

## **BOYS' HOME.**

---

### **THIRTY-SIXTH ANNUAL MEETING.**

---

The thirty-sixth annual meeting of the Boys' Home was held in the Home, George Street, February 14th, 1896.

Among those present were :—His Honor Lieut-Governor Kirkpatrick and Mrs. Kirkpatrick, Col. Sir Casimir S. Gzowski, Rev. W. G. Wallace, Rev. H. H. Parsons, Rev. Arthur Baldwin, Principal Macmurchy, Mr. James Massie, Mr. Michie, Dr. Thorburn, Mr. David Fotheringham, Mr. R. S. Baird, Mr. Warring Kennedy, Mr. J. K. Macdonald, Mr. J. J. Kelso.

His Honor the Lieut-Governor presided, and Rev. H. H. Parsons opened the meeting with prayer.

Letters for unavoidable absence were read from His Worship, Mayor Fleming, Hon. G. W. Allan, Rev. Dr. Potts; Rev. James Allen, O. A. Howland, M.L.A., Mr. J. L. Hughes, Inspector Chapman, Hon. G. W. Ross, and others.

The Managers of the Boys' Home have much pleasure in presenting to the public a report of their work during the past year, and desire again to thank the many friends of the Institution for their kind interest and generous support.

In submitting this, the thirty-sixth Annual Report, which contains full and complete financial statements, the Managers desire to express their heartfelt gratitude to the merciful God and Father for His continued goodness and

protecting care of the Home, and His gracious guidance of the work during the year.

The past year has been no exception to previous years in the success which has attended the efforts put forth by the Managers for the comfort and welfare of the boys whom they have undertaken to care for, and they have been enabled to afford relief to many little waifs, who would otherwise have suffered from the ills of poverty and neglect, innocent victims, too often, of the faults and misfortunes of others. As in other years the applications for admittance have been varied in character, touching and sad. The parents or friends who place the boys in the Home undertake to pay from one dollar per month to four, according to their circumstances, for their maintenance, a promise which some fulfil, while others, by neglecting payment, lose control of the boys, who, when old enough, are placed with farmers.

The total number of boys in the Home, December 31<sup>st</sup>, 1894, was 107, and 58 were admitted during the year, making in all 165. Of this number nine were sent to farmers and situations, 46 were removed by parents and friends, one was sent to the Hospital for Sick Children, one died, and 108 remain in the Institution, December 31<sup>st</sup>, 1895.

At the present time 51 boys of various ages are serving their time with farmers. During the past year six have completed their term of apprenticeship, either receiving the amount of their earnings in full, to deposit it in the nearest Post Office or other Savings Bank, or allowing it to remain in the Treasurer's care, bearing the "special rate of interest."

The sum of \$741.42 has been paid to the boys during the year, one boy receiving \$177, another \$161. The sum of \$622.43 has been received from farmers for the boys during the year, making \$2,151.14 now at the credit of

the "Boys' Apprentice Fund." Boys frequently remain with farmers after their term expires, or "hire" with some neighbor farmer.

Of late the number of boys sent to farmers has been less than in former years, not from want of applications, but because the Managers are unable to supply the demand, the majority of the boys being under the required age.

The Managers regret to report the death of one little boy, Charlie C. His mother died shortly before he was placed in the Home, and he seemed to have been delicate for some time. The general health of the boys has been good throughout the year, with the exception of the usual ailments inseparable from so large a number of children in one home, including a mild attack of measles, when sixteen boys were attacked. One little fellow, Willie Jeffery, a nice little boy whose mother has apparently deserted him and a younger child in the Infants' Home as well, has seemed unable to rally, although tenderly cared for by Drs. Thorburn and Elliott. The weakness of the heart caused Dr. Elliott so much anxiety that he had him removed to the Hospital for Sick Children, where he is still lying. A touching incident is related of this little boy. He and another deserted boy, Orel O'Huran, several years older, had formed a strong attachment for each other. Orel was chosen by a farmer, and when he went to say good-bye to his little friend, "the two cried like to break their hearts." Next night Willie was taken ill with haemorrhage and weakness, which nearly proved fatal. Orel is very happy in his country home, but he never forgets his little friend.

The Managers beg to refer to the medical officer's report for full particulars of the health of the boys, and in this connection would again express their deep gratitude to that faithful friend, Dr. Thorburn, for his continued interest in the health of the boys through so many years, and also to Dr. J. E. Elliott for his careful attention to all the calls necessary in a Home with over one hundred boys.

Grateful acknowledgement is made of the thoughtful kindness of the Board of Management of the Hospital for Sick Children, in offering to receive any delicate boys who would be the better for treatment in that admirable Institution, either in the city or in the Lakeside Home on the Island.

Several changes have taken place in the Board of Management during the past year, and the Managers desire to record their sense of the sad loss sustained by the death of a very old and esteemed member, Mrs. James Lesslie, a member tried and true, for thirty years, since 1864. Owing to the frailties and infirmities of advancing years she was unable to attend the meetings in later years, yet she continued to feel a deep interest in the welfare of the "Boys' Home," and the handsome legacy of \$1,000, bequeathed by her will, remains a lasting memorial of her interest in the Institution. Miss Davidson, an esteemed member, has also gone to her rest. The Management regret the retirement of Miss Annie Beatty, and Miss Hutchison, owing to removal from the city. Both were valuable members, and their places will not be easily filled. The Managers also mention with regret the death of a very true friend of the Institution, Mr. Robert Gilmor, who passed away near the close of the year. He audited the Treasurer's Statements for many years. He, too, bequeathed \$1,000, as a memorial of his interest in the Boys' Home. One by one the early landmarks are being removed.

The boys continue to make satisfactory progress in the school, under the very efficient teachers supplied by the

Public School Board, Miss Hodgert and Miss Kerr. The teachers have labored under difficulties in the past, owing to the necessity of having all the classes in one room. Mr. J. L. Hughes, whose continued interest in the education of the boys in the Institution is highly appreciated by the Managers, consulted with Mr. W. J. Hambly, the esteemed chairman of the School Board, and other members, during the year, regarding this inconvenience, and finally made arrangements to remove the classes to the unoccupied rooms in the Dunlop Infirmary Building, kindly consenting to pay an annual rental of \$220 for the same. The old school room fills a long-felt want, as a reading and recreation room.

The continued depression in financial circles, and the consequent scarcity of work, still cause such distress among the poorer classes, that little ones under the required age have still to be admitted. In consequence the Home has been filled to its utmost capacity throughout the year, thereby increasing the cost of maintenance, while the returns from the collectors (caused also by the hard times), have been decreased. At the same time the want of a nursery and more room has become a necessity, and the Managers have been compelled to give the erection of a new wing, or addition, thoughtful consideration.

The Sunday school, still under the guidance of its esteemed Superintendent, Mr. Robert Gilgour, ably assisted by Mr. S. B. Brush, Musical Director, and the devoted staff of teachers, continues to occupy a very interesting and valued part of the work of the Institution. The Managers feel that they owe a deep debt of gratitude to those who assume so much of the religious training of the boys. They are serving Him whom they love, in fulfilling the divine command, and their reward is with Him.

The Managers have pleasure also in bearing testimony to the worth of the Matron, Miss McKay, and her valued as-

sistants, for it is felt that the continued prosperity of the Boys' Home depends greatly upon their interest in the Institution, and their affection for the boys under their care. The wheels of every department run so smoothly and quietly that we can scarcely realize the responsibility resting upon us as managers, nor fully appreciate the excellence of those who have charge of the everyday life of the Home.

The Christmas dinner and Christmas tree were both very successful. It was a real pleasure to see the boys enjoy their dinner, not one of the 108 absent. This pleasure was increased by the presence of a number of "old boys," who had been allowed by the farmers to spend their holiday season in their early home. The boys are all welcome.

As in former years, the "Home" correspondence continues to be of interest, the letters this year being more numerous than the past. J. C. writes :—

DEAR Miss W.,—I got your letter last week. I was down at the Home at Christmas ; it has improved a lot since I was there ; all the boys are different, too. My time was up this winter, as I was eighteen, but Miss Scott says it is not up till next December. I like the place, so I stay on. When I was in Toronto there was no snow, and when I got off the train and was going home, we very near upset, the snow was so deep. It has been storming about every day since. Potatoes are about ten to twelve cents a bag. Crops were poor out this way last year, and a lot of the farmers are making as little food do the cattle as possible. We have plenty to do our cattle. We built a pig-pen this summer ; it is nice and warm ; people come to see it, and they say it is the best they have ever seen. The boss has a pair of "dehorns, clippers," and he goes around dehorning cattle. It is a good thing for the cattle, they are ever so much quieter. We have about thirty-five cattle, thirty-eight sheep, twenty-seven pigs. We had about fifty-seven in summer, and six horses. They were going to have the Christmas-

tree on Friday, and I left on Thursday. I would have liked to have seen it, but my ticket was out on Thursday, but I enjoyed myself while I was there. I was at Cooke's Church the last of the year with one of the old boys that was in the Home when I was there. I enjoyed myself very much. It was about half-past twelve when it went out. I like the city very much. What is Miss Scott's address?

Another writes :—

DEAR FRIEND,—I was pleased with the book you sent me ; it was very nice ; there were some nice pieces in it. I thank you for it. I had some great fun on Christmas Day. I had a good dinner and supper. We had a goose, a turkey and plum pudding. There were twenty-five people at our place on Christmas Day. Palmerston is four and a-half miles from where I live, the fourth line of Minto. I have a long way to go to school, two and a quarter miles. I like to go to school ; I go to Sunday school ; I stay home sometimes ; my teacher's name is Miss Cooper ; we have Sunday school and meeting, and class-meeting at the close of the preaching service ; I have to work at the barn, clean the stable and water the cattle ; we have eleven cattle, four pigs and thirty-seven hens ; I can plow and harrow ; sometimes I am away on a holiday ; there is plenty of work to do on a farm ; will you tell me where my mother lives, and write to me ? I think I will close.

The Managers would also make grateful mention of pleasant trips given to the boys by captains of local steamers to Island Park, Hanlan's Point, Victoria Park ; also to Sabbath school picnics given by Cooke's Church, All Saints and South Side Presbyterian ; also to Mr. Hill, Manager of the Industrial Exhibition, for free entrance ; and to President McKenzie of the Toronto Railway Company for free conveyance in special cars, to and from the Exhibition, all of which the boys very much enjoyed.

The Managers also offer thanks to the many kind friends for provisions and other supplies sent in during the year, and particularly for the bountiful donations at Christmas, including a fine Christmas cake from Ramsden & Lloyd.

In closing, the Managers again acknowledge their grateful thanks to the old and tried friends of the Institution who have from year to year continued to subscribe. Collecting is not a pleasant task, and the continued hard times has not made lighter this important part of the work. To those who have never undertaken the task, words can scarcely convey an idea of the value of a kind reception, with an expression of sympathy and interest in the work, nor how much it lightens the labor of love. One collector was asked if she would accept ten cents. She replied, "Certainly, for that sum will buy at least two loaves of bread." We again commend the work and the workers to a generous public, and to the tender Shepherd who said to His followers, "Feed My lambs."

#### MEDICAL OFFICERS' REPORT.

In presenting the Thirty-sixth Annual Report of the health of the Home, it gives us the utmost pleasure to state that we have had an exceptionally satisfactory year.

We have no deaths to report, and only two or three cases of a serious nature occurred during the year.

Sixteen boys were attacked during the spring with measles, within a few days of each other. They were promptly isolated and kept in the Infirmary for several weeks. No other cases have occurred since.

One boy fractured his leg by a fall from the swing. He made a perfect recovery. A severe case of haemorrhage of the lungs occurred in a delicate boy during the summer. He was at once removed to the Hospital for Sick Children. He is still quite ill there, and it is impossible at the present time to say what will be the ultimate result of the case.

A few weeks ago four boys were attacked with ring-worm of the scalp. They were recognized early and put in a room by themselves, in the attic, and are now practically cured.

The Home is now without a hospital ward or infirmary and the question as to the disposal of the sick in future will require the earnest attention of the Board during the coming year.

## OBJECT OF THE BOYS' HOME.

---

### *Duties of the Board of Management and Officers.*

The Institution is open to the boys of the ages mentioned in second Rule of the Regulations, the claims of admission being the utter friendlessness of the applicant, or being a child of drunken or dissolute parents ; the object of this Institution being the prevention of juvenile crime, by training these poor outcasts in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.

The management is vested in a Committee of Ladies, chosen from the subscribers at the Annual General Meeting in February of each year ; the said Committee to consist of thirty-three members, from among whom eight shall be chosen as Directresses ; and among them there shall be a first and second Directress, Treasurer, and Secretary.

The first Directress, or in her absence one other Directress, shall preside at the monthly meeting, audit and sign the accounts presented for that purpose by the Treasurer, propose and declare the resolutions, and sign the minutes of the preceding meeting.

The Treasurer shall receive and keep an account of all moneys belonging to the Institution and also the earnings of all the boys, a separate account of which must be kept with each. All the accounts must be presented each month, at the meeting of the Managers, for the signature of the first Directress, or in her absence, the lady presiding.

The Secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the Society ; keep a list of the names, ages, and peculiar circumstances, as far as practicable, of all the boys, in a book provided for that purpose ; attend at each monthly meeting, take the names of those present, and minute the proceedings in a book, which must be read at each ensuing meeting, and be signed by the presiding lady.

Two members of the Committee in rotation shall visit the "Home" daily, each week ; inspect the house ; ascertain from the Matron the conduct of the boys, and enter a report at the weekly meeting on the Monday.

The weekly or Finance Committee shall consist of the Directress, Secretary, Treasurer, and two of the Committee, who shall have been appointed to purchase or otherwise obtain the necessary clothing for the boys. Five shall form a quorum, and their order shall be sufficient authority to the Treasurer to advance the money requisite for the above purpose, or supply such things as may be considered necessary for the "Home."

The General Committee shall meet on the second Monday of the month, at 11 o'clock a.m. Each meeting shall be opened with prayer. The minutes of the preceding meeting having been read and signed, the vouchers of the Treasurer produced and signed, the Secretary shall inform the meeting of any correspondence that has taken place during the last month, and the first Directress shall put before the meeting such resolutions as may be put into her hands, take the votes, and declare the decision. Seven shall form a quorum, and when a tie arises, the presiding lady shall give the casting vote. All admissions that have taken place during the past month shall either be ratified or disallowed, at the direction of the meeting.

As soon as the meeting is opened, all conversation not addressed to the presiding lady, shall be pronounced by her to be out of order, and stopped.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BOYS' HOME.

---

I. The Matron shall be competent to take charge of all the boys ; to conduct the household affairs generally ; to admit applicants with the doctor's certificate, subject to the approval of the Weekly Committee ; and she shall daily see to the personal cleanliness of each boy, and every morning and evening conduct family prayer.

II. Boys from the ages of five to twelve are admitted as inmates, and none shall be placed in a permanent situation until he has been one year in the Institution. This rule may be suspended under peculiar circumstances, at the discretion of the Managers.

III. The boys shall rise at 6 a.m. from 30th April to 30th September, and at 7 a.m. from 1st October to 1st May ; the time for going to rest being from 6 to 8 p.m. Their meals to be at regular hours—Breakfast at 8 a.m., dinner at 12, and tea at 5.30 p.m. Grace to be said before and after meals by one of the elder boys ; and all hours not occupied by such meals, or by instruction, to be employed, under the supervision of the Matron, in bodily exercise, house cleaning, or in play.

IV. All the boys shall regularly attend Sunday School and Divine service in a Protestant church, every Sunday, in charge of the Matron ; and in the afternoon receive such religious instruction as can be given by the Matron, or any visiting friend of the Institution.

V. The charge for each boy, of parents or friends who are able to pay, shall be \$4 per month, unless an exceptional case shall occur. If more than one boy of the same parents or friends gains admittance, a reduction shall be made, as approved of by the ladies of the Weekly Committee.

VI. Prompt and implicit obedience must be given to the orders of the Matron.
