APPOINTMENTS TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CANADIAN INSTITUTE FOR INTERNATIONAL PEACE AND SECURITY

The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Right Honourable Joe Clark, today announced the appointment of five Directors to the 17-member Board of Directors of the Canadian Institute for International Peace and Security (CIIPS). The appointments are for a term ending August 14, 1993.

The new Directors are:

Mr. Robert Cameron, former Ambassador to Poland and former Assistant Under-Secretary of State responsible for International Security and Arms Control Affairs, Ottawa, Ontario;

Dr. André Donneur, Professor of Political Science at the Université du Québec à Montréal, Montreal, Quebec;

Ms Hélène Pichette, Head of the News Section at Télé-Métropole Inc., Montreal, Quebec;

Ms Betty Plewes, Manager of Program Operations for the Canadian University Services Overseas (CUSO), Ottawa, Ontario; and

Gen. Gerard Thériault (retired), President of AEG Canada Inc. and former Chief of the Defence Staff, Nepean, Ontario.

The appointments were made following consultations with the Leader of the Official Opposition and the Leader of the New Democratic Party in accordance with the CIIPS Act (Bill C-32).



CIIPS was formally established on August 15, 1984, with the support of all parties. It reports annually to Parliament. The purpose of the Institute is to increase knowledge and understanding of issues related to international peace and security from a Canadian perspective, with particular emphasis on arms control, disarmament, defence and conflict resolution.
