#### NOW THOUGHT TO HAVE BEEN MURDER

Wm. Ryder's Body is Disinterred and Autopsy Shows More Signs of Mnrder Than Suicide.

The inquest into the death of Wm Ryder of White's Mountain, King's Co., who was shot on Oct.
11th about 80 rods from his own nouse, will convened on the 26th

The post mortem examination vas made on Friday.

Three distinct bullet wounds

were found in the man's breast, one between the third and fourth ribs, and about two inches to the left of the breast bone, and the other two under the left arm. The




