School Children to Be Given an Information.

Philadelphia educators have a scheme that is worthy of the emulation of Toronto teachers.

More than 100,000 specimens of the world's raw products are to be distributed among the Public Schools of that city and Pennsylvania by the Philadelphia Commercial Museum. The pupils will study each product, and follow the various processes of conversion.

The specimens will be divided into 400 distinct collections. One hundred of these will be distributed among the schools of the city, and 300 will be sent to schools thruout the State.
