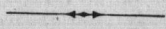

ET :

DIOCESAN CONSTITUTION

OF THE

QUEBEC BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY



1. This Association shall be called "The Quebec Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society of the Church of England in Canada."
2. The objects of this Association shall be: To awaken missionary zeal among the church women in the Diocese; to diffuse missionary intelligence; to raise money for missionary objects, and to encourage the formation of Parochial Branches throughout the Diocese.
3. All women who shall contribute to the funds of the Auxiliary annually, either through the Diocesan Branch or a Parochial Branch or as individuals, shall be considered members of this Association, and shall be entitled to vote at all general meetings. Each Delegate shall have two votes, one for her Parish and one as a member.
4. The Executive Committee of the Diocesan Branch shall consist of a President (who shall be the wife of the Bishop of the Diocese), Vice-Presidents (who shall be the Presidents of the Parochial Branches), a Treasurer, a Secretary, an Assistant-Secretary, the Editor of the Leaflet, the officers of the Parochial Branches and a delegate from each Branch, provided always that if the Bishop's wife declines to accept office, the President shall be elected at the Annual Meeting.
5. The Diocesan Branch shall be the medium between the Parochial Branches and the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Domestic and Foreign Missions.
6. The Parochial Branches shall report Quarterly to the Diocesan Branch, and the Treasurer of each Parochial Branch shall be required to send to the Diocesan Treasurer, at least one week before the Annual Meeting, a Statement of all amounts of money or value of clothing &c., sent by her Branch, since the last An-

nual Meeting, either direct to any Mission or through the Diocesan Treasurer, and the Secretary of each Parochial Branch shall send an Annual Report to the Diocesan Secretary as soon as possible after the Annual Meeting of her Branch.

7. The Diocesan Branch shall hold four general Meetings for arranging plans of work, and for the transaction of general business.

8. The Annual Meeting shall be held in May, at which meeting all financial reports shall be presented, and officers elected for the ensuing year by ballot.

9. A Special Meeting of the Diocesan Branch may be called at any time by the President, upon the request of any three members of the Branch.

10. This constitution may be changed at any regular Meeting of the Branch by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, notice in writing having been given at a previous meeting.

BY-LAWS.

1. The President, or one of the Vice-Presidents, shall preside at all meetings. She shall take the general supervision of the Parochial Branches and urge the formation of such Branches in all parishes of the Diocese.

2. The Secretary or Assistant-Secretary shall give notice of all meetings of the Branch, record the proceeding of such meetings, prepare an Annual Report, conduct all the correspondence of the Diocesan Branch, and furnish the Parochial Branches with all possible intelligence concerning the work of Domestic and Foreign Missions.

3. The Diocesan Treasurer shall receive all subscriptions and offerings sent through her; and forward to the Secretary-Treasurer of the Board of Management of the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society of the Church of England, at Quebec, such amounts, and for such purposes as may be determined by each Parochial Branch.

4. The Secretary of each Parochial Branch shall send to the Secretary of the Diocesan Branch, a list of the Officers for the ensuing year, immediately after the Annual Meeting, and also notify her if any change is made during the year.

PAROCHIAL CONSTITUTION.

1. This Association shall be called "The Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society of the Church of England in Canada.

2. The objects of this Branch shall be : To pray for missions ; to aid the Woman's Auxiliary in its work of interesting church women in missionary work by one common bond of harmonized effort ; to diffuse missionary intelligence and to infuse missionary zeal amongst the children of the Church ; to receive contributions towards the funds of the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society.

3. All women of the church who desire to be members of this association may become such by the payment of an annual subscription (from 10 cents to \$1.00).

4. The Board of Management shall consist of a President, Vice-President, a Recording Secretary and Corresponding Secretary and a Treasurer, together with two women nominated by the Rector of the Parish.

5. The Annual Meeting will be held in April,

6. The Order of business at the Meetings shall be :—1. Prayer ; 2. Minutes of last meeting ; 3. Correspondence ; 4. Treasurer's Report ; 5. Offerings, (*If so arranged*) ; 6. Missionary Intelligence and Miscellaneous Business.

7. Special meetings may be called by the President at the request of two-thirds of the Board.

8. This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote at the Annual Meeting, notice in writing having been given at a previous meeting.

BY-LAWS.

1. The President, or, in her absence, one of the Vice-Presidents, shall preside at all meetings,

2. The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to give notice of all meetings, and to keep a record of such meetings. She shall prepare an Annual Report, and send an Annual Statement of the work of the Branch to the Secretary of the Diocesan Auxiliary, at least two weeks before the Diocesan Annual Meeting.

3. The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct all the correspondence of the Society, and shall prepare an Annual Report of such correspondence.

4. The Treasurer shall receive and forward to the Diocesan Treasurer all money offerings, and keep an account of all money and articles contributed for Missionary purposes. She shall present a monthly statement, and prepare an Annual Report to be presented at the Annual Meeting, and shall also send to the Diocesan Treasurer a yearly financial Report.

5. The Board shall endeavor to increase in the Church a Missionary spirit; shall decide on the best methods of augmenting the funds; endeavor to promote in every way the efficiency of the Branch in its labor of love and mercy, by visiting the several congregations, explaining the objects of the Society, enrolling new members, and soliciting regular subscriptions.

REPORT

Of the Fifth Annual Meeting of the Quebec Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary

1891

The Fifth Annual Meeting of the Quebec Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary was held on Friday the 15th May 1891.

The Holy Communion was celebrated in the Cathedral at 10:30 A. M., at which His Lordship the Bishop of the Diocese, the Dean, Canons Richardson and Von Iffland and Revds. H. J. Petry, F. A. Smith, A. J. Balfour, Lennox Williams and T. A. Williams were present, also between seventy and eighty members of the Auxiliary. The Dean gave a most appropriate and helpful address.

Immediately after the service the members assembled in the Church Hall to hear very encouraging reports from the following Branches. The Cathedral (city), Compton, Cookshire, Inverness, Lennoxville, Levis, New Liverpool, Richmond and Melbourne, Rivière-du-Loup, Sherbrooke, St. Georges, St. Matthews (City), St. Michaels (city), St. Pauls (city), St. Peters (city), St. Sylvester, Trinity (city), West Frampton, and Windsor Mills.

Meeting then adjourned for lunch.

The meeting was opened with a hymn and the Missionary Litany.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and confirmed. The President then gave an address. Treasurer's Report was read and adopted, also the Secretary's Report.

Greetings from the Toronto Board and Mrs. Cummings were read, also letters from the following, Revd. A. Young, Revd. W. A. Burman, thanking the Quebec Branch for the \$100 promised him, Miss Milledge, Winnipeg, asking for altar vessels and linen, Ethel Allman, Mrs. Boomer, and Miss Boyce of Qu'Appelle.

Offerings were then taken up. An appeal from D. and F. Missionary Society for \$150 to send Miss Sherlock as medical Missionary to Japan was then laid before the meeting and explanations given, certificates read &c., &c. and it was decided to ask the Branches how much each would contribute.

Notice was given that the following amendments to the Constitution will be brought up at the next Quarterly meeting.

After clause 2 insert the following new clause. "All women who shall contribute to the funds of the Auxiliary annually, either through the Diocesan Branch or a Parochial Branch or as individuals, shall be considered members and shall be entitled to vote at all general Meetings. Each delegate shall have two votes, one for her Parish and one as a member."

Clause 3 amended as follows.

The Executive Committee of the Diocesan Branch shall consist of a President (who shall be the wife of the Bishop of the Diocese) Vice-Presidents (who shall be the Presidents of the Parochial Branches) a Treasurer, a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, the Editor of the Leaflet, the officers of the Parochial Branches or

Clause 6 amended as follows.

The Diocesan Branch shall hold four General Meetings for arranging plans of work and for the transaction of general business."

Clause 7 amended as follows.

"The Annual Meeting shall be held

in May, at which meeting all financial Reports shall be presented and officers elected for the ensuing year by ballot." The clause beginning "all women" being an addition and inserted after Clause 2 will become clause 3 and will necessitate the renumbering of all the remaining clauses. It was put to the vote and carried that voting by proxy would be allowed.

The following officers were then elected.

President—Mrs. von Iffland.

Treasurer—Mrs. M. Bell Irvine

Secretary—Miss L. H. Montziambert.

Asst.-Secretary—Mrs Ainslie Young.

The following resolutions were moved and adopted.

That the Secretary has no option in the matter of laying appears before *all* the Branches when requested so to do.

2. Moved by Mrs. Williams, 2nd by Mrs. Jones.

"That a hearty vote of thanks be tendered Miss Forsyth, the retiring Treasurer for the able and conscientious manner in which she has discharged her duties."

3. That the Executive Committee shall meet on the 4th Friday in each month from the 4th Friday in September to the 4th Friday in April. Seven members to form a quorum. A special meeting of the Executive Committee may be called at any time by the President or in her absence by two Vice Presidents."

"That it shall be the duty of the City Delegate to hold *all* communications with her Parish, and the Diocesan Secretary shall communicate with each Parish through its delegate.

"That a hearty vote of thanks be tendered the "Morning Chronicle" for many kindnesses during the past year."

6. Moved by Miss Price, 2nd by Mrs. Colin Sewell.

"That the Annual Report be printed in pamphlet form and in it be included the amended Constitution. 200 copies to be ordered and distributed as last year."

7. Moved by Mrs. Forsyth, 2nd by Mrs. F. A. Smith.

"That a hearty vote of thanks be tendered Mr. Bishop and the members of the Cathedral Choir for their kind assistance at the Annual Services of the W. A.

8. Moved by Mrs. Thornloe, 2nd by Mrs. Vicar.

"That four general meetings be held during the year, at which all members of the Auxiliary be allowed to vote.

The badge sent by the Toronto Diocese was shown but was not approved of.

Mrs. von Iffland was requested to vacate the chair and Mrs. Petry having taken it, it was.

"Moved by Mrs. J. Hamilton, 2nd by Mrs. Colin Sewell.

"That a hearty vote of thanks be tendered Mrs. von Iffland for her most able and efficient conducting of the meeting.

After singing the Doxology the meeting adjourned.

PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

Dear Sisters of the Auxiliary I, as your President, greet you with a heartfelt welcome, especially you who have kindly come from a distance to this our Fifth Annual Meeting. During the past year we have been enabled, by God's grace, to do much good work, and we have indeed great reason to be thankful to the Giver of all good, that He has been pleased to bless and prosper our handiwork. We have now 20 Branches and hope soon to hear that others have been organized. We have adopted Ethel Allman as our Auxiliary child. I trust, for her good and God's honour. We have been able to fulfil all our promises, and to venture to undertake greater responsibilities. We, perhaps, thought last year, that we were doing all we could, and were well satisfied with ourselves and our work. But God saw differently, and this year we are called upon to do what we should have hardly dared to contemplate at our last Annual Meeting. God's thoughts are not as our thoughts, nor His ways our ways, He knows what we are able to accomplish far better than we do ourselves. The further work God gives us to do is, first to contribute \$150, towards the salary of a lady teacher for Mr. Burman's School. Many of you know, from himself how important his work is, and how much he needs help. At our last quarterly meeting we voted \$100, towards this object. Secondly, to assist Mr. Bourne in his work, towards which \$50, were voted. them in this matter. Many other appeals have been laid before us from time to time, and the Secretary will read them to us again, that we may take counsel as to what it is in our power to do. Miss Sherlock's claim; to our assistance will be stated to you, and I earnestly hope we may be able to contribute the full \$150 for her support. God commanded Moses to tell the people to bring offerings for the work of building the Tabernacle, Ex 35ch. 21 22 vs. "They came, *every one* whose heart stirred him up, and every one whom his spirit made willing, and they brought the *Lord's* offering, and they came both *men* and *women*, as many as were willing hearted." Ex 36 ch. 2nd vs. "And Moses called even every one whose heart stirred him up to come to the work to do it. And they brought unto him free offerings every morning." So eager were the people to bring unto the Lord, that the workers said to Moses, "The people bring *much more than enough for the service* of the work, which the Lord commanded. So the people were *restrained* from bringing." This work, the making known the Gospel of Christ to the heathen, the building of His Tabernacle the visible Church, in all lands to the uttermost bounds of earth, which God has given us to do, is *The Lord's work*, and we are the people whom He has commanded to do it, so far as we are able. I trust that *our* hearts may be stirred up, and *our* spirits made willing, to do as did God's people of old, that we may bring free will offerings *to The Lord*, till there is *more than enough*. Through the beautiful address of Mrs. Cummings in March, from the able papers in our Church Magazine, and from the Leaflet, we now know much more about our Great North West, its religious needs, and the hardships of the devoted missionaries who are labouring there. Let us remember, when our burden presses heavily, that as God gives us this work to do, He will surely enable us to do it, if we work in His way, and use the means He gives us. In Annual Meetings there must, almost always, be a strain of sadness. This year God has called some earnest workers from among us, to a higher and holier sphere of work for Him, the beauty and glory of which we can but dimly comprehend. Ere we meet again some of us, who are here to-day, may have joined those happy workers, *our* work on earth ended, our higher work begun, which is indeed the object and reward of our labour here. That where our Master is, there we may be with Him.

FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

QUEBEC DIOCESAN BRANCH OF THE WOMANS' AUXILIARY

MAY, 15th 1891.

In presenting the Fifth Annual Report of the Quebec Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary it is a cause of great pleasure and thankfulness to be able to recognize advance on all sides.

During the past year two new Branches have been organized, one at Rivière du Loup with 20 members and one at St. Sylvester with 15. Both Branches have done wonderfully during the short time they have been at work. Trinity, West Frampton, and Windsor Mills Branches are to be congratulated on their revival after contending with great difficulties.

The Quebec Branch now consists of 20 Senior Branches, 1 sub-division of a Branch, and 3 Junior Branches containing in all 960 members, against 700 last year.

Three Quarterly and two special meetings have been held as well as the Annual Meeting. Just before our last Annual, Quebec joined the Toronto Monthly Leaflet with a subscription list of 300. Now this modest little missionary messenger finds its way every month to 460 members. All that was expected, and more, has been realized by its introduction, the diffusion of missionary intelligence, the uniting of co-workers and the benefit of other's experiences, all tending to help forward our work for Christ.

Our thanks are due to Miss Petry and Miss Mary Petry for having distributed the Leaflet during the past year. Miss Annie Irvine has kindly undertaken the duty for the coming one. All orders for copies are to be addressed to the Dio. Secretary, as before.

In June last your Secretary had the pleasure of visiting her fellow-workers of the Sherbrooke and Windsor Mills Branches and was much gratified with what she heard and by the kind receptions accorded her.

At the Quarterly Meeting held in September the resignation by Miss Tillie Shaw of the office of Asst. Secretary was very reluctantly accepted. For several years she had discharged her duties in an able and efficient manner and with unvarying kind-

Membership, cards have been issued and are much appreciated.

In November last the Diocesan Branch was deprived of one of its Vice-Presidents by the sad and sudden death of Mrs. Nicolls the much regretted President of the Levis Branch. Shortly after, Mrs. Baker an earnest and faithful member of the Cookshire Branch was taken from them, to the great regret of those who knew her.

In January the Diocesan Branch received a kind invitation from the Cathedral Branch to hold their meetings in future in the Church Hall, which invitation was gratefully accepted and a hearty vote of thanks tendered the St. Matthews Branch for the use of their Parish Room during the past two years.

After much deliberation the eldest daughter of the Revd. A. Allman, of Port Sydney, Diocese of Algoma, was chosen as Quebec's daughter and the consent of her parents having been obtained, she arrived in London early in April and is now with the Misses Penney and attending the Public School where she seems to be doing very well.

In March last we were favored by a visit from Mrs. Cummings who addressed a large Missionary Meeting in the Church Hall and delighted all who heard her describe her visit to the Missions in the North West. Mrs. Cummings also kindly addressed a meeting of our Diocesan Branch and gave many useful hints as to work &c., her enthusiasm and high aim in all she does inspiring many amongst us to greater zeal.

The proceeds of her lecture after deducting expenses were \$15 which were sent to the Sisters of All Hallows, Yale, B. C.

The Revd. W. A. Burman, St. Pauls Industrial School, Middlechurch, and the Revd. H. T. Bourne, Piegan Reserve sent appeals for \$150 each for the work of their Indian Schools.

The sum of \$100 was guaranteed the Revd. W. A. Burman for three years to aid in paying the salary of a lady teacher and \$50 to the Revd. H. T. Bourne for three years for the extension of his school.

Mr. Burman's visit to Quebec in the middle of March was full of interest to those who had the pleasure of hearing him.

The "Extra cent-a-day" fund, an opportunity for self denial in luxuries &c., &c. has been started and already 50 members have joined it, making \$182.50 contributed to Missions, *over and above* anything that was given before. It is earnestly hoped that many more will join (men, women or children) and by a little

effort of self-denial do more for Him who gave His life for us. There are many ways of saving a cent a day if the *wish* to do it is there.

More calls for help come to us from every side, one especial one from the Board of the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society for aid in supporting a lady Missionary to Japan, to which we must respond as heartily as we can.

The appointment of City delegates to represent the distant Branches has proved most beneficial, not only in keeping the Branches more in touch with the Diocesan Branch, but by bringing many able workers to assist at our meetings.

The attendance at the Quarterly Meetings, though increased, is not nearly what we would like to see. Will not more members try to give up an afternoon four times a year to aid the work of spreading Christ's Kingdom upon earth?

The resolution passed at the Quarterly Meeting in March last doing away with the money valuation of the boxes, barrels, bales &c., of clothing sent from our Diocese will greatly diminish Quebec's figures but we hope that, in time, the increase of contributions in money will counterbalance this effect.

Last year the barrels, bales &c. of clothing sent from this Diocese numbered 30, this year they have increased to 47.

The Reports you heard read this morning have shown you the increase of members, work, contributions and zeal which it is our privilege to record, testifying, surely, that God's blessing is upon our feeble efforts to serve Him. May this thought arm us for the future and enable us, with prayer and faith, to take up, in His strength, whatever work He sends us to do.

The Diocesan Secretaries wish to express their gratitude to the Branch Secretaries for their prompt and business like responses to communications sent them, lightening, in no small measure, duties which are increasing daily.

Again would we appeal to every woman in the Diocese to come and join us in trying to spread the Gospel message among all nations. Children too can do a great deal. Invalids and those who cannot assist in any other way can help greatly by using the Auxiliary prayer.
