Entire Russian People Determined to Fight Until Victory Won—Believed Negotiations With Bulgaria Entering Decisive Stage

London, Aug. 9—The morning newspapers look upon the Russian situa-tion more optimistically than they have for several days.

The Times declares "While the position of certain portions of the Russian forces still remains critical, there is every reason to believe the excellent order with which their withdrawal has been executed thus far, will be maintained untill all have reached the new line of defense.




