# PREFACE.

In presenting the "Gazetteer and Directory of the County of Perth" to the public, the compilers wish to state that their object, which they hope they have attained, is to provide a work which will prove not only useful, but interesting, and that every exertion in their power has been made to render it full, complete and reliable ; and though, from the variety of sources from which the necessary information was obtained, and the impossibility of avoiding all mistakes in a work of this nature, inaccuracies will be found, particularly in the orthography of proper names, the publishers trust that as few errors will be discovered in this work as in any of a similar character, and that it will deserve the approbation of its Patrons.

We deem it our duty to return our sincere thanks to those who have so liberally aided the undertaking, by providing us with valuable information, as well as in a pecuniary sense. We are particularly indebted to the editors of the several papers in the County.

THE HURON TRACT was originally the property of the Canada Company, and comprised the townships of Colborne, Goderich, Hullet, McKillop, Logan, Ellice, North and South Easthope, Downie, Fullarton, Hibbert, Tuckersmith, Stanley, Hay, Stephen, Usborne, Blanshard, Biddulph, McGillivray, Williams and Bosanquet. Williams was afterwards added to the London, and Bosanquet to the Western District.

The Canada Company was originally formed through the exertions of John Galt, the celebrated Author. In the year 1825, Lieut-Col. Francis Cockburn, Simon McGillivray, Col. Sir John Harvey, John Galt, and John Davidson, were appointed Commissioners to value the lands intended to be sold by the Imperial Government to the Canada Company; and in 1827 the Huron Tract was explored. In 1829, in the whole Huron Tract there were only three miserable log huts, and two unfinished frame houses, intended for the reception of emigrants, no road, with the exception of a narrow track through the woods, through which the sun was not visible owing to the overhanging trees; the population at this period consisted of only three families. In 1882, the town and township of Goderich contained a little over three hundred inhabitants, and a post ran once a fortnight between Goderich and Guelph.

The total number of acres contracted for with the Government by the Company was 2,494,413; the average cost, including the Huron Tract, was 2s. 10<sup>3</sup>d. per acre. The Huron Tract was declared a District as the "Huron District" in 1842, previous to which it formed a part of the London District, and comprised the townships of Ashfield, Biddulph, Blanshard, Colborne, Downie, Ellice, Easthope (North and South), Fullarton, Goderich, Hibbert, Hay, Hullet, Logan, McKillop, McGillivray, Stephen, Stanley, Tuckersmith, Usborne and Wawanosh ---the last named was the property of the Crown.

At a subsequent period the Counties of Perth, Huron and Bruce were united for judicial and electoral purposes; but they are now separated—Huron and Bruce forming one constituency. Perth is represented in the Legislative Assembly by Robert McFarlane, Eso.

- The County of Perth is bounded north by the County of Wellington, east by Wellington and Waterloo; west by Huron, and south by Middlesex and Oxford. It contains fifteen municipalities : the towns of Stratford and St. Marys; the villages of Mitchell and Listowel; the townships of Blanshard, Downie, Ellice, Elma, Fullarton, Hibbert, Logan, Mornington, North Easthope, South Easthope, and Wallace.

ROCTRSA

The soil of this county is greatly diversified, but generally of good quality, the surface level, and the farms well improved. The "Great Swamp" encroaches on the townships of Logan and Ellice. In this Swamp the rivers Maitland, Saugeen, Thames, Bayfield, and Grand take their rise. The Canada Company received 100,000 acres of land as compensation for any loss they might sustain from the swamp forming part of their purchase. The timber is principally hardwood. The county is well watered by the Avon, Thames, and numerous smaller streams, several of which supply ample water power for manufacturing purposes.

The Grand Trunk and the Buffalo and Lake Huron Railways intersect the county. There are also several good gravelled roads, thus affording every facility for the transportation of merchandise to the eastern and western markets.

COUNTY OF PERTH.—Area, 446,728 acres, or 698 square miles The township of Blanshard contains 49,259 acres; Downie and Gore, 40,995; Easthope, North, 43,691; Easthope, South. 24,683; Ellice, 17,500; Mornington, 50,724; Follarton, 41,057; Hibbert, 41,476; Logan, Elma and Wallace, 137,403.

Population of the county, census of 1862, 38,083.

PUBLIC ROADS.—Huron Gravel Road, length 33 miles; Stratford and St. Marys Road, length 12 miles; Zorra Gravel Road, length 4; miles, Stratford and Northern Gravel Road, to Milhank, length 17 miles; Logan and Elma Gravel Road, length 16 miles; St. Marys and Mitchell Gravel Road, length 18 miles; London Proof Line Junction Gravel Road, length 18 miles; London Proof Line Junction Gravel Road, Moodstock and Huron, length 38 miles.

In terms of the recently adopted Confederation Bill, the County of Perth now consists of two Ridings or Electoral Divisions, numbered respectively fifty-seven and fifty-eight. The North Riding consists of the townships of Wallace, Elma, Logan, Ellice, Mornington, and North Easthope, and the Town of Stratford.

The South Riding consists of the townships of Blanshard, Downie, South Easthope, Fullarton, Hibbert, and the towns of Mitchell and St. Marys.

REVENUE.—Collected under the year's rates, \$67,687; revenue from Government on account of administration of justice, \$2,549; other revenues, \$24,290.

EXPENDITURE.—Interest paid on debentures, \$9,638; for educational purposes, \$7,185; salaries and 'other expenses of Municipal Government, \$14,555; expenses on account of administration of justice, \$7,795; on all other accounts, \$24,910.

### LISTOWEL.

An important incorporated village situated on the town line between the townships of Elma and Wallace, and on the Maitland River, thirty-three miles from Stratford, and twenty-two from Mitchell. The village site was laid out in 1854 by John Grant, P. L. S. and the first lot was purchased by W. H. Hacking, the present P. M., who opened the first general store in 1856. Messrs. D. D. and W. G. Hay, A. N. Poland, D. D. Campbell, Charles Dodd, and James Barber, were among the earliest settlers. The post office (money order) was established June, 1856. The village contains four churches, Episcopal, Rev. A. E. Miller; Congregational, Rev. W. W. Smith, Canada Presbyterian, Rev. R. Renwick, and Methodist, Revds. Messrs. Brown and Perry; two schools, averaging 150 pupils, Benjamin Rathwell and Miss Patterson, teachers.

Listowel possesses excellent facilities for manufacturing purposes, there being an ample supply of water power. At present it contains two mills, a woollen, factory, a foundry, two tanneries, two asheries, cabinet and agricultural works, and a number of mechanics' shops. There are also in the village nine general stores, six hotels, two drug stores, two bakeries, two photograph galleries, and several other establishments, which, by reference to the subjoined list of names, will give a good idea of the prosperty and professional, manufacturing, and mercantile standing of this rising town.

The "Banner," a well conducted and influential weekly paper is published by Messrs, Hacking & Hay.

Beattie, and Methodist, Revds. A. Milligan and Cookman; a flouring mill and foundry, and a saw mill.

#### VILLAGE OF MITCHELL.

### MITCHELL.

This important and flourishing village is situated in the townships of Fullarton and Logan, and on the line of the Buffalo and Lake Huron Railway; 32 miles east of Goderich, 103 west of Toronto, 128 from Buffalo, and 12 miles from Stratford, the county town. One great drawback is the want of sufficient water power for the various manufacturing establishments which are in the village. The river Thames runs through the place, but only at certain seasons of the year is it of much benefit to the village.

The village plot consisted originally of 400 acres, owned and laid out by the Canada Company. Mitchell was incorporated as a village by special Act of Parliament, on the 10th day of June, 1857, which makes it to consist of four thousand acres, as follows : Lots numbered eleven, twelve, thirteen, fourteen fifteen, sixteen, seventeen, eighteen, nineteen and twenty, in the first and second concessions of the township of Logan, and of lots numbered twenty-one, twenty-two, twentythree, twenty-four, twenty-five, twenty-six, twenty-seven, twentyeight, twenty-nine and thirty, in the first and second concessions of the township of Fullarton, but the limits have since been contracted.

The first sale of lots took place in 1836. During the same year, John Hicks, Esq., who was the first settler, pitched his tent on the spot where the old Mitchell Hotel now stands, in October. In June, 1837, Mr. Hicks completed the building now on the corner of Ontario and St. George streets; it is built of frame, two stories high, and 40 feet wide "by 60 feet in length; a barn of the same dimensions was erected on the premises. In 1857 the same gentleman erected a firstclass hotel building on Ontario street, three stories, high, with a large hall, substantially built of brick, and known as the "Commercial Hotel," one of the largest and best conducted houses in the county. The next pioneer in this section of the country was Mr. Daniel Kerr, who settled here about the last of November, 1842. The first store was opened in September, 1844, by W. F. McCulloch, Esq., of Stratford, in the old log building which stood a few yards east of the Commercial Hotel. Messrs, Daly & Mickle succeeded Mr. McCulloch in 1847. The second store was opened by Wm. Matheson, who commenced business in Nov., 1844, and continued in business about two years. He was succeeded by Edward Greensides, now of Monkton, in this county, and who remained in the mercantile business two years. About this time, say 1848, Mr. James Hill was the only merchant doing business in Mitchell. A short time after, Messrs. Fishleigh & Babb opened a store to the west of where Larkworthy's Hotel now stands.

Mitchell possesses many striking advantages over towns making

greater pretensions. There are good gravel roads leading into Mitchell that afford excellent facilities to the farmers in every direction for the bringing of grain and produce to market. Equally as high prices are paid here for agricultural produce as at any other point on the Buffalo and Lake Huron Railway. The gravel road from the north being thirty miles in length, intersects the townships of Logan, Elma and Wallace, to the boundary line of the township of Minto, in the County of Wellington; thus it will be seen that the trade from the eastern townships in the County of Bruce, the eastern townships of the County of Huron, and the western townships of the County of Perth, must become tributary to Mitchell through the means of this direct route-the Mitchell and Elma gravel road. From the south there are two gravel roads leading into Mitchell, the one from St. Mary's to Mitchell, and from the London road at Exeter by the Thames road to Mitchell. East and west it is intersected by the Huron gravel road and the Buffalo and Lake Huron Railway. Ten years since the population scarcely reached 250; now it is about sixteeen hundred, and rapidly on the increase.

The principal manufactures of Mitchell consists of one foundry, two flouring mills, an oatmeal mill, a carding and fulling mill, tanneries, chair factory, and two sawmills in the village, and the other various branches of industry are well represented. We refer to the subjoined lists for further information on this subject:

Mitchell contains seven churches—Episcopal, Rev. H. Caulfield; Presbyterian; Roman Catholic; Wesleyan Methodist, Rev. T. S. Howard; Primitive Methodist, Rev. W. Cook; Bible Christian, Rev. Thomas Roach; and Lutheran. The Central School, three departments, averages about two hundred and fifty pupils, J. W. Dunsmore, principal, Misses C. H. Elder and C. McIntyre, assistant teachers.

The Mitchell Advocate, a conservative journal, established in 1860 by the Messrs. Davis, is the only paper published here. It is ably conducted by Mr. W. R. Davis, and the present circulation exceeds sixteen hundred copies. The *Reformer*, a rival journal, was started some time since by a joint stock company, but the enterprise was not a successful one.

The contract has been let for the erection of a beautiful and well laid out market house. The site is well suited for the purpose, commanding, as it does, a view from all parts of the village. The village, financially speaking, is in good circumstances, and taxes are consequently low. The place affords a rare opportunity to parties wishing to go into business of almost any kind.

MITCHELL MILLS, Flouring, F. Hollands.—This extensive establishment was the first manufactory erected in Mitchell. The present proprietor purchased it about five years ago, and at great expense and labor has made it a first class establishment, capable of manufactu-
ring 30,000 barrels per annum. The power is steam and water, the engine forty horse. Eight hands are constantly employed.

ST. GEORGE'S FLOUR AND GRIST MILLS, Henry Bricker.--Steam engine thirty horse power, three run of stones, and employ four hands. Mr. Bricker is also proprietor of a large steam saw mill.

MITCHELL OAT MEAL MILLS, Walter Thompson.—Steam engine twenty horse power; two run of stones; employ five hands; manufacturing capacity; forty barrels a-day.

PERTH IRON WORKS, Robert Thompson. This is one of the most extensive establishments west of Hamilton. The motive power is steam, the engine sixteen horse. Thirty workmen are employed. Threshing and sawing machines, steam engines, mill gearing, brass and iron castings, and agricultural implements of every description, are manufactured.

MITCHELL TANNERY, John Aiken.—Manufactures about 800 hides annually.

SILL'S SAW MILL, G. F. & J. Sills.—Steam engine fifteen horse. Employs seven hands.

MITCHELL CHAIR FACTORY. Steam engine, eight horse. Employs ten hands, and manufactures furniture to the value of \$8000 annually.

It was settled in 1840 by John Sebring, and the post office was established in 1853, P. A. Sebring, first P. M. The Black Creek runs through the village, and affords excellent hydraulic facilities. The village contains two churches, Evangelical Association, Rev. Solomon Weaver, and Luthern, Rev, J. A. Hengerer; two flouring mills, a saw milf, vinegar factory, and several mechanics' shops. This place is rapidly increasing in importance.

A post village, situated on lot No. 38, fourth concession township of Wallace, forty miles from Stratford and six from Listowel. The river Maitland runs through the village. The post-office was established in 1858, Edward Bristow first P.M. The village contains two churches --Episcopal, Rev. A. E. Miller, pastor; and Lutheran, Rev. F. Dupernelle; a common school averaging 35 pupils, Miss T. S. Young, teacher, and a private school, Rev. F. Dupernelle, teacher.

#### STAFFA.

A post village situated on lot number 16, 9th concession township of Hibbert, twenty-two miles from Stratford, and five from Carronbrook. It was settled in 1859 by Charles Tuffin, and the post office was established in 1862, Thomas Dunn, first P. M. The village contains a Wesleyan Church, Rev. Mr. Howard, pastor, and a steam flouring mill. There are good facilities here for a carding, mill and tannery. The surrounding country is not surpassed by any other part of the county as an agricultural district.

#### STRATFORD.

The County Town of Perth, is situated on the river Avon, and at the corners of the townships of Ellice, North and South Easthope and Downie. (It was first settled in 1832, and was known as Little Thames, owing to a branch of that river passing through it. The name of the river was afterwards changed to Avon, and that of the village to Stratford, in honor of the birth place of the immortal bard. The wards of the town are named Avon, Falstaff, Hamlet, Romeo, and Shakspearc.) The Grand Trunk and the Buffalo and Lake Huron Railways cross each other here, thus giving the town railway facilities equal to those of any place in the Province. It is situated in the midst of a fine agricultural country, has an excellent trade, and is in every respect a flourishing town.

Distant from Toronto, 89 miles; from Sarnia, 80 miles; London, by rail, 39 miles; and from Goderich, 45 miles.

(In 1827 the Canada Company purchased the "Huron Block," a triangular tract, "commencing with the east limits of the townships of North and South Easthope, towards Lake Huron, where the western

limits of the triangle extended from and inclusive of the township of Bosanquet, to and including the township of Colborne." These lands were then in the possession of the Indians, and it was not until the year 1833 that the first white settler of what is now the County of Perth took up his abode in the township of Downie.]

Previous to the year 1840 the site of Mitchell was known as the "Big Thames," and that of Stratford the "Little Thames." (The plots of these villages were reserved and laid out by the Company, that of Stratford containing about two thousand five hundred acres. In 1833 Messrs. D. Ford and John Sebring erected the first saw-mill for the Canada Company at "Little Falls," and in the following year the same parties built the flouring and grist mill for the same company. Messrs. Linton, Sebastian Fryfogle, Andrew Sebach, Henry Rumstaller and William Seargeant, were the earliest settlers in the village and its vicinity. The first stores in Stratford were owned by Messrs. George Worsley and John Monteith. Mr. John C. W. Daly was the first postmaster. In 1839 Mr. John Gowanlock opened another store.

In 1832 the present counties of Huron, Perh and Bruce were called the London District, and London was the district town. In 1838 the District and County of Huron were formed, Goderich being the county town. The population was then 4000. In 1847 Mr. Linton, at present Clerk of the Peace for the county, was delegated to Montreal, by the inhabitants of Stratford and neighborhood, to have certain townships separated from the county of Huron and formed into a separate district and county. The district then contained a population of 10,000. In the following year Mr. Linton succeeded in his mission, and had the honor of paming the county, with Stratford as the county town. The name "Perth" was given in respect of the first settlers in North Easthope, who were from Glengwaich, Perthshire, Scotland. This "honor" was the only reward Mr. Linton received for his services.

In 1852 the county buildings in Stratford were completed. They consist of the Court House and Gaol, built of brick, on a plot granted by W. F. McCulloch, Esq. In 1853 the county was set apart by proclamation. The village was incorporated January, 1854. The population at that date was 1400. The town was incorporated by act of Parliament in 1858, when the population had increased to about 2,500. By the census of 1861 the population of Stratford was 2,800; in 1867 it may be estimated at about 4000.

A reference to the subjoined list of residents will give a good idea of the professional, mercantile and manufacturing standing of the town.

KASTNERVILLE BREWERV AND DISTILLERY, Kastnerville, P. Kastner & Co.,—Built of brick and stone; steam, two engines of 12 and 20 horse power, employ six hands.

STRATFORD AGRICULTURAL WORKS, Joseph Sharman, established 20 years—Steam, engine 12 horse power, employ 15 hands; manufacture agricultural implements of all kinds.

STRATFORD SCUTCHING MILL, T. D. Hall & Co., established three years—Steam, engine 26 horse power, employs 10 hands; capacity, 200 pounds long line a day. There are at present about one hundred acres appropriated to flax culture in the neighborhood, and the quantity is increasing. This establishment employs about fifty hands during the rotting season.

STRATFORD MILLS, FLOURING, Adam Argo, established 32 years— Steam and water, engine 40 horse, employ 10 hands; capacity, 130 barrels a day, exclusive of gristing.

STRATFORD TANNERY, Alex. Smith, employs four hands; capacity, 1,000 hides annually, water power. The proprietor, intends introducing steam power.

STRATFORD CHAIR AND FURNITURE FACTORY, Inman Brothers-Steam power, engine 8 horse, employs 12 hands. All kinds of furniture manufactured to the annual value of \$12,000.

STRATFORD CARRIAGE FACTORY, Huron street, Miller brothers-Agricultural implements, ploughs; patentees of the patent steel plough mould.

Nichol, teacher'; a steam saw mill, and several mechanics' shops.

#### ST. MARYS.

This flourishing town is situated on the north-west branch of the river Thames, at its confluence with Trout Creek, and at the junction of the London branch of the Grand Trunk Railway with the Sarnia line; from Stratford 12 miles, from London 21, from Sarnia 70, and from Toronto 99. A part of the town plot, consisting of 400 acres, was purchased from the Canada Company by the Messrs. Ingersoll. The village was incorporated in 1855, previous to which date it was known as Little Falls. In 1840 the Messrs. Ingersoll built a saw mill, and, in the year following, a flouring mill. The first store was opened the same year by Mr. John Ingersoll.

The Grand Trunk Railway Company have two splendid viaducts . here, built of stone and tabular iron; the one on the London and St. Marys' branch crossing Trout Creek and its valley, is about 800 feet long, supported by eleven piers, sixty-six feet apart and sixty-six feet high; the other is on the Sarnia branch, and spans the Thames. It is placed on nine piers, supported by pillars forty feet high and sixty-six feet apart. These bridges cost upwards of \$200,000.

In the immediate vicinity of the town there are quarries of excellent limestone, and several of the buildings, public and private, are erected of this material. The following list will give a good idea of the business of the town:

#### FLOURING MILLS.

ST. MARYS MILL.--W. V. Hutton, proprietor, Queen street; built of stone; four run of stone; capacity, 325,000 barrels per annum, besides gristing, which averages yearly 47,000 bushels. The annual business is estimated at \$85,000.

MOORE'S STEAM FLOURING AND GRIST MILL-John Moore, proprietor, Wellington street, recently erected. It contains four run of stones; the engine is of 35 horse power, the machinery complete. Six hands are constantly employed.

SIMPSON'S MILL—South Water street; water power; four run of stones, capacity 100 barrels a-day; business, \$100,000 annually.

LAKESIDE BRANCH MILL-Wm. Garner; two run of stones; capacity, about 300 barrels a-week.

GLENGOWAN MILL-A. Nicol; situated three miles from the town, on the river Thames. It does a large and increasing business.

#### IRON FOUNDRIES.

MOORE'S FOUNDRY AND MACHINE WORKS-John Moore, Wellington street; agricultural implements, stoves, mill gearing, ploughs, &c.; employs twenty hands, manufacturing to the value of \$12,000 annually.

ST. MARVS FOUNDRY-W. & T. Haggert, Queen street; employs twenty hands; agricultural implements, threshing machines, fanning mills, stoves, &c. The business of this extensive establishment is valued at \$20,000 a year.

ADAIR'S AGRICULTURAL IMPLEMENT WORKS-J. Adair, Wellington street. This establishment manufactures articles of superior quality; the ploughs, harrows, &c., of this factory have obtained several prizes.

#### CARRIAGE FACTORIES.

ST. MARVS' CARRIAGE WORKS.-D. Miller, Church Street. All kinds of Carriages, Waggons, &c., manufactured; employing twelve hands. Annual value of work manufactured, \$20,000.

MCCORMACK'S CARRIAGE WORKS.—Wellington street. This is the oldest establishment of the kind in the town, and is doing an extensive business.

MCLARTY'S CARRIAGE AND WAGGON FACTORY.-D. MCLARTY, Wellington street. A number of hands constantly employed, and a large business done.

#### WOOLLEN FACTORIES.

HARRISON'S WOOLLEN MILL.—John Harrison, Church street, Steam : Employs fifteen hands, and turns out about 700 yards of cloth weekly, in addition to large custom, carding and fulling business. The factory

is capable of manufacturing 30,000 pounds of wool a year. It contains a fulling mill, four power looms, and several carding, shearing, and other machines. Business, \$25,000 a year.

MCINTOSH'S WOOLLEN FACTORY.—Gilbert McIntosh, Thames Avenue. This is the oldest establishment of the kind in the county. The motive power is steam and water. Employs from fifteen to twenty hands. Its capacity is about 80 yards of cloth a day, besides custom carding of 2000 bundles and 600 vards custom cloth annually.

#### TANNERIES.

THE PANTECHNICON TANNERY.-W. L. Hutton, Wellington street. Harness upper, kip and calf leather and sheepskins, are extensively manufactured.

ST. MARYS TANNERY.-M. Smith, Wellington street. Heavy leather, such as sole, harness, cowhide and kip, manufactured. Business about \$4,000 a year.

ST. MARYS BREWERY.-J. W. Guest; steam; employs ten hands. Ale and porter of excellent quality manufactured to the amount of about four thousand barrels a year. The business is increasing, and the proprietor intends enlarging the establishment.

ROBERTSON'S FLAX MILLS.—A. Robertson. This establishment turns out about 60 tons of dressed flax annually, valued at \$15,000. The proprietor intends adding a rope walk and hemp factory.

GARNER'S COOPERAGE.—Garner & Co. Employs about thirty hands, turning out 30,000 barrels, and 3,000,000 staves a year. The business is estimated at \$30,000 per annum.

#### SAW MILLS.

THOMPSON'S SAW MILL.-J. R. Thompson. This mill, during the past year (1866), cut about two and a half millions of feet, principally cherry, butternut and walnut. Valued at \$40,000.

GARNER'S SAW MILL.—Wm. Garner, Elizabeth street; capacity, 600,000 feet. The proprietor is also engaged in the manufacture of barrel hoors of a new and improved kind.

GILPIN BROS., manufacturers of tinware, stoves, &c., Queen street. This is a large establishment, occupying three flats of Guest's stone block.

COLLEY & HAMMETT,-Japan Ware. This enterprising firm supplies many of the cities and towns of the Province with articles

formerly only obtained in England or the United States. Annually manufacturing goods to the value of about \$45,000.

BICKELL'S SOAP FACTORY.-Hutton's Flats. Manufactures "Bickell's Lustral Erasive Soap," to the number of about 5,000 boxes,valued at upwards of \$15,000 annually.

BOOTS AND SHORS.—This manufacture is extensively carried on by Messrs. George McIntosh, R. T. Gilpin, and J. Morphy, to the respective values of \$15,000, \$5000, and \$5000 annually.

ASHERIES.—Messrs. McCracken and P. Henderson are engaged in the manufacture of Potash—the former to the value of \$3500, and the latter \$1800 per annum.

In addition to these, there are a large number of other establishments in the town, all doing a good business. In the grain and pork business, during the present season, to March 1st, 1867, nine firms purchased of the former to the value of \$352,913, and of the latter to the amount of 777,144 lbs.

#### CHURCHES.

ST. JAMES'S-Episcopal; stone; erected in 1858 at a cost of \$4800. Rev. S. B. Kellogg.

CANADA PRESEVTERIAN CHURCH-Widder street; frame; erected in 1856 at a cost of \$800; there is a manse in connection. Rev. Robert Hall.

ST. MARY'S-Roman Catholic; Church street; stone; erected in 1861, at a cost of \$3500. Rev. P. Boubat.

METHODIST-Wesleyan; Elgin street; stone; erected in 1856, and cost \$4800. Rev. Wm. Galbraith.

METHODIST-Episcopal; Church street; frame; erected in 1858, and cost \$1000. Revds. S. and E. A. Terwillager.

METHODIST-New Connexion; Queen street; stone. This building was the first school-house erccted in the town; it was purchased by the Methodists, and largely added to in 1862. Rev. D. D. Rolston.
