



CONSTITUTION OF THE MISSIONARY SOCIETY

OF THE

Wesleyan-Methodist Church in Canada.

ARTICLE 1.—That in consequence of the withdrawal of the British Conference from connexion with the Canadian Conference, the Canada Conference Missionary Society has ceased to be Auxiliary to the Wesleyan Missionary Society in England: it is therefore expedient that the Conference of the Wesleyan-Methodist Church in Canada recognize and establish, as it existed previously to the year 1833, an independent Missionary Society, to be denominated THE MISSIONARY SOCIETY OF THE WESLEYAN-METHODIST CHURCH IN CANADA.

ART. 2.—The object of this Society is to excite and combine the exertions of the Societies and Congregations of the Wesleyan Methodists and others throughout the Province of Canada, in the support and enlargement of Missions among the Indians and destitute Settlers of this Province and elsewhere.

ART. 3.—The payment of One Pound and upwards, annually, shall constitute a Member; and the payment of Ten Pounds, and upwards, at one time, shall constitute a member for life, and shall entitle each to a copy of the Annual Report.

ART. 4.—The Officers of this Society shall consist of a Treasurer, Recording and Corresponding Secretaries, who, together with Ten Managers, shall form a Board, by whom the business of the Society shall be transacted during the intervals of Conference. They shall be annually elected by the Society. At any meeting of the Board five shall form a quorum for the transaction of business.

ART. 5.—The President and Secretary of the Conference shall be, *ex officio*, Members of the Board of Managers.

ART. 6.—The Conference, at each of its Annual Meetings, shall appoint a Committee, consisting of the President and Secretary of the Conference, the Chairmen of Districts, and five others, whose duty it shall be to audit all the accounts of the Expenditures, &c., during the past year, and make, as far as may be necessary, the appropriations for the support of the Missions during the ensuing year.

ART. 7.—All the Methodist Missionary Societies which have been, or may be formed in the several *Districts* of the Province of Canada, shall be entitled "Auxiliaries;" and all Societies in the particular Circuit of any District shall be entitled "Branches."

ART. 8.—All Benefactors of Ten Pounds, and upwards, and all Subscribers of One Pound, and upwards, annually, to any of the Auxiliary or Branch Societies, shall be deemed members of the General Society.

ART. 9.—An Annual Public Meeting of the Members and friends of the Society shall be held at the time and place of the Session of the Conference; at which Meeting the Officers and Managers of the Society shall be appointed, according to Article 4.

REPORT.

THE Love of God has given existence to Christian Missions. Such Missions are needed, by the darkness, depravity, and degradation of fallen man. That love alone has inspired a volume for his illumination, comfort, and guidance; raised up, qualified, and authorised men to exhibit its doctrines and enforce its precepts; originated a wise and vast economy of means, to extend the tidings and truths of Redemption; and poured a Spirit from on high, whose office is, and whose energies are exerted, to teach and save mankind, by the instrumentality of those doctrines, precepts, and means. Well might the Rev. Richard Watson, at the commencement of one of his admirable Missionary speeches, say of this subject, "It is wide as the mercy of God and the wants of man."

The Committee of THE MISSIONARY SOCIETY OF THE WESLEYAN-METHODIST CHURCH IN CANADA, believing that this remark is as scriptural as it is emphatic, have endeavoured, during the past year, to act under the authority, and give a wider spread to the blessings, of that Volume which is stamped with mercy for the world; and now have the pleasure of presenting their *Eighteenth* Annual Report, which will show their endeavours have not been unsuccessful. Many are the Ministers, School Teachers, and Native Labourers they have had employed, who have been much aided and encouraged by the visits and services of the respected Missionary Agent, the Rev. William Ryerson, whose journeys to the Missions, even the remotest, have been toilsome and perilous. All have gone forth bearing "precious seed," and, after labouring another year, have returned, "bringing their sheaves with them,"—ascribing their abundant "harvest" to the God of grace.

It is disagreeable, but faithful to the friends of the Society renders it a duty for the Committee to say, that they have not been permitted, during this year, any less than last, to proceed in their work, on some Missions, without interruption from others; and that several of the Missions have not been free from the mischievous interference of agents of a Church whose pretensions are invidious and unjust. Dr. Abeel, an eminent Missionary in China, shall speak the mind of the Committee on this painful subject: "In selecting their spheres of action, let each denomination *pass by* the places *already occupied*, and fix upon those where their services are most

needed. What endless collision and confusion this would prevent! what desirable consequences it would produce!"

After these introductory observations, the Committee will briefly lay before the supporters of the Society the state of their Indian and Domestic Missions, and a list of its contributors, which, they believe, will be gratifying.

INDIAN MISSIONS.

In introducing these interesting Missions, the Committee need not, as they have done in other Reports, enter into the eventful history of the Indians, to show what their condition *was*. What is it, generally, in Canada *now*? Though debased by Paganism and sin, and despised by many, as they were, God has remembered them in "their low estate; for His mercy endureth forever." The Rev. Peter Jones, when in England, made this announcement (worthy of God, who had visited the speaker's own endeared people):—"My Christian brethren, I bless your God that He is also the Indian's God; and that your heaven is the Indian's heaven," "and that the Great Spirit is no respecter of persons."

It is an encouraging fact that a number of the Committee's Missionaries to Indians can preach in the *native* tongue, thereby dispensing with an inconvenient and expensive mode of communication, that of interpretation. Of this number, some have the honour of giving the *written* language, and books, to the Indians, chiefly at the cost of the Society; and in this respect, as in others, they are the imitators of Carey, in India; Morrison, in China; and Eliot, in America, "the apostle of the Indians." The language thus given them has conveyed to their understandings Revealed truths, which show, in several ways, they have had a transforming influence on them; one of which is, the gratitude and liberality they manifest to the Society, in annual subscriptions, to be seen in the lists of its contributors.

This is not all: having submitted their hearts to the truth, their lives are accordant with it, and in them are to be seen love to God and their fellow-men, sobriety in the midst of temptation, meekness under oppression, and diligence in their new relations as civilized beings and as Christians. They are not now, as they were, a wilderness people, but have their well-laid-out villages; nearly every family possesses a dwelling, and almost every tribe a sanctuary for God. In the latter, many a voice is heard in spiritual worship; and, from some of the former, the pious, dying Red man has passed from earth to heaven. In the midst of these sanctuaries stands that of the

Missionary, who rejoices in his privations and labours. One, who

can beautifully describe a Missionary scene, asks, "And who does not here think of the dwellings of Nonanetum rising around Eliot in the wilderness? of the twelve Indian villages of Zeisberger? of Brainerd's Indians coming from the far-off forks of the Delaware to his beloved Crossweeksung; killing a supply of deer, that they might be able to listen to him for days together, without interruption; and then 'building themselves little cottages' up to 'his own door?' and of the Esquimaux coming from Okkak, as far as the Moravian settlement at Hopedale? 'where,' said the Missionary, 'our congregations are blooming like a beautiful rose.' * * * 'Whence this mighty change? Our only answer is, such is the effect of the Gospel."

GRAND RIVER MISSION.

Notwithstanding the protracted non-settlement of the location of the Indians on this Mission, and some untoward circumstances referred to in the last Report, there has been a moral and religious advance among them this year; and they have proved themselves deserving of the attention and expense which are bestowed upon them. There have been placed with them a Missionary, a Teacher, and an Interpreter; and it is pleasing to observe, that, on the entire Mission, there is an accession of 165 members. The Rev. H. Biggar writes to the Committee:—

"The labours of the Missionary extend through a part of the Brantford Township and the Indian Reservation, on both sides of the River. The number of appointments attended by the Missionary, among the Whites and the Indians, is ten: members, Whites 135, Indians 116: average of hearers 400. We have endeavoured to keep up our School during the year, though this has been with some difficulty, owing, in a measure, to the unsettled state of the Indians. The location of the Reservation intended by the Government is, up to the present, unsettled. A general expectation is that it will be on the south side of the River, which has caused a great moving from the north to the south side; and while this point remains unsettled, the prosperity of the School must be greatly retarded. The number of Scholars, including Whites and Indians, is, on an average, 20. Our Library is very limited; barely sufficient for the Scholars. The amount of moneys raised on the Mission is about £27."

CREDIT MISSION.

From this picturesque home of a worthy body of cultivated Natives there has gone out into the world, for many years, "a good report;" and it cannot be calculated fully, but by God, what benefits have resulted from the everywhere-known "Credit Mission." There is a piety, utility, and loveliness about it now which excite our admiration; and its past simple annals supply incidents which link themselves with the origin, or progress, or both, of the work of Indian

christianization at nearly every one of the Society's Missions, and with Methodist Missions in the United States, and in the Hudson's Bay Territory. For, which of these distinct departments of the work has not been, and is not at the present, indebted to the agency of Missionaries, Teachers, or Interpreters converted and educated at that Mission? One has gone and laboured, and scores of souls have been brought to Christ; and then there remains unanswered, till the Judgment-day, this question, How many have *they* brought to Him? As in the case of other of the Committee's Missions, the Indians here have an uncertain tenure of their lands; still, their Missionary, the Rev. D. Wright, speaks favourably of the Mission. There is supported at it a Missionary, a Teacher, and an Interpreter, and, owing to special efforts, there has been an increase of members. He says:—

“The state of this Mission remains nearly the same as last year. There have been several removals to other parts of our work, and two very unexpected deaths—the one our much-esteemed brother Lewis Bradley, the other an aged Indian woman of this village—both respected and useful members of our Church. We had a very interesting and profitable revival on Dundas Street during the winter, and about fourteen were hopefully brought to the knowledge of the truth, and added to the Church of Christ, all of whom remain steadfast, ‘walking by the same rule, and minding the same thing.’ The unsettled state of our Indians with regard to their removal from this place is, in my opinion, a very great injury to their improvement; and I sincerely hope the matter will soon be settled whether they are to remove or remain. The Day and Sabbath Schools have been in active operation during the greater part of the year. The children have made very commendable improvement. The members of our Church, especially the Chiefs, their families, and principal and leading individuals of this tribe, are truly an ornament to the Christian Religion. Their punctuality in attending the means of grace, their kindness and faithfulness in discharging their personal and relative duties, afford clear and convincing proof of the benefits of the Christian Religion, and I think should put to the blush their late objectors, however distinguished their station in life. I heard one of our Leaders say, last Sabbath, just after the breath had left a lovely son, about seven years old, ‘If I had no religion, my heart break; but now I pray I feel much better—my heart easy.’ May the Lord bless and save them!”

MUNCEY MISSION.

It is unnecessary to add much to the following comprehensive letter, from the Committee's excellent Missionary, the Rev. Peter Jones, respecting this, the largest and most important of the Society's Missions; and we shall only remark, that, during the year, there have been a Missionary, two School Teachers, and several Native Labourers employed for its benefit; that the members are increased in number, and their general sobriety, industry, piety, and liberality

are praiseworthy; and though there are Pagans on the Mission, it is believed they will, ere long, submit to the truth and power of the Bible. Resistance to both may remain for a time, but, as in a thousand other instances, Calvary's love will subdue it:—

“To the Corresponding Secretary of the Missionary Society of the Wes. Meth. Church.

“Muncey Mission, October 25th, 1843.

“REV. AND DEAR BROTHER,—I am happy to inform you that the Great Spirit is still with us on this Mission. Our religious services, in general, are lively and profitable, so that I have every reason to believe that the great majority of our members are growing in grace, as well as in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. They continue to evince their attachment to that blessed and holy religion, which came to them at the eleventh hour, by a regular attendance upon all the means of salvation; and a people thus devoted in the service of their God and Saviour must necessarily make some progress in the way to Heaven. I do not mean to say that the sun of prosperity shines upon them at all times. The adversary of souls, who ever goeth about seeking whom he may devour, attacks the Church in the wilderness, as well as the Church in the civilized world; and, I do assure you, that sometimes we have hard fightings within and without; but, through the grace of God, who giveth us the victory, we have been enabled to maintain our ground. The firewaters, and Pagan notions and practices, are the greatest evils amongst this people. Whenever any of them go out to the White settlements, they are beset by their White neighbours to take a *little drop* of the firewater. When the Indian shakes his head, and says “No,” the White man will then say, “O, a *little drop* wont hurt you! we are *Christians*, and we drink a little.” Too often the poor Indian is over-persuaded, and takes the *little drop*, which ends in a *great drop*; for all drop together, soul, body, and religion! I sometimes awfully fear that the *White Christian*, with his *little drop*, will not only cause the poor weak Indian to lose all dear to him, but will be the meaps of his own destruction, and cause his soul to drop into hell!

“I regret to say that too many of our hearers still retain the Pagan superstitions of their forefathers, fostered and cherished by the influence and example of a neighbouring Pagan tribe, who profess to be adherents of the Church of England, which greatly impede the work of God amongst them. We have been trying to pull out the bad weeds from their minds, by sowing the seeds of eternal life in their hearts; and, I am happy to say, that our labour has not altogether been in vain in the Lord.

“Our Indian camp-meetings held during the summer were seasons of great refreshing from the presence of the Lord: sinners were brought to weep and cry for mercy, backsliders were reclaimed, and the faithful people of God were quickened, and encouraged to persevere in the good way. I never saw such an overwhelming effusion of the spirit of love as I witnessed at the Oneida camp-meeting: such power in prayer, such faith in the promises of God, such child-like simplicity, and yet such lofty strains of adoration, I scarcely ever before heard. The whole of Sunday night was spent in prayer and praise, and it seemed as if heaven and earth had united, and the

Church in the wilderness were joined with the Saints in glory in singing the Song of Moses and the Lamb. It was, indeed, good to be there. During the past year, several happy deaths have taken place. To see a Christian Indian depart this life in the full triumph of faith is well calculated to cheer and encourage the Missionary in his arduous duties and labours amongst a people but recently brought from Pagan darkness to God's most marvellous light.

"The friends of the Indian race will also be glad to learn that the Christian Indians are making some progress towards *Civilization*. You will form some idea of the temporal condition of the Ojebways under our instruction, when you read the following inventory of their property, taken by our friend, Colonel Clench, by order of Government, in December last, viz., 60 log-houses, 20 log-stalles, 57 horses, 25 colts, several yoke of oxen, 22 milch cows, 40 young cattle, 200 swine, two waggons, several ploughs, six harrows, about 150 axes, about 200 hoes, four spades, two pick-axes, 15 log-chains, six scythes, seven sickles, one fanning-mill, one grindstone, one set of carpenters' tools, one set of blacksmiths' tools, 500 or 600 acres of land under cultivation, &c. Now, contrast this with what they were 15 years ago, when all they possessed they could carry upon their backs: you will at once see that the attempt to Christianize and Civilize them has not altogether failed. Facts are stubborn things, and speak for themselves.

"I am also happy to state, that two of our Oneida Indians have raised, during the past year, about 1,300 bushels of wheat, besides oats, Indian corn, potatoes, &c. Several other Indians raised good crops of wheat and other grain. Are these the Indians of whom it is said, "*they cannot be civilized?*" When I hear such sentiments as these uttered, the words of Lord Glenelg always cheer and comfort my heart. His Lordship, speaking of a certain despatch he had received, from one of our Colonial Governors, on the impossibility of civilizing and Christianizing the Indians, said to me, 'I cannot for a moment entertain the sentiments expressed in that despatch. Our forefathers, the ancient Britons, were once as barbarous as the North American Indians are; and as Christianity has made our nation what it is, surely it will do the same for the Indian tribes.'

"The number of members under our charge is 239 Indians and 9 Whites; total, 248. There have been, during the year, 32 removals and eight deaths. The School at Muncey has 38 scholars, and 33 at the Oneida School. We have a Sunday-School at Muncey, and Brother John Carey superintends one at his own house.

"The hewed log-chapel, intended for our Muncey brethren, is nearly completed, and will make a comfortable and substantial house. Our Muncey brothers have worked nobly at it, having done all the scoring, hewing, hauling, and raising it themselves; and are now plastering it.

"Our poor people have given to the utmost of their ability towards aiding the funds of the Missionary Society, in the handsome sum of £66 16s. 8½d.; and, considering the hardness of the times and the scarcity of money in these Western woods, it speaks well for the liberality of our Christian Indians.

"Let me now call upon all the friends of Christian Missions to con-

LAKE SIMCOE MISSION.

This Mission consists of an Indian village at *Rama*, and another near *Coldwater*, and several White settlements adjacent to *Lake Simcoe*. Lamentable is the temporal condition of the *Coldwater* tribe, as we have several years stated, and, unless it be alleviated, still more lamentable, the Committee fear, will be their religious condition. They regret to say, that during the year the School at *Rama* has been deprived of the valuable services of Miss Pinney, who has been compelled to suspend them by affliction, after being for many years a faithful labourer of the Society. There have been a Missionary, a Teacher, and two Interpreters employed on this Mission; the Temperance cause has been supported, and the number of members is 144; being an increase since last year. The Rev. Sylvester Hurlburt says:

“I find in *Rama* an increase of ten members above the number of last year. I can speak of the faithfulness of our people in attending to the means of grace—of industrious and temperate habits, increasingly so—of the increase of domestic comfort among our people—and of an increasing attachment, on their part, to the institutions of our Church. They are attached to us from principle—from a strong conviction of the efficiency of that form of Christianity which they received, some years ago, through the instrumentality of our Missionaries. The above remarks about faithfulness and industrious habits, &c., should be confined to the Indians in *Rama*, as the *Coldwater* Indians are certainly retrograding. This is a source of great grief to my mind; but I must tell the truth. I have not, however, neglected them, but have done all I could for them, visiting them and preaching to them once in two weeks—having missed but twice or thrice during the past year, when the ice was in such a state that it was impossible for me to get to them. This unfavourable or unprosperous state is owing, principally, to their situation. Having very little land at all fit for cultivation, they are necessarily obliged to wander about for a subsistence; this exposes them to numberless temptations, and, as a natural consequence, some have been overcome by intemperance. Yet the number is small, when all the circumstances of their situation are taken into the account.”

“One thing I cannot forbear to mention, which afforded me not a little satisfaction. A number of the Indians, not members of our Church at the present, subscribed and paid something for the support of the Missionary Society. To be sure the amount is not great, but it shows, more plainly than many words would do, their estimation of our efforts for their welfare.”

“I cannot report any increase of members among the White people, though there have been a few conversions. Some very strong prejudices have been removed in a good degree, and an appreciation of the efficiency of our itinerant Ministry, and the purity of our

motives, is now entertained. But I should not omit to notice something like a strong opposition from a certain quarter against everything not exactly in accordance with peculiar dogmas, held by those who claim to themselves an exclusive right to minister in holy things."

"I have three regular appointments in Oro, one in Medonte, one in Orillia, one in Rama, and one where the Coldwater Indians have located themselves. I preach occasionally to a few Whites at Coldwater, and some other places, besides my regular appointments, which I attend once in every two weeks."

SAHGEENG MISSION.

Several letters received from this Mission during the year show that its character for piety and consistency is established, and that, distant as it is, and therefore expensive, the Committee have reason to be thankful it was ever commenced. During part of the year, when the Indians were from home on account of a scantiness of provisions, the Missionary, the Rev. Thos. Williams, rendered valuable assistance to the Owen's Sound Mission. The School has been continued, and the number of members is 117. The remoteness of this Mission from White settlements is some security for its moral and religious preservation and happiness.

SNAKE ISLAND MISSION.

It is predicted that "the isles shall wait for God's law," and here is one which has received, and delights in it; and it is satisfactory to the Committee to know that this isolated and peaceful field of labour has been cultivated to greater fruitfulness by their Missionary, the Rev. Horace Dean, who states the following particulars:—

"My labours have been chiefly confined to the Island. I have occasionally preached in East and North Gwillimbury, and have twice, in the course of the year, visited the Balsam Lake Mission, for the purpose of administering the Sacraments to that portion of the Church of Christ. The number of members here is 57. Three Indians have been converted, (one a Roman Catholic.) The School is unsteady, and when all are at home there are 12 boys and 9 girls, with 5 who occasionally attend. Our Library consists of a few worn-out books. We have made a beginning in raising money for the Society, and the Indians say that they will do more next year. We expect a few families from Balsam Lake, and then the number here will be one hundred and forty souls. There have been 5 Marriages, 13 Births, and 2 Deaths this year on the Mission."

BALSAM LAKE MISSION.

The Indians on this Mission have evinced a commendable anxiety to hear the Word of God, and use all the means they have been favoured with; and the Missionary has had the pleasure of witnessing a correspondent growth in religious knowledge, and in grace. For many years they heard not the footsteps of a Messenger with "good

things ;" but at length they did, and now there are 48 members in our Church, nearly 30 children in the school, and all the tribe over twelve years of age are members of the Temperance Society.

MUD LAKE.

The Indians at this place form a little flock, and the number of the pious is therefore small, but still not forgotten by the Society. Wesleyan Ministers from Peterboro', and elsewhere, have, as regularly as possible, sought and fed this flock in the wilderness, and their visitations have been appreciated. This is one of the many instances of our Ministers going gladly to those who "want them most."

OWEN'S SOUND MISSION.

This remote Mission embraced, last year, an Indian settlement, and a number of scattered White settlements in the St. Vincent and adjoining townships, in charge of the Rev. John Neelands. A Teacher is employed among the Indians in keeping a Day and Sabbath School, which have been very useful. Several Sabbath Schools have been some time in operation among the destitute settlers, and many Prayer Meetings have been held ; and if in any part of the country a *plodding* zeal is required, it is here, where the Missionary has gone from "clearing" to clearing, through almost impassable roads, on foot, in preaching the Saviour of the lost. There are now 112 members in our Church—being 36 more than last year ; about 100 children in the schools, and nearly 150 Temperance members.

The statements now made are authentic and important, and possess an interest to every true patriot and christian. It has lately been very strangely and unexpectedly affirmed, that the attempt to Christianize the Indians of Canada "has failed everywhere." The only reply of the Committee to this imputation on the Society is, the *facts* they have just recorded. If *they* prove a failure, *what* proves success ?

DOMESTIC MISSIONS.

This is a field of patient discovery and Ministerial devotedness on which the Society has, during the year, bestowed much of its solicitude and expended a considerable amount of its funds ; and from which, as in the case of the Indian field of labour, there has been a repayment of gratitude, liberality, and christian success ; a return this which, to the praise of God be it said, has, in some degree, been made to the Society year after year since its establishment.

Its Missionaries,—who have counted the cost of long absences from home—tedious forest-journeys by every mode of conveyance, and in all weathers—accommodations inconvenient and unhealthy—perils many and unavoidable,—have, with a laudable and sacred object in

view, and with an invincible spirit and purpose, explored dense and destitute tracts of the colony, and found families without God, and settlements without the Gospel; and once discovered, these intrepid evangelical *explorers* have planted the banner of Salvation on the soil, with a hallowed ecstasy, surpassing that which convulsed the soul of Columbus when he planted the Spanish standard in the Western world.

This, more than any former one, has been a year of *special* exertion on all the Domestic Missions, and the result has been accordingly. Continuous services have been held, and a demonstrative truth and energy have accompanied public ministrations. Contrary to the expectations and wishes of a certain class of illiberal christian professors, the sacraments administered by the Society's Ministers have been acceptable, and honoured, and desired by an increasing number of the inhabitants; houses of worship have been erected; Sabbath Schools have been commenced; progression has favoured Temperance principles; households, atheistic in practice, have reared their altars to God; many adults and youths "have received the grace of God," and been added to our Church; and among other signs of much good having been accomplished is the thankfulness which they, and the inhabitants generally, express to the Society by which they have been sought, and solaced, and many saved, in their solitude.

The Committee may be permitted to direct attention to the process of *assimilation* which these cheering facts clearly place in view. These Missions are becoming Circuits in their privileges and resources. At first not one of their Missions could exist without a full supply of pecuniary means from the Society's funds; now they have not a Domestic Mission wholly dependent upon them. The people are rising, though slowly, above their poverty and privations, and the Gospel teaches them that they who have received "spiritual" things, should, when able, give of their "temporal" things. Canada, from the Atlantic to the Huron, was once a dark and desolate territory; but now how changed by the benevolence of Christians and the benediction of God! The Cross of Christ has thrown its radiance into the moral midnight, and its riches into the scene of helpless destitution, and around it should every thankful acclamation arise!

BARRIE MISSION.

The aspect of the work of God on this Mission is much changed within a few years, and at present is such as to encourage the Committee. The travelling is bad, and some of the journeys long, but they persevere, and the people everywhere receive our two Missionaries kindly; and, considering the failure in the most valuable of their crops, have this year, as heretofore, supported the cause ably. A strict adherence to rule has been observed, and devotional family

duties are very generally performed. Religious services are held by the Missionaries in eight townships; the number of members in our Church is large; several Sabbath Schools are in operation; and the Temperance department of moral melioration is well sustained. Thus, a long-neglected portion of our country is effectually cultivated.

GUELPH MISSION.

The Missionary writes,—“There are here 126 members. The average number of hearers is four hundred. We have one Sabbath School, numbering fifty scholars, the only one we have been able to establish as yet. In order to fill the appointments, the Missionary must travel 300 miles, sixty of them on foot in all seasons but winter.”

BROCK MISSION.

It is only necessary to say, that the two Missionaries placed here preach, each, nearly thirty times in a month, in eight or ten townships, for it to be seen how arduous is their labour; but it is not a labour without gracious effects, there having been, during the year, an addition of 68 members—encouragement in Sabbath School instruction—and a considerable extension of Total Abstinence principles; by which means the “desert” is made “glad.”

WARWICK AND ADELAIDE MISSION.

Much strength and patience has been needed by the Missionary here this year, who has been placed among a worthy people. In one settlement, it seems, a Minister of the “Succession” has been attempting to prevent the inhabitants from attending our services, and otherwise acting a most unseemly part; but, says our Missionary, “The Word of the Lord triumphed over all; for all *his* hearers who came out to hear the Word, by the blessing of God, were convinced of sin, and most of them found peace with God, through our Lord Jesus Christ, and joined our Society; and there is now a class there of twenty-three members! The people are chiefly English, and very poor. I have seen some of the mothers of families come out in winter to hear preaching, with their feet rolled in rags, and sometimes bare-footed, and the snow on the ground.” On this Mission there are about twenty appointments; Sabbath-School zeal is active; the Temperance cause is rising; and, by special efforts, the number of members in our Church has been raised from 82 to 137. The Committee’s hopes for this Mission last year have been pleasingly realised.

MARMORA MISSION.

So important did this Mission appear to the last Conference, that it was detached from the Sydney Circuit, and now has a Missionary altogether employed on it. It embraces ten or twelve preaching-

places, and there are as many classes, which have been "growing" in grace, and in the knowledge of Jesus Christ, and in numbers, during the year; principally through the use of extraordinary means.

ISLE OF TANTI MISSION.

The last Conference but one, anxious to multiply the Christian privileges of this Island, appointed a Missionary exclusively to it, and there have been additional services held, and other means tried, for the accomplishment of the object. The number of members is 48; and though the Conference has attached the Island again to the Bath Circuit, it is expected the arrangement will be advantageous.

WALPOLE MISSION.

This is one of those Missions which has rewarded the labourer for his perseverance in "well-doing," and where it is evident "God giveth the increase." The new church spoken of in the last Report has been well attended, as have been most of the places of worship. The Missionary has visited; zealous exertions have been made to give the Gospel greater acceptability and power; and the result is an addition of 33 members to our Church.

SCHOOGOG MISSION.

Last year the Committee, in stating the progress of the work on this Mission, among a destitute but grateful people, said, "They cannot spare the cup of life." Having drank of it again, since then, their Missionary says:—

"This Mission includes only two Townships at present, Cartwright and Manvers. In travelling through them, I fill, every two weeks, nine regular and two occasional appointments, exclusive of performing other duties. The Sabbath congregations average from 30 to 50 persons; the week-days, from 20 to 30. Last year's return was 63 members; this year's is 144. New applications have recently been made by settlers, who say, 'Come over and help us.'"

ASPHODEL MISSION.

This sequestered Mission, formed a year ago, of distant parts of the Murray and Peterboro' Circuits, and containing six Townships, making an extent of country fifty miles long, we are grateful to report, is prosperous. One Missionary was appointed to it, but, early in the year, another was sent to his assistance; who have each 24 appointments in a month, and the worst roads to travel to them. The Missionary in charge says, that "nearly all the classes are in a flourishing state," and the Sabbath congregations average about "a hundred" hearers each. The result of revivals at several places, during the

year, is about a hundred new members; and the pious settlers are praying for fresh outpourings of the Spirit.

PEMBROKE MISSION.

Of this Mission, which lies 150 miles up the Ottawa, several particulars, stated in a letter from the Missionary, will be acceptable. He preaches at ten places, and has 75 members in Society. To the Temperance pledge 85 signatures have been obtained. He has succeeded in finishing the Mission-house, and the simple furniture it contains was most of it made by him. The land, amounting to ten acres, is the gift of Mr. Samuel Adams; half for a church, towards which £100 has been subscribed. The Mission has sent in a subscription of £11 for the Society, besides its raisings for the family of the Missionary; and the Word of God having "run" and been "glorified," 30 persons have joined our Church. Brother Tuke says, "Our way of travelling this Mission is in a birch-bark canoe, and on foot; and the Macedonian cry sounds from two other places we propose visiting soon." This good news from the distant banks of the majestic Ottawa.

MISSIONS IN SEVERAL DISTRICTS.

Besides the Missions already noticed, there are others, or Circuits with parts of them of a really Missionary character, which receive appropriations from the funds of the Society; as these,—*Clarendon, Plantagenet, St. Andrews, Gananoque, Gosfield and Howard*. On these the Missionaries have the most trying labours to perform, and hardships to endure; and they require much of the spirit of apostolic self-denial and fortitude. The Committee rejoice to say, that on all these Missions there have been revivals of pure religion this year; that hundreds of members have been added to the Church; that a number of Sabbath-Schools have been commenced; that Divine service has been held at new places, in remote settlements; that the Temperance Reformation has extended; that other settlements are asking for the Gospel; that, everywhere, their Missionaries are received by a thankful people, who hear the Word with joy; and whose individual, domestic, and social morality, peace, and happiness are very extensively promoted and secured by the continued services and support of the Society.

Thus does this Missionary Society pursue sinful, but redeemed men, to the farthest and most secluded abodes of our Canadian wilds, and there utter an evangelical and impressive voice for the instruction of the ignorant; and stretch the hand of Christian benevolence to supply their spiritual destitution; that, by such acts, the entire population may learn the will of God, and be saved by the melting and hallowing power of "the glorious Gospel of Christ."

CONCLUSION.

To the God of wisdom and compassion, who hath commenced, carried on, and will consummate in Canada and elsewhere the exalted work of Missionary enterprise and charity, by the manifestations of his munificent mercy, be ascribed the praise, and the glory, for ever!

To the numerous friends of the Society,—whether the Chairmen or Speakers at the Public Meetings, the Ministers forming the Deputations, the Officers of the Circuit Branch Societies, especially the Ladies who were Collectors, or the generous Subscribers,—of our Church or of others, the thanks of the Committee are cordially presented. Dr. John Campbell thus speaks to their honour:—"The question of Missions, like every other appertaining to Religion and the Kingdom of Christ, is now more clearly understood than in the days of Johnson; and that which 'nations' had failed to do, *voluntary confederacies* of believers are energetically and successfully accomplishing."

The later publication of the Report, this year, by direction of the Conference, affords the Committee a painful opportunity of recording the recent death of the Rev. GEORGE MORLEY, for half a century a respectable and useful Minister of the English Conference, and once its President, among whose last words were these:—"I gave myself to God, and to God's people, three-score years ago; and He has never left me. He is with me now." His highest eulogy is this—"he was the originator of the Wesleyan Missionary Society in its present form of home operations." This was in 1813, when, in the month of October, the first Methodist Missionary Meeting was held, in Leeds, and Mr. Watson delivered his lofty sermon from "Come from the four winds, O breath, and breathe upon these slain, that they may live." Prior to this period Dr. Coke—who crossed the Atlantic eighteen times on errands of love for souls, and whose very life-blood was Missionary—had done much for foreign lands; and since then the plan which a Morley's benevolent skill devised, has, by a potency unparalleled since Apostolic times, blessed all the countries of our globe.

Having briefly reviewed the past, the Committee would earnestly direct attention to the future. And their first and deepest conviction is, *the vanity of human effort without Divine influence*; and feeling this, they gladly turn to the inspiring declaration of the Saviour,— "And I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter, that he may abide with you forever." By this Spirit, shortly after the ascension of Christ, there was an unexampled Pentecostal occasion; by this Spirit there have been since, though limited, many such occasions; and, by the same Spirit, Christendom can and will be made Pentecostal in her ministrations, love, labours, and achievements. The Saviour had said to his Apostles, "Behold, I send the promise of my Father upon you: but tarry ye in the city of Jerusalem, until ye be endued with power from on high." This command had a local, but has now a universal application to God's people; and they are obedient only when they "tarry" in the spirit of prayer and confidence breathed by the Apostles; and it is imperatively required of them that they tarry in importunate and believing prayer and inter-

cession, in the public temple for worship, in the family sanctuary, and in the consecrated closet,—that “THE KINGDOM” may come.

Another conviction of the Committee is,—*the necessity of continued liberality to sustain and increase the Society's Missions.* There has been evinced by its supporters a very praiseworthy spirit of sympathy and generosity. *Persevere* in well-doing: and it would greatly aid the funds were subscribers in arrears to pay their promised subscriptions. It may be necessary for the supporters of the Society to exercise the grace of self-denial to prevent a *reduction* of their annual subscriptions. Let there be *plan* in giving, and an *impulse* from heaven sought to execute it promptly. We most earnestly recommend the wide circulation of this Report, that the public may become acquainted with the important operations of the Society; and a large attendance everywhere at the Missionary Anniversaries, where its claims are stated and pleaded. We have the remedy of man's moral maladies, purchased and provided by Infinite love, and every Christian is awfully responsible to God for its publication and its application. It will be seen we quote the language of eminent Missionary advocates in this Report, and it is done that the experience and authority of such lovers of souls may have weight with our friends: and here the lamented Lessey shall address them: “Where do you derive your name from? Not from *Mammon*, the god of this world. Oh, no! this you have renounced. You derive your name from the Man of Calvary. You derive your name from the bleeding Saviour upon the Cross. I ask nothing more than a remembrance of the name of Him who wept over a benighted world. EXERT YOURSELVES, then, to sound the name of your Redeemer to earth's remotest bounds.”

The Committee make not a *party* appeal for continued support.—They have an unspeakable joy in stating and pressing the Missionary claims of a Church, which is *one* in affection, prayer, and aim with other Christian Churches, whose magnificent and merciful design is to diffuse to the boundaries of the earth the needed, salutary, and regenerating influences of Christianity, and bring all crowns to the feet of Christ. They live, and act, and are successful, under the sway of a sceptre as benignant and wise as it is British and illustrious; and grateful for the religious and civil freedom they possess in Canada, while they present the just claims of their own Society, heartily pray that an ample and perpetual prosperity may follow the activities of *all* Christian Missionary Societies!

For encouragement in such activities to our own Society, the glorious and endless spiritual *result* should be constantly contemplated. God has made it a duty to send “the Gospel to every creature;” and He will, when his people have terminated their earthly service, say unto them, “Well done, good and faithful servants.” When that forcible pleader for the conversion of the world, Andrew Fuller, was preaching in Leeds for the Baptist Missions, and was expatiating on the perpetuity of the benefits of the work, he asked, in an impassioned manner, “Where will it *end*?” William Dawson—with his large Missionary soul swelling within him—answered aloud, “In *heaven!*”

In closing these remarks, the Committee again confide to the care and benevolence of the valued contributors to the Society, 1. The

INDIAN MISSIONS.—Though hundreds of the Natives resident on them have partaken of the advantages of Christian and civilized life, their improvement is not yet complete. On some Missions are to be found Pagans whose prejudices are yet unconquered. Adults and children need instruction and grace. Their ignorance of the truth calls for the solicitude and gifts of the philanthropic; and their proverbial loyalty to their great and good Royal “Mother” should win the admiration of the patriotic. The disabilities and temporal losses they are *still* subject to, on account of the non-settlement of their land affairs, and other causes, which are too evident from the survey of the Missions we have taken, should excite our sympathy, and secure our help. Were we addressing White men who trample on the rights and wishes of Red men, and even on the dust of their dead with contempt, we should with reprobation say to them,—

“Your mountains build their monument,
Though ye destroy their dust.”

2. The DOMESTIC MISSIONS.—Though they have increased in number and importance, there are not a few newly-settled portions of Canada where other Missions should be immediately established. Missionaries, Churches, and School-houses, therefore, are wanted. The destitute are dying. Who will bestow upon them the Gospel, ere they depart? Brotherhood should answer, if not Christian charity; but both ought to fly to their relief. Emigration is flowing: and that charity should flow too. While the Government, and individuals, are actively rendering considerable temporal service to new settlers, should members of the Church of Christ be idle? A fine-spirited minister of the Church of England, the Rev. J. W. Cunningham, A.M., of Islington, thus beautifully addresses them:—“It seems to me, that you must extend your affections; that you must widen the circle of your love; that you must feel that God’s family is larger than you have thought; that you must learn, under His grace, to cherish an interest for those in whom God feels an interest.”

And now for renewed and unwearied dedication of influence and property to the Missionary Society of the Wesleyan-Methodist Church in Canada, prompted by the undeniable and irresistible claims of *God’s unutterable love to us*,—of which Dr. Harris, in his “Great Commission,” thus eloquently speaks:—“It claims the infant heart, by looking at it through the eyes, and caressing it in the tones, of maternal love. The father’s authority—the sister’s entreaty—the brother’s warning—the servant’s fidelity—the tradesman’s integrity and weight of character—the persuasions of friendship—the active attention of neighbourly kindness—the disinterested benevolence of public life—the powerful influence of righteous government—*it wants them all*, has work for them all. And even if it had them, the kindest tones cannot equal the tenderness of its entreaties; the hottest tears cannot express its anguish over HUMAN MISERY; the most throbbing heart cannot beat quick enough to satisfy its eager longing for HUMAN SALVATION; all the influence which collective man could wield in its behalf, could not do justice to its free, and full, and gushing benevolence—could not furnish channels wide and deep enough to pour forth the ocean-fulness of its grace.”
