THE WORLD OF WORK.

Railway Men Striking for Better Wages
—An Incontive to Marriage.

A demand for an increase of wages has been made by all the locomotive engineers and firemen employed on the St. Paul road, and the demand is accompanied by an intimation of a strike in the event of the company's refusal to grant an increase.

A general strike of the switchmen, firemen and trainmen on all the roads centering at Pittsburg is threatened. A demand has been made for a reduction in hours from twelve to eight hours a day and an advance in wages of 15 per cent.

The recent shut down in the Pennsylvania coke regions has been especially hard on single men, they being laid off in preference to married men. At a meeting of the single men on Thursday it was unanimously resolved to marry before the avescale is presented, Jan. 1. Several engagement have already been announced.

The coai miners' strike in Alabama has assumed a serious turn and one that threatens to close every industry in the Birmingham district. The members of the Aunalgamated Association of Iron and Steel Workers passed resolutions of sympathy and pledged support to the strikers. They agree to refuse to work with coal mined by convict or scab miners if the strikers ask them to do so. Pat McBride, of the Executive Board of United Mine Workers of America, who has arrived from Detroit to look into the strike, says if he cannot settle it he will call out the iron and steel workers. This means the closing down of all the rolling mills, foundries and machine shops and 3,000 more men will join the ranks of the strikers. The strike has already seriously injured business and there seems no prospect of a settlemen.



Notes of Interest to Public School Officers.

cessful Candidates for First-Class Professional Teachers' Honors.

The closing school day is Monday, the 22nd December, in cities towns and incorporated villages, and on Tuesday, the 23rd, in gural schools.

The annual school meeting in rural and separate schools is held on the last Wednesday in December, which this year falls on the last day of the year. Notices announcing the meeting should be posted on or before the 23rd so as to leave six clear days exclusive of Sunday.

the meeting should be posted on or before the 23rd so as to leave six clear days exclusive of Sunday.

The high school entrance examination will begin at 9 o'clock on Monday, the 22nd day of December, and continue until 3 o'clock in the afternoon of Wednesday. On Monday the subjects of grammar, geography and history will be taken; on Tuesday arithmetic, drawing, composition and spelling; on Wednesday literature, writing and temperance and hygiene or agriculture.

Trustees and teachers if settling the salary for a portion of the year will find it to their convenience to remember that in rural schools there are 219, and in urban schools 211 teaching days in the year 1890. The law now provides that for a broken term the amount payable to a teacher is obtained by multiplying his annual salary by the number of days he has taught and dividing the product by the number of teaching days in the year.

No material change has been made in the school law since 1887—an unusually long rest for this department of legislation. The Hon, Mr. Ross, Minister of Education, has promised to revise the school law next effective.
