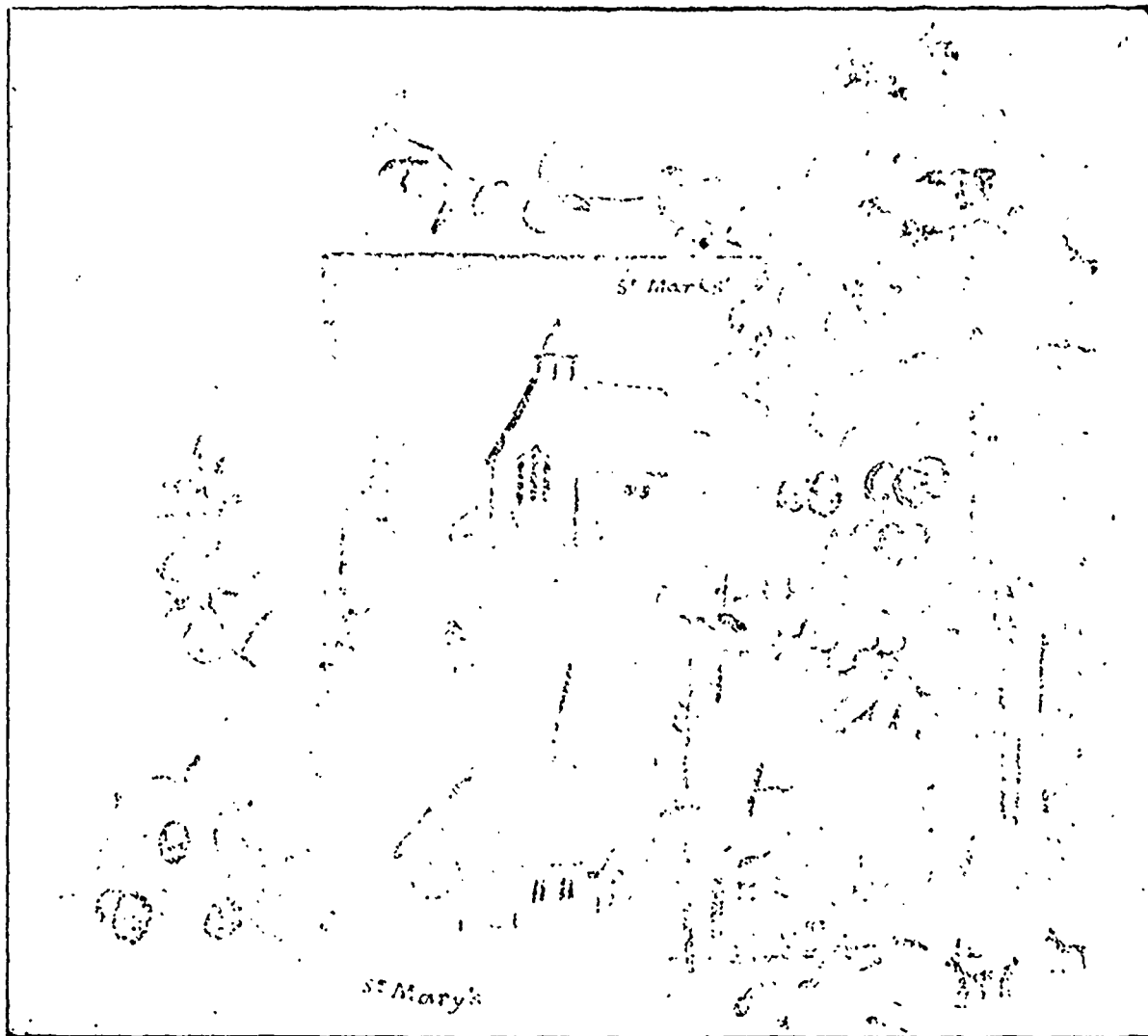

CHURCH SERVICES:

St. Mark's Church, Vesuvius—Morning service 11 a.m., and Holy Communion the first Sunday in each month. Afternoon service 3.30 p.m. on all other Sundays, except when a fifth Sunday in the month occurs. Evening service 7.30 p.m.

North End School—Service 11 a.m. the third Sunday in each month.

The "Divide" School—Service 3 p.m. the first Sunday in each month. 2

Staver Point School—Service 11 a.m. the fifth Sunday in the month, whenever there are five Sundays.

St. Mary's Church, Fulford—Morning service 10.30 a.m. second and fourth Sundays in each month. Holy Communion on the fourth Sunday of every second month. During the summer months an additional evening service the first Sunday of the month 7.30 p.m.

Mr. Leonard Tolson arrived home from Denver, Colorado, on the 16th ult., and reports his brother to be somewhat improved in health.

Mr. Kinzo's pile camps have been actively at work all winter. A ship load of piles was despatched to China on the 23rd ult.

The raging wind on the night of February 1st reminded many of us painfully of the sad drowning accident just a year ago, when Messrs. Harold Scott and G. F. Smedley lost their lives. Two marble crosses mark their graves in the Cemetery, and a memorial church window is expected to arrive shortly.

Lenten self-denial envelopes have been distributed, and it is hoped there will be a liberal contribution to the Diocesan Mission Fund. It is satisfactory to know that the Fund is now out of debt. Last year the sum of \$1,562 was raised, as compared with \$1,228 the previous year. This is encouraging, especially to those who are really making an effort to help forward the work of the church.

Wilson, \$1; J. Nightingale, \$2. Total, \$17. Of this amount \$11.80 was expended on insurance and church expenses (St. Mary's) and the balance placed to stipend account.

Major Craig has purchased the Mahon property on Ganges Harbour, and will probably build this summer.
