REGULATIONS.

This meeting of the Association will be conducted under the direction of the Range Officer, and in the conduct of the meeting the Regulations of the Dondnion of Canada Rifle Association of 1887 will be strictly observed. The attention of competitors is directed to the following particulars:

DRESS,—In competitions restricted to active militiamen, or in which they shoot as such, the full or undress uniform of their corps shall be worn. Whist or cross belts need not be worn. In competitions not restricted to the active militia, competitors must appear either in uniform as above, or wholly in plain clothes. Any objection to a competitor's dress must be raised before he takes up his position to shoot.

RIFLES.—All competitors must use the Short Snider Enfield Rifle, of Government issue or of Government pattern, with a minimum pall of trigger of 6 lbs. No two competitors shall shoot in any competition (except in the Any rifle and Martini matches) with the same rifle. The sights may be temporarily blackened or whitened, and no shading of sights will be permitted. Any Rifles—minimum pall of trigger to be 3 lbs., with any description of sights except telescopic and magnifying.

AMMUNITION.—In competitions restricted to "Snider Rifles" none but Government ammunition will be used, which may be obtained on the Range; price 50 cents per 25 rounds.

POSITION.—At 200 yards, standing or kneeling, except where otherwise specified. At all other ranges, any position with the head to the target.

When at the firing points competitors must comply with all orders given by the Range Officer.

Certificates of efficiency for 1887-88 signed by their commanding officer must be produced by members of the Militia when entering for competition No. 11.

Any disputes will be decided by the Council, five of whom shall form a quorum. Any competitor disputing or refusing to comply with their decision shall be debated from further competition at this meeting, and shall forfeit any entrance fee he may have paid.

Any competitor challenging a shot must deposit the sum of \$1 with the Range Officer, which shall be forfeited if the Marker's signal is found to be correct.

It shall be the duty of the Range-Officer to test the Rifles of 'all prize winners. Competitors must submit their Rifles and Ammunition for inspection when required.

A cap cover with or without a cap under it will be permitted in matches restricted to the Active Militia.

No entries will be accepted for any competition after the firing of such competition has commenced.

No sighting shots will be allowed.

Officers, non-commissioned officers and men of the Royal Navy and Royal marines, being members of the Association, will be allowed to compete in matches open to members of the Association and may procure Suider Rifles on the Range, as may also others who desire to compete.

Any person may become a member of the Association on payment of \$1 to the Secretary. Life membership, \$10.

The Council reserves the right to make any change in this Prize list or in the above regulations, that may be found necessary, but due notice of any change will be posted on the notice board.
