## ECLIPSES.

There will be three eclipses this year; two of the Sun and one of the Moon.

I.—An annular eclipse of the Sun, June 27 invisible in Canada. Conjunction, 2h. 30m. in the evening. Visible in South America and a large portion of the Pacific Ocean.

II.—A partial eclipse of the Moon, Dec. 6, visible as follows. Beginning, 6h 24m—middle, 7h 17m—end, 8h 10m. Duration, 1h46m Magnitude of the eclipse (Moon's diameter 1) 0.2 on the southern limb.

III.—A total eclipse of the Sun, Dec. 21, invisible in Canada. Conjunction, 0h 19m morning. Visible from the north-eastern part of Africa, and the southern part of Asia.
