| POINTS OF AOOD HORSE. The Now-York Spirito of the Times gives the followIng directions for examining the condition of a horse In purchasiag a good horse, sight, wind, feet, an In purchasiog a good horse, sight, wind, feet, and tunds must be the pppermost esjects of inquiry; for ninu haraess nut nf ten are defective in one of these particulars. First, then, oxmine his anyes and do this before he comes out of the stable; see that they are perfectly clear and transparent, and that the pupils or apples of the eye are exactly alike in size and cillurr. Next examine his pipes; ; good and sound oub being niped in the guilet he will utter a sound lite that from a bellows; but if his luags are touched aud he is broken winded, he will give vent to a dry husky, short cough; look to his limbs also, and in husky, short cough ; ook his legs, if you find any un passing your hand down natural protuberance, or puffiness, or if feeling firs sine leg, then the other, you discover any difference between them, disease more or less is present; he may not be lame, but he is not clean apon his lega It he is brond and full between the eyes, he may be depended on as a horse of good sense, and capable of leing trained to almost anything. If you want gentle horse, get one with more or less white upon belonging to circuses, shows, etc., are selected fo gentleaess; in faet the more kindly you treat horses, the bettor you will be treated by them in return. |
