



Clover was grown with barley, oats and wheat, and the results noted. The roots of the clover sink deeper than the cereals and do not interfere with them. While the cereals grow to full size the while the cereals grow to full size the clover is very small above ground. After the cereal is cut the clover shoots up and furnishes a very good grazing ground. If ploughed again it fertilizes the soil much better than
