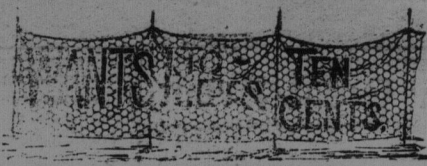

SECOND EDITION. THE CURRENCY QUESTION.

MR. SHERMAN'S BILL INTRODUCED BY FINLEY.

It completes the substitution of Greenbacks for National Bank Notes and Gold and Silver Certificates, and the issue of \$100,000,000 of Greenbacks. WASHINGTON, D. C., Dec. 10.—Senator Hamlin today introduced, by request of William F. St. John, president of the Mercantile National Bank of New York, a bill which is an amendment in the nature of a substitute, to Senator Sherman's bill to reduce the compulsory holding of bonds by national banks, etc. Mr. St. John's bill proposes to permit national banks to maintain their charters on a minimum holding of each of \$100,000 of United States bonds, and directs the secretary of the treasury to replace the national bank notes hereafter coming for cancellation by the issue of the same of United States notes of unlimited legal tender. These proposed notes are also to be issued to replace all gold certificates and silver certificates and other United States notes coming into the treasury, so that hereafter the United States shall not issue more than one kind of paper money. For these unlimited tender United States notes, the treasury is to carry a 40 per cent cash reserve, which shall not be less than 50 per cent of the gross amount of the notes to be maintained. No one is to command unlimited gold or silver, or to be opened at once to free coinage for standard gold and silver, with the option allowed to convert the bullion into gold or silver, and to receive these new notes at coinage value in lieu of coin, and the preference of the people for paper money is to be secured by insuring the exercise of this option as a rule.
