

They Can Plactice Now. A special convocation of the medical faculty of Toronto University was held in the hall of A special convocation of the hall of the School of Practical Science yesterday afternoon. Sir Daniel Wilson conferred degrees on those who successfully passed their final examinations a few days ago. In the course of a short address Dr. Aikins, dean of the medical faculty, said that the work had increased so much that it was necessary either to increase the terms by three or four months or to lengthen the course of an another year. He also said that the Government should establish a school of pathology, which was badly needed. Sir Daniel Wilson delivered a short address referring to the good work Prof. R. Ramay Wright is doing under Koch and Pasteur and giving the young graduates some good advice.


