constructed as to permit of the use of sawdust, chaff, or straw or tan bark as a filling between two layers of boards, make very warm poultry houses, but they are expensive. Houses may be made comfortable by the use of tarrad paper, but the paper should not be fastened on the boards of the wall direct, but rather so as to provide an air space between the paper and the boards, by first nailing the paper to the studs and then tacking the paper to the lath. In this manner the house may be made secure from both cold and dampness.

But farmers have another method, which is cheap, and that is to use the corn stalks for protecting against cold. It is simply to stand the stalks against the walls of the poultry house in a manner to guard against beating rains and drifting snows. Almost any kind of wind break will serve to lessen the cold in the poultry house. Hens can endure low degrees of temperature when the air is still. It is the wind that drives them under shelter or freezes their combs and wattles. Fine boughs or any material that will serve to protect against things will add to the comfort of the flock. There are many methods of constructing warm houses, but they are also expensive, and the advantages can be secured by using some material on the farm, such as corn stalks, it will be saving.

POULTRY YARD. FEATHER PULLING AND EGG EATING.

At one time the vice of feather pulling was supposed to be occasioned by the lack of some substance required by the fowls, and hence resort was had to allowing salt in the food, meat green food, etc., but no cure was found.

We have now learned that the vice is due to idleness; hence poultrymen aim to keep their hens busily at work. Knowing the cause, the difficulty may be prevented to a certain extent, but to cure the vice is not so easy.

First the gully hen—the one that pulls the feathers from the others—must be discovered or she will teach the whole flock. As a rule, the cock is the first victim to be deprived of his feathers, and when he is picked nearly naked, some of the hens also come in for the torture.
