


FAIR OF NATIONS

(Under the Patronage of Sir John and Lady Gibson)

The Fair of Nations comes as a fitting climax to the work of the Women's Hospital Aid in connection with the erection of a Nurses' Home. Commencing with the Poster Show in 1906, the ladies of Brantford have labored unceasingly for six years, with this end in view, and now that their dream has become a reality, and work actually commenced on the building, they feel confident that citizens generally will rally to their support and give them the satisfaction of knowing that their part in the good work has been accomplished.

It is a source of regret that the demand for a larger and more expensive building than they had thought would be required has made it impossible for the W.H.A. to assume the responsibility, and the governors have been called to supply what is required beyond the \$20,000 the ladies have pledged themselves to raise. Only a small portion of that amount is needed, which it is hoped the Fair of Nations will realize.
