Loening, of Cambridge Wells, England, and addressed to Major George Matthews, New York, to be kept in bond at the express office, 71 Broadway, New York, until called for. The trunk was duly forwarded by the express company, and reached New York by the steamer Cuba, which arrived there March 20th, and was kept in bond until Saturday, when a woman, called herself Mrs. George Matthews, presented an order for delivery at the express office, duly signed by Geo. Matthews, and addressed to the Bank of England.
