    －W．M．Allister，bookseller and sta－ tioner，London，Ont．，started in the news

    A letter stamping machise is in use in eighty postofices of the United States， and promises to the more widely intro－ duced．The late postmaster－general states that the employment of one hundred ma－ chines at $a$ rental of $\$ 40,000$ ，would aliond a reduction of the estimate for elerk hire of $\$ 100,000$ ．Aetual tests show the speed of this mechanism to be 30,000 per hour，wherens the maximum capacity of stamping by hand is only 3,000 per hour，or only one－tenth of what the ma－
    chine can do．The machine，besides all this，does far neater and better work in every respect than can be done by hasd．

    In a summary on crop conditions and the movement of wheat，the Now York Bulletin remarks that its correspondence includes various reports，notnbly from llli－ nois and Kansus，of serious damago to the wheat crop，but much the larger propor－ tion of advices miantain previous expecta－ tions，or indicate an uncertainty as to in． jury，and if any damage auggest that the extent of it is not yet ascertainable．As a whole the gencral average condition of winter wheat nppears to not have been lowerel so much by the recent hard freez－ ings，as has been apprehended．

The principal ervditors aro the Merchants Bank, $\$ 60,000$, and Cissils \& Co., $\$ 15,000$. From two to three hundred hands are thrown unt of employment. Mi. Smardon began in the wholesale boot and shoe business in Montreal in 1872, under the stylo of R. Smardon \& Co., but dissolved at the close of that year: The concern reappeared as Smardon \& Young, and continued matil 1877, when the latter retired. In Marth, 1878 , Mi, Simbrdon tailed, owing Hhont $\$ 100,000$, but recoverel the estate on the hasis of 40 e in the dollar. This was aceomplished through the assistance of his brother, who bought in the assets. He was again ohiged to suspend in Norember, 1.886, Ncgotiations were shortly atterwards entered into with the corporation of Thee Rivers to remove the busimess to that eity, and an agreement was entered into by which the cily consented to give the firm a homes of $\$ 85,000$, spread over some years. Mr. Smmidon atcordingIy removel his business to three Rivers nbout six yents ago, taking with him a mumber of his skilled employecs from this city, many of whom subsequently icft him and retumed to Montrent. For some time the enomons ixplense eltached to the remoral of the phant, machinery, ete., and the construction of the factory, futerfered considerably with his profits. Mit. Smadon has scarcely had time to recoycr from his fomer troubles, wader the ex-

    the department in that direction havo herctofore not been altogether crowned With success. This is more particularly the case with the article of coffee, the recturns from the examinations of which, especially in the West, are ailwost lamentable reading. Out of a total of 256 samples obtained by the analyst, only 123, or less than onc-half were genuine; 113 were adulterated, and :0 doubtiful.

    We notice some improvoment in the arrangement of the talbes; the retailer, who in former years was obliged to bear the brunt of the charge is retained, but the cofiee manufacturer is added. To take, for instauce, the returns made by chicf-analyst Macfarlane, the samples oi 11-2 lbs. each obtained in Halifax from-14-vendors-were all adulterated, chicfly with grain and chicory, One of the samples obtained from a manufacturing house in this city, whose name by the way does not appear in the last edition of the city directory, was adullerated with "a very large amount of ronsted grain and chicory." Another mannuracturing house on the coiner of St. Paul Strect, in this city were the suppliers of another Halifix house (on (iramville Street) who furnished a stimple said to be adulterated with grain and chicory; singular to reate the stme manuracturing firm supplied il sample to a Dorchester, N. B. retailer Which is returned as "unadulterated." A St. Toln, N. B. firm supplies another Dorehester, N. B. retailer whose sample is returned as "unaduiterated, being sold us a mixture, but contains but very little coffee!" The samples furnished in the Province of Qucbec are returned as ireer from adulteration with the exeeption perhaps of Hull, where large proportions of chicory, pea-meal, corn-stareli and husks are used to adulterate the article. The same may be suid oi the colfee supplied by a Toronto firm with a name belying the quality
    of the goods, which are returned as composed of 10 per cont. chicory and 10 per cent, roasted grail, the rest being colice.

    Samples obtained from retailers in Montreal are even worse than the above. Onc supplied by a Craig Street manur [acturer to a St. Lawrence Street retailer contained 20 per cent. roasted peas and about 30 per cent. of beans and maize, or Indian corn. An Ontario St. retailer could not say where he obtained the sample furnished to the analyst, but it contained about 20 per cent. of chicory and about 35 per cent. of roasted peas, wheat, and maize, probably his own manufacture, and if so he bids fail to qualify himself as a competing manufacturer in the course of time. $A$ prominent house of trans-lineal origin appears to aduiterate the coffee supplied to a St. Lawrence retailer with about 30 per cent. of chicory. A sample supplied a Coaticooke retailer by the rloresaid house of purity in Soronto contained 50 per ecnt. of chicory, penmeal and Indian coin! Of the samples procured from retuilers in Toronto only one appears to be genuine. In Hamiltou there is a similar proportion. St. Catharines also furuishes one genuine simple; and turn which way we will we find the stme statement with regard to the cofice sold throughout the length and breadth of the Dominion.

    The manufacturers of what is called sophisticated coffee do not by any means confine themselves to the use of chicory and roasted grain; they employ large quantities of a substance manufactured in New York and Pliladelphia, costing about 3 to Ec a pound, imported under the name of "Essence of colife." This is composed of burnt sugar and is probably, according to Mr. Macfarlane, made from some of the glucose compounds, as it possesses no organic㫙的tance and is liable to be over looked in analysis, It contains
    about 75 per eent. of matter (soluble in water) which has great coloring power, and a little of it is capable of imparting a strong coffee shade to water. Mr. Macfarlane recommends that the mannfacture or sale of the artiele be prolibited.
    The following story of a German satirist will scarcely be deemed exaggerated in view of the increased adulteration in the manufacture of coffeo among us. We will not vouch for the "unadulterated" eharacter of the story, Which we find recited by Mr. Arnold White in his "Problems of a Great City."-"There were four flies and as it hilppened they were hungry one morning. The first settied upon a sausage of singularly appetizing appearance, and made a hearty meal, but he speedily died of intestinal inflummation, for the silusage was adulterated with aniline. The second fly breakfasted upon flour, and forwith sucemmbed to contraction of the stomach, owing to the inordinate quantity oi alum with which the flour had been adulterated. 'lhe third fly was slaking his thinst with the contents of the mills-jug, when violent canmps suddenly convulsed his form and He soon gave up the ghost, the vietim to chank adulteration. Sceing this the fourth fly, muttering to himself, "the sooner it is over, the sooner to sleep," nilighted upon a moistened sheet of paper exhibiting the counterfeit prosentment of a death's-head and the inseription "Fly-poison," and firmly applying the tip of his proboscis to this hevice, the fourth fly drank to his heart's content, growing more vigorous and cheerful at cevery mouthful, althongln expectant of his end. But he did not die. On the contrary, he throve and wruxed fat. You see even the fly poison was adulterated,"

    We may be deomed hypercritical in suggesting that a report on the "Adulteration of Food" is scarcely the place to include any analysis of fertilizers and
    white lead. We believe that the term "Adulteration" would be all sufficient for express the iden, and it would be mote correct. The language of the report should bo itself free of adulteration.

    ## THE SAVINGS DANK SYSTHAM IN FRANCE.

    There is no faculty which our French population in Canada inherit from their iorefathers more noticeable than that for money saving. In old Prance to, lay it is more pronouncel than ever, and no where else in the world is so much money sivecl. The efiect of this popensity has served an excellent purpose with the republic and advanced the price of their Three per cent. Rentes deven points beyond those of Germany is. reason oi the enormons investmenta it the former on the part of the Freneds savinge' banks anmally at twenty-five Hancs to the pound sterling, we may rstimate the present investment int about d billion france. For many years the high dale: of interest allowed has altracted deposits which have hitherto raccuded the withurawals. Since the Fhnima scandats faith in the government has been withdeawn by a large pertion of the people and since the first of the year the withdrawals have exrarded the deposites by $132,000,000$ itanes. This has started the government and methemted their hopes oi reseeming their lyou' and a half per eents. in Algust next. They are plated in hats unfurtunate position that the hank oi France ean only come to their help hy itself unloading these three per ecnt. 'rentes or stock, or applying for power in in rease its note issuc, both calcurated to shake the eredit of the Republie The slooding of we mathets by both the Savings Banks and the biank of Frane hutsb cense a serene deefine in the Freneln stock, and incronse the clamour for withdrawal of deposits by the limid portion of the population.
    A financial centre compelled to disatis theste vimburassing probtems is ath Hablvorably one for our provincial trasmer to negoliate in for the renewal (of his loan in July mext, and we may "xpeet to see him arrange for his needs bently or in the London manket.

    ## BOLLEA-PHOOF CLOTHING.

    It is not to ke womlered at that the :- water-prooi cloths and clothing, now $\therefore$ fimitiar to most of our readers, sloould Gad to some further inventions in that $\because$ direction. A tailor oi Mamheim, GerZuray, has just invented a bulfet-prooi
    s:chothit weighing about bix pounds per
    suit more than ordinary: cloth-an inwntion that feemg :- to have aroused much discussion and comment through. out Eurone, especially:as respects its - Mrubible application to military afiairs. The invention appears to be claimed by two parties, the Mannheim tailor and one Sarneo, an Austrian enginecr who had offered it to his own war office where it was merely examined,-Austrian fashion-snified at, and inally megiected. It seems that the patent does not operate against the Govern ment which grints it, but the method is really of no particular value except (o) We Governments of the comntry that mity be concerned.
    The grirment, it is reported, is a light shirt of mail made oi wire rings anslemed upou an inner skilu composed of hemp driven into at thick compact subsithec by excessive pressurc. The shirt, whing to its chasticity, is impenetrable to the follet oi any ordinary riflo now usinl; the bullet falliug from it fattened or in pieces, and dis eren att a distance ai mumded yards. The blow inflieted li. the weinht of the bullet is, of course, tremendous, so severe dhat it is doubtrul if the front of the leg can be protected from frature any more that it cond be from the kiek of a horse, but over the body the hemp does not breik the shin, and the suldier so hit, hougin he might be knocked senseless for the mom'int, would survire ats an unwounded man She lamp, in fact, gives way to the impact of the buthet without tearing jixt atio a bag of salud does and, so to speale, lets the fore of the blow through without letting the bullet itsel?.
    'lue extent of protection, as it is said, must not be exaggerated, for the blow endured would be twrible, and the covering must be incomplete, as the race ramains exposed still. The shirt or euirass would immensely reduce the inmortality from the rifle, permins-if surieientiy thick bodies of the materiad round be worn on the legs, would lessen it to the extent of seventerive per cent. bullets fired irom any distance hit the heal romparatively seldom, and the bryonet, which would be furued like the bullet, is pratetically never amed at the face. There ean be but little doubt What the new invention must have a surous effect upon the war operations of the near future. The principal difficulty in the way appaus to be the additional weight in pounds, and to this may belded the probubility that it would be injurious to heath, as it anything else which eloses the pores of the shin too much, $\because \quad \because \quad$
    It must be borue in mind, howover,
    that the use of artillery will always destrict the value of any armour, hempen or otherwise, for a dynamite shell will shater anything, but as a London critic puts it, "a struggle beiween a quarter of a million Germans and a quarter of a million Russians who could not kill each other from a distance might be a seent to make war correspondents and historians sick-a scene which it would take a new Dante to pieture faithrully."
    It is however, probable that the readiness of the nations to go to war will be increased. The grant check on war now is that all are in such thorough training, so weil prepared, that the national risks are tremendous, and the great dificulty is to find some one man rompetent to shine in leading.

    Whatever other efiect the invention may have it will enormonsly inerease the power of civilized soldiers against sarages; but there are not many savages left to conques: and the few uncivilized races-in ehina, Madagascar, und centalal africa-are hose which Win leap at the new invention, and perhaps dexive from it that degree of iortitude tho wamb oi which has heretofore prevented their reaping the iun adrantage of their numbers.
    As the discovery of the material apmears to be past doubt, we may be fancioned for deroiing thus much space 10 it, and as probiblys something new muke the sun.

    ## FARMING ON A NEW BASIS.

    To the finglish pesithents of this proFined the slow growth of the Eustern Townships hits lung bea a matter or Mgrei and reproach. Many cuuses have been assigued, thied amongst which hitr: heren the withdrawal oi population aud lack of at skilled farming community, !-iunters or eivilization, whether in the bairie Provinces or in districts nearer at hand, from the laborious life they are called upon to endure, become broken down specimens of humanity before the soil can be made to produce that return of wealth to secure which their health ..and strength have been expended. A later generation unschooled, untaught romes forward to talke the plough, and, with ambitions dampened by years: of laturen surroundinge, and with taster -roughened by deprivation, it lapses into contentment will a dwarged production from the soil, so be it that it "yields enongh for the ordinary whats of the farm and the houselold.. If faimwiscom the purt of an educatad clase could be suaranted success from the

    Giant, it woula at once create within
    the borders of the province botil popuAtoin and weath so much in the iuture depends upon the development of the Townhips, in so far as the prestige int general success of the province be concerned, that we are inclined to the treiter that many sections might tio truated as virpin and prairie sections and receive that goverumental aid which all new settlements have hitherto clained as of right, It is the practice to grant snecial exemptions to pioneer sethers from the attacks of ereditors. This is demoralizing to the community, and a regrettelble advantage. It would be preerrable to forego these premiums ipon hardihood, and a spirit of adventure, and substitute an actuall reward for toil. Would it be deemed chimerical or unworthy oi consideration were wo to adrocate the establishment of a govermment grain mart where prices should be fixcd two years in advauce, anelangeable during that time, and inever below a reasomable prorit on the highest average cost or production from the soil? so that the farmer might count upon a reward for his efforts and have no one but nature and her storms or frosis to reckon with? Now a fizg hurvest may be robbed by the speculator in prices of all its meaning, and tave the firmer ouly his frowns for his pains. Dut give him a market that ho can count on when his grain is thrested, and he will be ever ready to plough and sow and reap. Intimately conneeted, too, with his progress is the elearance of his land. Two orten he cefects this to his own or his neighbors' hamage. In his endeavours he fires tho Liviber on the ground, sometimes consumes his homestead and his. barus, sometimes his neighbors, and keeps the country for hundreds of miles wrapped Iil: an atmosphere of smoke. a very. naturn object tempted him to buru the Limber as it stood, namely the producLiou oi pot and pearl ashes. Here isgin government intergerence would be to his and the general good, by remoyr. ing any temptation to adopt this primitive method of land elearing. Just now the farmer reckons after this manner, is the price of aslies remunerative? if - yes, he cpuverts the wood ashes ,into the ashes of commerce; if, - However,: the "rate bo $\cdots$ discourr ariug they are hairowed in for the -timprovement of the soil. For all that -the devastation of the forests continues and our supples or timber decrease. Set the thinier eut and seil guch pore
    tion of his timber as he chooses to remove for clearings; and let the governulent pary him for every cut stump delivered: at some recelving point. . He will no longer be an unintentional de.stroyer oi his neighbors' property, no longer. treat his farm as a huge incinerator or endanger railway travel a hundred miles away.

    Somo economists might argue that root crops are deserving of equal consideration with grains. We think not for the reason that greater areas may be covered with the latter and at better prices, and grains are factors in larger markets.

    The whole subject appears worthy of consideration by those having the agricultural interests of the Province at heart, and able to advance those inter.隹to in any degree.

    ## CUSTOMS APPRAISEMENIS.

    It makes littlo difference apparently whether custons dutics are collected under a high protective tariff, or under one designed for purposes of necesenry revenue only-the difficulties which besst the importer and collector "appeir to be the wame.
    Inexperience of aubordimato officials, misinterpretation of the bure Customs Act, haste to impute wrone motives, these, with occasional carelessuess on the part of merchants and faulty inroices, help to make up the disputes between trado and the department.

    We lave written very warmly on soveral occusionis on the subject of a right enforcoment of the customs laws, and havo ateered in impartial courso after viowing the difficulties which surrounded the position of the government. At a time when subordinates connected will the customs service avero itching to find opportunity to set in motion the penal clauses of the uct; wo sustained the position both of the honest importer and of the government. We offered no excuso for thoso individunts whose frauds were eating into the country's revenues, and wo ovoked from the Hon. Mr. Bowell the statement that the "Journal of Commerce" was the only paper whose edito: had properly grasped the situation. We hope we grasp it in tho same way now when we say that to administer the law justly requires that tho base of its interprotation be uniform at overy port of entry-likewise the rule as to classificalion of goods and application of tests. Aha here wo may remark in passing lhat no tests are reliable when made by hydrometers which the weigher and gauger is forced to admit have been out of onder for two yeara.

    The meeting lanstily converiod the - Board of Trado room on Monday last to tiseuiss with the Comptroller of Customs the subject of uiform apprasement, ivill no doubt be productive of beneficial resuits. The honourable gentlenän was good enough io assure the meeting that the viors*enumcinted by Montreal's business men would serve to guide his Department in its onaleavours to bring about a more complete and efficient system of appraisement; and tho weight of these opinions was further emphasized by his request for an elaborated statement on the subject. This would scem to indicate that tho Comptroller is disposed to advise the Minister of Customs of the pressing needs of the case, and the wisdom of heeding the united voice of the trading communities between Halifax and Vancouver calling for a remedy.
    Neither the Board of Trade nor tho Comptroller appear to huve dealt:with the fluestion of infractions of the Customs Act. On this point Montreal would have to hung her head, but infractions must bo ,taking place elsewhere, when, as Mr. :Iemy loman asserts, there are firms hevo who import through western houses. bocause they can enter their goods mora chenply through them, than through this port. Such a state of affirs must result from official ignompec, furoritism, or fraud. The true catuse should bo discoverull und the reruedy applied.
    If, in regard to the testing of liquors, the statement be correct that tho percentage of a lcolsol, which determines tho duty, varies in the separate pareels of a cargo of the same liquors from the same manufacturess, then Mr. Hebert's proposal is a arood one which seeks to striko an aver: age of the alcohol present by sampling from the different puckages of the soveral consigmments aud apply that averago to the whole slipment.
    Wo aro at a loss to comprehend how in tho matter of the heavy hardware supplies there can bo appraisers of whom it can bo said that they do not know the difference between iron and steel. When it comes down to that it is simply a matter of internal management, und a change of some one to the right about.
    Thero cannot be much difficulty, one would think, in deciding between a proprietary medicine and a drug, or upon tha point whether a farrier's knifo be a tool, or a pieco" of cutlery. All edged jnatruments in, gencoral are cutlery; but such: of them as do not find a place on the dining table, are commonly classed.: as tools, and as such thoy may rightly bo treated by the appraiser, even though it calls for a ton per cent. additional duty over cutlery, Yet here uniformity of appraigement phould prevall and other porta
    of entry should exact the same figure. It was sitated that while 35 per cent. was paid at Montreal, outside ports of entry collected 25 jeer cent. only. This is at palpmble error and injustice.
    Good faith on the prrt of every importer should disarm any attemptat high handed injustice from an appraiser, and that same good fath should quickly bespeak ar remedy by appent to headquatiters in any case of need. When a grave issuc is raised, and the importer can show reasomble aromid for the sitand he takes, we incline to the opinion that the Minister of Customs should not rule by mere "ipse dixit" or before he bas made use of the Bearel of Trade as a customs court, or muless he has a procedent, well established, betore him. On this scoro there is much to be said. Every knotty case when sifted and adjusted should be, as to the final alecision, a matter of public information, and follow of record in some text book of precedeats for the future guilance of importer aml collectoralike.
    Ambinuities ats to classification of grools ant rates of duty, will be lessened. when the new eatalogines, now in course of fremaraion, are issume by the departa ment, ame the Jutes of duly set opposito Hue rehaje artiden, but wo may nevertheless expeet alisputes to continue, until the spitit of antagomism whith provaits to some extent hetwen customs official and merchant has disappeared. Suspicion of tharrepractice is too generally uppermost in the officiats mind. In seeking to deteet underathations he whould net from pare molives and from a desire to protect the honest importer whose raluation is a iall one, while verving the government faithfully. He should not bo fractions, over-zenlons, or uminulful of the fact that dhose who puy the duty are those who consented to its imposilion throngh their representaides in larlinment, and in such sense as a public offieer ho is their serrant. 'Ihis is an upabatallo doctrine to public officiats wenerally yet waranted by the fuets of the ease. The appraiser's post heill at all times be one calling for yuick aliscermment, taet, and mueh sumviten in modo. 'The furtiter in re is more becoming ats a reserve force than as an ever mparent and obtrusive circumstance of office.
    Merchants woull serve their own besl interesta by clevating the diguty of tho Mulies of the Custom Jtouse clork and sending as their reprosentativo one of the stafl well rersed in priees and possessing a full knowledye of the goods invoiced. Jhefore the entries are received the customs officint should guide the merelant's elerk in his onecifications in every rensonable way, not accepting the epecifications offfand simply to ontrap his employer aud
    share in the prospective spoils of the moiety system.
    Whech greater gooll will result, from the Comptroller's inceting the mercliants, informally, on their own ground where facts are abundant and susecptible of ensy proof, than could possibly result from deputizing members of the Board of Trade to attend at Otlawa during the leat of a purliamentary session when partisan influences would be more than likely to prevail. The Hou. N. Clarke Wallace hos made a grood begiming.

    ## RDCEEN'I CITY FIRDS.

    The "pound of cure" which, in lieu of the "ounce of prevention," has been applied by the underwiters to the disorder evident in our fire protective service for some line past, is now working-with what effeet remains to bo seen. Wo have little to add to and nothing to retract from what we expressed at somo length on the subjeet last week; but something may be said from the "moral hazard" joint of view.
    Few of our citizens have failed to notica the funcretsing frequency of fires in businesses which have grown notoriously dull, and :the relevancy of these two things which is leecoming more fixed and apparent as each season comes romml. Tho shop-worn titock, obsolete in fashion, illassurted, atid reckoned unsaleable, is the first to be sold-or if when 'consigned' to the flames it only suffers slight damage, or through the protection afforded by the \&alvige eorps is simply disarrangen, it yiells the shop-leeper the best opportunily for an attractive cheyp sale, undermining the custom and trafic of the neighbouring shop-keeper whose care nuid watehtumess-anul honesty-have kept away fire. This latiter is unfortumately the person who puys the losses, sweats under inereased premiums, and suffers the ruin of his business. Given, in some 10 calities, the deteriorating condition of the stock on the shelves, the state of the profit turd loss necomit, and the habits bf the shop-keeper, and one might prophesy arith merring accuracy as to the tikelihood of a fire on the premises.
    The firc-fiend has too often for his boon companion the lazy, immoral, reekless, and unsuecessful business man, anil this individual the incites to siludy his chanees of imoney-making out of a fire loss. Ho seans the fire system and its applinnces'sizessip' 'the brigude, and gets rendy for action. Ine notes the really way, wher an investigution takes place, in which each firoman testifies that he saw this and saw Hhat, and how deficient his testimong becomes when it yofers to his having done this aud done that-along tho line of his
    duty ne a fireman. "Wo all satí Prerost fall," they exclaim; "for the fell here and he fell thero, butt we were all shonting at each other; no neen to ask us about the lire ; we camot tell how or where it originated. We were not funder any one's orders; we are nearly all sulb-chiefs; we camnot tell whether tho water was "frozen in the hose; or how water driven with such force came to freeze at all. TWe got our appointments through an akderman-we were never properly drilled-never felt we had any epecial aptitude for a fireman's duties,but we were big, burly fellows with families, and wero shoved into a place l" No wonder the ehop-keeper weak on the question of 'moral hazard' should after such a course of oral calisthenics mature his plaus.
    There is plainly a want of apprenticethip or cadet-system about the fire-de-: partment. Thero is plenty of bravery, plenty of muscle, and yet plenty of lack of science and system.
    A grood iden would be for the Insurance Companies to select from their assured a committed of examiners who like the visitors to the hospitals or houses of industry might in weekly rotation take note of the improvements or lapses observable in their round of the fire stations. Those who happened on duty during the progress of a fire, large or small, might make up " report of what they sav for the benefit of the public generally. The individuals who as underwriters, and from prejudice, get scant courtosy from the fire commitlee, might through the instrumedallty of these visiting promium-payers secure a hearing.
    Constant inspection of their risks by the companies is most essential to their wer-fare-constant buspection of the fire-system equally so; and no less necessary is it to have regaird to the question of 'moral hazaril.' It is not enough to enhance rates after a fire, and simply regard unnleriwriting as a commodity to bo sold in the Jighest market, or lacking a profitable market to make one by resorting to higher rates. It willnevergayto carpy some policios.
    Somothing pemains to be sinid, loo, nbout ithose who bring risks to the com-panies-the brokers. When we note that in addition to about thirly-five per cont. of lordinary expenses, the companies havo to pay an commissions and brokernges another eigliteen per cent. on the average it should not be umeasonable to expect that ins losses go up commissions rhould go flown. There should not be a contimual fenst of fat things for the brokers and an oft recurring dimer of herbs for shareholders giud assured.

    ## AUDITING LOAN COMPANY ACCOUNTS.

    The misfortune which has befallen one of the Toronto lom companies rises the question as to how the present systemi of anditing their accounts is effectual for its purpose.
    In this case an officer is proved to have misappropriated $\$ 25,000$ of the funds of the compans. Tho irregularities which amounted to this total were spread over more than two years. During that period the books and securities of the company were systematically examined by two andtors, who, at the close of each year, signed the customary routine certificate that the accounts were correct.
    Suddenly a confidential officer disappented without warning, and leaving no trace of his movements. Suspicion was aroused, which coused a special audit to be made, with the result above stated. The work of that specinl audit occupied very few days. How, then, enme it to pass that two auditors-qualified men, presumably-shond for two years have been doing their work without discovering any trace of irregularity, while oue man, set speciaily to investigate the accounts, should have unearthed a mumber of such irregularitios?
    lt is suggested by a mereantile jourmal that the officer at fault was in the habit of receiving moneys across the cometer for Which he did not accomet. This is said by a contemporary to explain fully why the auditors were misled, and to be a surficient elearance of them from the charges of neglect and incompetency. So that, on this theory, it is not the duty of, now is it possible for auditors to proteet a company from an easy form of systematic frowd. But that this theory is as dangerous as it is monsouid, is shown by these defalcations lueing at once discovered by the special audit.
    This points to the defective link in the present system, which destroys the strength and usefuiness of the auniting chain. The work done usually proceds upon the assumption that the receipts recorded in the books cover every cent that has been paid in for interest, instalments, payments of mortgages in full, and for deposit. Now, the only mode by which one of these companies can be deirnuded without dauger of prompt detection, is this very practice of receiving money withont recording it. Yet it is contended that the auditing system camot afiord a snfeguard against such a palpable danger. If that were so, it would be, as it too often is, an elaborate and useless ceremony. But this is not so, necessarily, however common it may be.
    A properly conducted audit should proceed, not upon the assumption that ail the money entered is all that has been
    received, but upon a close comparison of the moneys received with a schedule of what ought to have been paid in, so far as the iuterest aud principal of mortgages is concerned, aud expianations songht of the arrears.
    In the matter of deposits systematic onquiry should be made of depositors to see if their receipts tally with the books, as is done with bank bulances by inspectors. To give onty a deposit receipt without the money being entered is a very risky thing, too tangerous to be ventured upon, and is not possible in a well organized office. But, while a mortgage is rumning, sums may be paid in on accome of principal or interest without being entered, without discovery for years, if the slaff is small, and the auditors simply go through the ordinary rontine of taking things for granted which they ought, most especially to investigate.
    The objection will be raised that, were audits to be conducted on the above plan, the ofitialls charged with the work would have to be paid much larger fees, and in harge concerns would need to be on the stafi, like bank inspectors are. That is manifost. li, however, ruditing a company's accounts is worth doing at all, it is worth doing cificiontly. To pay six to eiglit hundred dollars ny yen for an axamination which is little or no sufeguard against frand, is, we submit, very uubusimesslike, to say the least. A company pany must we indecd poverty-strieken which cannot afford to pay such fecs, or such a salary, as would insure thate the numal certificate, affirming the correctness of its accounts, as presented to the public, is worthy oi absolute confidence.
    We are very glad to know that the company in question, which stauds deservedly high in public estimation, is not likely to lose more than one-thitd of the sum phacd above, which is a trifiling amount for a concern having its substantial reserve fund and prosperous imsiness.

    ## A NEW JAIL ROUTE.

    Recent developments throw sone light on the reasons for the reported strong hosfility to the Ottawa \& Parry Sound, of which we have heard something through ohscure telegraphic despatehes from the Capital. The Northern Pacific has smarted for some time under the invasion of its western territory by the Canadion Pacifie, and has been loying its plans to get even.
    Nothing less will suit it than a direct eastern connection with the seabonrd, running cutirely through Canadian tervitory, from Parry Sound, (On Georgian Day), to Quebec, a distance of 500 miles, and this iti appears to have safely sceured. Parry Sound is said to Lave an excellent harbor, although the appronches are somewhat dangerous, nnd it is convenient to the present route of the lake crait from Chi-
    cago and Dulnth The Canadian Pacific and Grand Trunk have their shipping ponits on Georginu Bay at Owen Sound and Collingwood, butt Parry Sound is claimed to be nearer to Quebee than either by over 150 miles, and the gradients and location of the proposed route are nlleged to be in no degree inferior to the existing eervices to Montreal. The links of the proposed road are largely in the hands of Ottawn and Quebee parties, and it is not proposed to build to Montreal, but at Ottama there will be ample water and rail connections with this city, and a port offering such advantages as ours is bound to secure its fair share of whatever business there is to be done. One item of news is that a shipment of 6,000 ,000 bushels of grain ammally brought by the Northern Pacific to Daluth will be handed orer to the line at Parry Sound to go to Quebec. The winter port may possibiy be New London, Conn.
    The Toronto Board of Traie recentily passed a resolution urging the Dominion Gorermment to mrant no further aid to the Parry Sound Nailway, and certain Toronto pupers have represented the diatrict between Ottawa and Georgian Bay to be an umproductive widderness. If westorn trafic prefers a backloor routo to the sea insteal of the open lake front, the Queen City may, however, have to do without the tralfic. The portion of tho line from Pary Sound to Ottawa, about 240 miles, is already party built. From Ottawn eastward to Hawkesbury, 34 miles are in operation under the name of the Conada Atlantic. At the latter point the Ottawa will be bridged. Thence to Quobec, 226 miles, threo links measuring 110 miles, are already built and two others are yet to be constructed. Capiinlistis interested in the Quebee and Lake St. John Railway control the necessary charters which were granted to the Grand Northern Railway.
    It is reported that the entire roal will be opeu for trafic next yenr.

    ## THE TOBACCO DCTIES.

    A portion of the Frouch pross has recenily adrocated the substitution of a customs duly on imported tobaceo lent, instead of the present excise duty on the manufactured product, the object being to encourage tobaceo raising. It should not be forgotten, however, that the present system of protecting and collecting the revenue is a good one, and that the country cannot avoid to remit any of the duties on tobaceo. A Toronto paper makes the following comment: It is of course desirable thent Canadian tobaceo should be grown and manaiactured, lut if its consumption were very greatly incrensed by the change proposed in its behalf, it should be male pay a heavier duty. It has the bencit of a protection of 20 c a pound now, and the tax on it being 5a, while that on the foreign leal product is 25e. There was a fairly active consmmption of it during the time of the American war, when United States moduction and trado nortiwarl was almost at a standstill; but as soon as we could get the Southern leaf at a reasonable price, the

    ## IRRIGATION IN THE WEST:

    Tha in igation of the arid plains along the course of the Colorado river nad its branches has been a problem. which has herefoforo delied any facile solution of the difficults it has qugaged the atten-

    Ition of numbers of speculators, notorious among them the inventor, who only some two years ago elaimed to have discovered a method of compelling rain fromethe atmesphere overhead by means of explosions, which, however, on trial, as might have been expected, proved to be wholly impracticable. There are large areas of land scattered here and there all over the Western States and territories which require only sufficient irrigation to render them as fertile as any portion of the Mississippi valley of our own Northwest. Many of the most productive of the omage groves and other orchards of southern California have heen brought to their present condition by the judicious appliention of water from the strenms of the surrounding hills, convejed ly more or less expensive methods to the thirsty land.
    Among the practical enterprises established for the conversion of these so-called "deserit" areas to a state of fertility, is that known as the Colorado River. Irrigation Co., which has recently opened an office in the Cannda Life Buildings, Toronto. The announcement elsewhere conthins the names of the officers and directors of the company, anong whom may be specially mentioned Mr. Jas. H.     Coal-United States advices state that the weekly ontput is in excess of the present market requirement, and most of the producing companics ure stocking coal, both at tidewater and interior storage points. The eastern trade is expected to remain quiet until aiter May 1st, While the western business is at a standstill, and will remain so until after the meeting of the Western sales agents, which is to be held in New York on the e6th instant. The total amount of anthracite coal sent to market for the week ending April 1, as reported by the several carrying companies, was 803,338 tons, com. pared with 714,478 tons in the corregponding week last yeur, an increase of $\mathbf{0 8 , 8 6 0}$ tons, and for the year to that date the total tonnare has ljeen $10,001,481$ tong, compared with $0,278,073$ tons in the corresponding period of 1892, an increase of 723.408 tons.
