

THE MENACE TO GERMANY'S TRADE.

The duty has been taken off imported hides, but the price of boots and shoes has nearly doubled in the American retail markets. Lumber, coal, bacon, beef, ham, lard, sugar and salt have gone up in price; but the tariff has been reduced on all these articles within the last four years. And yet there stands before the door a sinister sceptre foretelling danger to Germany's exports and her whole economic life—the disturbance of German commercial relations with her best client—England. The Liberal Government in England is on its deathbed. It has lived long enough, however, for the Conservative idea in England to become stronger

"A Conservative Government stands at the door, and with it Tariff Reform. That is not a possibility, nor a probability, but, according to the opinion of competent politicians, it is a certain, of competent politicians, it is a certain, certain the Tariff Reform movement has made trecently the Tariff Reform movement has made tre-mendous progress. Curlously enough, such pro-gress has been made especially in places where there is a preponderance of commerce and shipping, for example—seven out of the eight members for Liverpool are Tariff Reformers, and the majority of London members are in favor of Tariff Reform. Even Manchester is beginning to turn to the new doctrine.

doctrine.

"There are various reasons for this change of opinion. The deciding factor has been the country's need of money. Direct taxes, such as death duties, are very heavy, but the demands on the treasury still continue to increase, and the necessity for new and more productive sources of revenue is made sense.

treasury still continue to increase, and the necessity for new and more productive sources of revenue is made apparent.

"British Tariff Reform hits us the hardest, for between Germany and England there exists the most extensive exchange of goods. Our relations with England are on the principle of the 'most favored nation.' England can therefore place a considerable tax on German wares, without the possibility of our retaliating. Enormous damage to our trade and industry will arise from the fact that our once free imports into England will in future fall away.

"There is also another aspect of considerable importance. Tariff Reform, even more than the Patents Act, will cause German manufacturers to erect factories on the English side of the Channel. What enormous damage this will do the German worker, and how it will benefit his English conferce, is easily seen. . . . In future the German nation will not only have to bear the tremendous burden of her own naval armaments, but also a large part of England's in the shape of tariffs.

"For a long time I have pointed out the probable consequences attending the naval question. So long as the battle was confined to maritime matters, competition was more expensive for England than for Germany, as England has a much larger expenditure for maintaining her superiority. Through the partial removal of the battle-ground to economic matters, Germany's burden is increased enormously. "The introduction of Tariff Reform in Great Britain will be such a blow for our trade and industry, that political anxieties sink into significance."

There is a good deal of truth in this writer's conclusions. A policy of Tariff Reform, moderate protection, Great Britain, will provide an additional means of setting the large and necessarily increasing expendices demanded by national and Imperial responsibilities, will safeguard the home market and stimulate the great reductive industries which now suffer from the free

Estate duties in Great Britain are important sources of revenue. Three were revalued the other day and it was found that the duty payable in excess of the amount reached by the preliminary valuation was \$4,500,000. The estate of Mr. Henry Wills was asked to pay an additional \$2,400,000 on \$16,000,000 added valuation. Lord Winterstone's estate was found to be \$7,000,000 larger than originally estimated and this excess called for extra duties of \$1,100,000. Miss Morrison's heirs paid an additional levy of \$1,000,000 in consequence of the discovery of \$11,500,000 of property not included in the preliminary report.
