SCHEFKET PASHA IS REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN ASSASSINATED

Former Minister of War in Young Turk Cabinet Reported Killed by Assassins.

RISE IN CONSTANTINOPLE IS ALSO REPORTED TODAY.

Neither Rumor Has Been Officially Confirmed by Despatches Direct From Capital.

London, Jan. 4.—Despatches reached here tonight with rumors of the assassination of Mahomed Schefket Pasha, the former Turkish minister of war and commander of the constitutional army, which forced the surrender of Abdul Hamid. There are rumors also of a rising in Constantinople, but despatches received direct from that city tonight make no mention of such occurrences in the capital.

Hodeidah, Arabia, Jan. 3.—The Italian cruisers Piedmonte and Puglia, which form part of the Italian fleet cruising in the Red sea on the lookout for vessels carrying Turkish troops or contraband of war to Turkish military encampment at Djibouti, have a large force of Turkish troops stationed. No casualties are reported on the Italian side although the Turkish military encampment at Djibouti has been reported to be bombarded with guns.

Turkey to Sue for Peace.

London, Jan. 4.—The cabinet crisis in Turkey has led to a renewal of the rumors that the Turkish parliament is to be dissolved as a preliminary to the Porte suing for peace. Of this there is no confirmation at the present time. On the other hand Italy is preparing to send more troops to Cyrenaica, and it is reported that the reassembling of the Italian parliament has been postponed, which would indicate that there is no immediate prospect of peace. The despatches received today from the seat of war indicate quiet conditions around Tripoli.

Egypt to Enforce Neutrality.

London, Jan. 4.—In order to prevent the possibility of Italian demands for an indemnity, the Egyptian government is taking strong measures to enforce neutrality and to prevent the smuggling of Turkish arms and ammunition into Tripoli. Posts have been established all along the coast to Alexandria. The western land frontier is being watched and precautions have been taken along the Suez Canal.

EXPRESS ROBBERY CASE.

Eugene Bourdon on Trial in Regina, Pleads Not Guilty.

Regina, Jan. 3.—Eugene Bourdon, charged with being implicated in the Canadian Northern Express robbery here, came up before Magistrate Trant this afternoon for the preliminary hearing, when the prisoner elected to have his case summarily disposed of by the police magistrate, at the same time pleading not guilty. Following the evidence of the Canadian Northern detective, Thomas A. Bredt, who told of the arrest of the prisoner at a boarding house on St. John street, and the finding of \$136 on him, Ernest Brunnel, the man who was last committed for trial, was called as a witness, despite the objection of his counsel, as well as that of Bourdon's counsel. The text of Brunnel's evidence was identical with his confession, which was put on as evidence at his preliminary hearing. The case will be resumed tomorrow.
