## OPPOSED BY THE LIBERALS.

### BOOTH CROFTER IMMIGRATION TO BRITISH COLUMBIA.

The Bill to Vote Aid to British Columbia for Colonization Purposes Calls Forth a Lively Discussion in the Imperial Parliament.—The House of Commons on a French Warship.

LONDON, June 21.—In the House of Commons to-day the Radicals strongly opposed the bill authorizing a loan to British Columbia to enable the Scotch Crofters to settle.

The stand of the Opposition was that there was plenty of ground in Scotland for all the people if the game preserves should be abolished.

Sir John Swinburne (Liberal) urged that British Columbia ought to pay interest on the loan, in view of the fact that the colony imposed a heavy tax on British imports.

The bill passed a second reading by a vote of 66 to 22.




