ANNUAL MEETING.

The eleventh Anniversary of this Society was celebrated by a General Meeting, held on the 6th of July, 1853, in the National School House, Quebec, at seven o'clock, P. M.

(*Divine Service having been previously held in All-Saints Chapel.*)

The REV. OFFICIAL MACKIE, D. D., took the Chair, and after the usual prayers and some introductory remarks, called upon the acting Secretary to read the Annual Report.

The Report having been read, it was moved by W. ANDREW, Esq. seconded by the REV. J. TORRANCE, and Resolved,

1. That the Report now read, be adopted and printed under the direction of the Central Board.

Moved by the REV. G. PEACOCK, and seconded by the HON. G. PEMBERTON,

2. That this Meeting, while thankfully acknowledging the goodness of Almighty God, in the measure of success which has attended the labours of the Society during the past year, desires, at the same time, to express its conviction, that, without increased exertion on the part of the Churchmen of this Diocese, the Society cannot enlarge the sphere of its Missionary labours or make any adequate provision for religious education.

Moved by REV. E. C. PARKIN, and seconded by JAMES MACLAREN, Esq.,

3. That this Meeting while regretting the absence of the LORD BISHOP of the Diocese, President of the Society, is anxious to avail itself of the opportunity, of expressing the deep interest, with which it regards his labours in the cause of the Church.

Moved by W. SPRAGGE, Esq., and seconded by the REV. J. CARRY,

4. That this Meeting desires to give expression to its continued interest in the welfare and progress of the Sister Societies of British North America.

Moved by H. J. NOAD, Esq., and seconded by C. N. MONTIZAMBERT, Esq.

5. That the Vice-Presidents of last year be re-elected, (see page 3) and that the following Gentlemen do compose the Central Board, in addition to the ex-officio Members, (see ditto.)

Moved by Dr. SEWELL, and seconded by I. R. ECKHAUT, Esq.,

6. That to the Officers of the Society for the past year, the thanks of the Society are eminently due, for their valuable and successful services.

Moved by REV. A. W. MOUNTAIN, seconded by R. SYMES, Esq., and Resolved,

7. That this Meeting do adjourn till to-morrow evening, at seven o'clock. The Doxology was then sung, and the Meeting was dismissed with the Benediction.

ANNUAL REPORT.

The duty of rendering the Report, which annually devolves upon your Board, may not be approached without an expression of unfeigned thankfulness to the God and Father of us all, who has "crowned the year with His goodness," and caused His blessing to attend the labours of this Society.

Yet, when we contemplate the varied objects, for the promotion of which this Society is established,—objects all centring in one grand point,—the glory of our Redeemer, in the salvation of immortal souls, the fact is pressed sorrowfully upon our minds, that the sacrifices for the maintenance of pure and undefiled Religion, by "those who profess and call themselves Christians," do not sufficiently manifest the divine rule of charity as the guide of our conduct, nor our contributions for the support of that Religion, prove, to the extent most devoutly to be wished, our appreciation of the inestimable blessings it unfolds.

We hear much of the progress of the Province in wealth and population; we take note of the prosperity of the community in which we dwell, and we rejoice in the legitimate acquisition, of much that contributes to its secular advancement and wordly comfort.

But, while the sense of these temporal blessings, should evoke the expression of gratitude to the bountiful Giver of all good things, and prompt in our breasts the inquiry of the Psalmist, "What shall I render unto the Lord for all His benefits toward me?" it is but too evident, that our liberality in the maintenance of the Gospel among ourselves, and in its dissemination among the scattered settlers in the Diocese, has not kept pace with the advancement of our social welfare, and that our hearts, as a people, have not been proportionably animated, by the pure and self denying spirit of christian love.

We admit, however, and the admission is made with feelings of devout thankfulness to God, that exceptions to the rule exist, and are, as this Report will shew, much on the increase. A sense of religious obligation in this behalf, has, it is to be believed, had its weight on the minds of many members of the Church in this Diocese, for during the past year, the appeal of the Clergy has been responded to by the laity, in a manner calculated to afford encouragement to increased exertions. Twenty-nine names, all of them except one, resident in Quebec, have been added to the list of life Subscriptions; and five of the old Members on that list, among whom is His Excellency the Governor General, have doubled their contributions. To the Quebec List of Annual Subscribers, of £1 5s. and upwards, forty-eight names have been added within the year:—so that the excess this year over the amount contributed in Quebec, in the year preceding our last anniversary, has been £588 5s. 1d., and the total amount collected in the Diocese exceeds that contributed last year by £561 15s. 1d.

These results encourage the pleasing hope that the efforts of this Society, to carry the bread of life to the famishing, will be more and more appreciated and seconded by all those of our Communion, to whom God has vouchsafed the means of aiding its operations.

For no one who considers the position of the Church in Canada, can fail to perceive the necessity that exists, for all who prize her Institutions, and would hand them down in all their integrity, to the generations to come, to rally round the Standard of this Society, and lend to it the aid of their earnest prayers, their vigorous exertions, and their liberal contributions.

The Report from this Association manifests an increased interest on the part of Churchmen within its limits, in the prosperity of the Society and in the success of its operations.

A brief extract from that Report may not be out of place.

“The Reports of the several Missions shew, upon the whole an increase over the subscription of last year which is a pleasing indication that the Association is not losing ground, and that when fully represented and the funds shewn to be judiciously applied, the people generally are found willing to give it their countenance and support.”

Of this amount £350 was contributed in the Parish of Sherbrooke, being an excess of £50 over the amount raised in that Parish last year, for Church purposes.

The Mission of Compton and Waterville has nearly doubled its subscription list of last year. The completion of its new Church, with the exception of the fence, is reported by the Missionary, who expresses much satisfaction with its neat and church-like appearance.

St. Paul's Church, Kingsey, has been newly painted and its steeple repaired. The finishing coat of paint has, however, been unavoidably deferred, from the want of funds. The fencing of its Burial Ground is under contract.

Your Board regret their inability to report the completion of the Church commenced, two years ago, at Duds-well. The Missionary on the spot expresses the hope that, in the course of the present year, it will be finished, and another, in the lower part of the same Township, commenced.

The Burial Ground, at Robinson, has been fenced and consecrated.

At Hatley, a laudable response has been made to the recommendations contained in the Circular addressed by the Lord Bishop, in December, to the Missionaries of the S. P. G. and their Church-wardens. A meeting was held and a subscription opened for the purchase of a Parsonage House, which it is to be hoped will, ere long, be effected.

MEGANTIC DISTRICT ASSOCIATION.

The Report of this Association shews that the exertions of the Clergy, in awakening an interest in the cause of the Society, have not been without success.

Collections for Local objects (including appropriations from subscriptions to the Society), but exclusive of £75 raised by a Bazaar at Point Levi, £170 16s. 2d.

Among the most pleasing instances of Christian exertion in this part of the Diocese, may be mentioned the completion, in the Mission of New Ireland and Inverness, of three Churches (which had long remained in a very unfinished state), through the indefatigable efforts of your late Secretary, the Rev. W. Wickes, followed up by the equally zealous exertions of the Rev. H. Roe, the present Missionary. Nor is it less gratifying to be able to state that, in the extensive Mission of St. Giles, two new Churches are now ready for consecration, and that several other important works are there in progress. At Lamby's Mills, a new Church has been commenced with a zeal which promises a speedy completion of the good work. A new Church has also been erected at Cranbourne, towards which the settlers have contributed in labor and materials. The Burial Ground at Frampton East, has been enclosed by a substantial paling. That at Frampton West, has been nearly completed. At Standon, a dependency of the former of these two Missions, it is in contemplation to erect a Church with the least possible delay—the site for it having been already promised.

The Missionary at Drummondville reports the commencement of a new Church at that place, which however, from local causes, is likely to be slow in progress. He regrets that owing to the difficulty of effecting the necessary improvements within the Mission, he could not during the year, raise any contributions in aid of the Society's funds, further than the collections made after the stated sermons.

The amount raised at Nicolet during the year, in aid of the Special Fund for the endowment of that Parish, is £3 15s.

At Port Neuf, a neat Parsonage of substantial materials has been commenced, and it is to be hoped that the work will be vigorously carried on until completed.

A new Stone Church is about to be commenced at Valcartier, towards which the Society has made a conditional grant.

GASPE DISTRICT ASSOCIATION.

Difficulties arising from the distances of the Clergy from each other have hitherto prevented the organization of this Association. The returns are more favorable than those of last year. The people of Sandy Beach have raised about £80 towards the completion of their Church, and £8 towards the Parsonage House. They have also purchased a set of Communion Plate. The Mission is much indebted to the kind liberality of the Rev. E. Cusack, for the sum of £24 6s. 8d., sent out from England for its benefit. Of this sum, £15 has been expended in the purchase of a glebe. Towards the new Church at Mal Baie, about £10 has been contributed by friends in the Island of Jersey. A lady of the same place has also made a liberal donation to that Church, of a handsome Altar Cloth and set of Communion Plate. In the Mission of Gaspé Basin, £156 have been collected for local purposes. Its Churches have been completed, and its Parsonage House is progressing.

THE OFFICERS OF THE SOCIETY.

Your Board has to report under this head, the removal from the Diocese, of the Rev. W. Wickes, M. A., the zealous Secretary and Travelling Agent of the Society. That gentleman resigned his appointment much to the regret of your Board, in October last, at which time the Rev. Dr. Adamson was elected to succeed him.

It is also the melancholy duty of your Board to record the death, since the last Anniversary, of one of its Members, the late David Burnet, Esq.

BOOK AND TRACT DEPOSITORY.

The Depository for the sale of Bibles, Prayer Books, and other religious works and tracts, has been removed, since the death of Mrs. Edie, to the Fancy Store of Miss Fuller, Couillard street.

A large addition to the stock is shortly expected to arrive.

During the year, 30 Bibles, 4 Testaments, 25 Prayer Books and Tracts, to the value of £7 10s., have been distributed gratuitously.

The amount of sales, exclusive of all expenses and of a debt of £10 due to the Depository, has been £29 15s. 9d.

EDUCATION.

Your Board have to report that a Sub-Committee was appointed at its January meeting, for the purpose of considering the best means of promoting a sound scriptural education, in conformity with the principles of the Church, among the youth of its communion.

That Committee addressed Circular Letters to the Clergy of the Diocese, on some important points connected with this subject.

Several of the answers to those questions have been received, and the Committee, it is hoped, will soon be prepared to recommend some feasible plan for the attainment of this, the second object of the Society's Institution.

In the meantime, a beginning has been made, by the grant of £10 per annum, to a School at Inverness.

TRAVELLING MISSIONARIES.

The Rev. A. A. Allen, having received the appointment of Travelling Missionary, was stationed, during the summer of last year, at Grosse Isle, for the purpose of ministering to the Emigrants, from time to time detained there, espe-

cially to the Sick and Dying, at the Protestant Hospitals of the Establishment.

Extracts from the Journal kept by him, during his sojourn on the Island, appeared in the "Canadian Ecclesiastical Gazette."

Since the latter end of October last, that gentleman has been employed in visiting the remote and destitute settlements in the District of St. Francis—the Association of that District having engaged to pay £50 per annum towards his salary. His Journal furnishes a deplorable picture of the spiritual condition of the people in many of those settlements. Long left as sheep without a shepherd, they have been visited by grievous wolves who have gone among them, not sparing the flock. Error, fanaticism and infidelity, however, there is reason to hope, are gradually disappearing before the light of God's word, and the Missionary feels encouraged in the belief, that through the Divine blessing vouchsafed to his feeble ministrations, he has neither run nor labored in vain.

life and energy, which have, during the past year, been manifested by the friends of the Society, will become more and more general throughout the Diocese, until every true Churchman has joined its ranks—then, and not till then, may it be expected that, through the Divine blessing, its grand aim will be fulfilled in the advancement of that Kingdom of the Redeemer, which His own precious blood has purchased to Himself.

(Same as the foregoing, only instead of the words in Italics, say) for and towards the encouragement and support of Missionaries and Clergymen of the United Church of England and Ireland, within the said Diocese of Quebec,—the creating a fund towards the augmentation of the Stipends of Poor Clergymen of the said United Church within the said Diocese,—and making Provision for those who may be incapacitated by age and infirmity, and for the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy of the said Church in the said Diocese.

Or,

For and towards the encouragement of Education, and the support of Day Schools and Sunday Schools in the said Diocese of Quebec, in conformity with the principles of the United Church of England and Ireland.

Or,

For and towards a Fund for assisting persons preparing for the Ministry of the Gospel in the United Church of England and Ireland, within the said Diocese of Quebec.

Or,

For and towards a Fund for circulating, in the said Diocese of Quebec, the Holy Scriptures, the Book of Common Prayer of the United Church of England and Ireland, and the Books and Tracts approved of by the said Church Society for circulation within the said Diocese of Quebec.

Or,

As an aid towards the erection, endowment and maintenance of Churches according to the Establishment of the United Church of England and Ireland within the Diocese of Quebec,—the erection of and maintenance of Parsonage Houses,—the setting apart of Burial Grounds and Church-yards,—and the Endowment and support of Parsonages and Rectories, according to the said Establishment within the said Diocese.

III. *A Devise of Real Estate for the general purposes of the Society.*

I give and devise unto the "Church Society of the Diocese of Quebec," incorporated by a Statute of the Province of Canada, passed in the fifteenth year of the Reign of Her Majesty QUEEN VICTORIA, all and singular, &c., (Describe the Real Estate clearly.) To have and to hold the said, &c., unto the said Church Society of the Diocese of Quebec, and their successors, for ever; upon trust to hold and apply the same, and the rents, issues and profits thereof to and for the uses and purposes of the said Church Society, as specified in the said Act of Incorporation, and none other, and under the provisions of the aforesaid Act of Incorporation of the said Church Society.

IV. *A Devise of Real Estate for any one or more of the specific purposes of the Society.*

Same as in No. 3—only instead of the words in Italics insert the specific purposes, as in No. 2.

V. *A Devise to the Society of a Site for Church, &c.*

Same as in No. 3, down to the words "for ever,"—then go on as follows:—to the uses and upon the trusts following, that is to say: upon trust to hold the same for ever hereafter, as and for the place and Site of a Church

and Church-yard, and Burial Ground, for the sole use and benefit of Members of the United Church of England and Ireland, residing in places adjacent to the said site and premises within the said Diocese of Quebec, being in full communion with the same, according to the doctrines and discipline of the said United Church of England and Ireland, and for no other purpose, and under the provisions of the aforesaid Act of Incorporation of the said Church Society.
