





EXTRACTS FROM THE RULES OF THE SOCIETY.

1. The Management of the Society shall be under the direction of persons who are members of the Church of England in Canada, and all the agents of the Society shall likewise be members of the same.
2. The selection, appointment, removal and field of labor of all the agents, together with the amount of their respective salaries, shall rest entirely with the Committee of the Society. The clergymen employed by the Society shall be subject to the ecclesiastical jurisdiction of their Diocesans, and the schools shall be open at all times to the visits of the Diocesan and the Parochial missionary Clergy in their respective districts.
3. English-speaking Protestants may be admitted into the schools, always provided that they shall not be admitted nor retained to occupy accommodation required for French-Canadian applicants, and shall pay such fees as shall more than cover the cost of their maintenance.
4. Every new member to be added to the Corresponding Committee of the Colonial Church and School Society, Montreal, shall be proposed at one meeting and elected at the next.
5. No layman shall be eligible as a member, unless he is, or is willing to become, a subscriber to the funds of the Colonial Church and School Society of not less than five dollars per annum. No clergyman shall be eligible unless an annual parochial collection is made by him for the Society, or unless he himself is or is willing to become a subscriber to the Society of five dollars per annum.
6. Members of the Corresponding Committee who for one year absent themselves from its meetings, shall *ipso facto* not be continued on the list of the Committee.

SABREVOIS MISSION.

BASIS OF ITS OPERATIONS.

I.—The whole work known as "The Sabrevois Mission" is conducted by the Corresponding Committee of the Colonial Church and School Society of Montreal, of which Committee the Bishop of the Diocese is, *ex officio*, Chairman.

II.—The Secretary of the Committee is also Superintendent of the Mission, having full charge and ordering of its affairs under the Committee. To him all missionaries and agents are responsible, and shall correspond with him on all matters connected with the mission, shall render to him all necessary reports of work done, and returns of all collections and disbursements, and at all times give him such information as he may deem needful to publish or to submit to the Committee.

III.—As a Mission, supported by a Church of England Society and other Church aid, it shall be strictly ordered, in all its missionary operations, according to the order of the Church. No deviations shall be made from this, except with the sanction of the Bishop.

IV.—The chief aim of the Committee, in conducting the Mission, shall be to provide the ministrations of the Church of England, and to afford guidance and instruction in her doctrine and practices, through French-speaking clergymen of the Church, to those of the French-speaking population who have become unsettled in their religious views, or alienated from the Church of Rome.

V.—The Sabrevois Mission Schools are supported for the express purpose of giving to children of French-speaking parents who desire to bring them up in the faith of the Church of England, a good education, combined with sound religious instruction, according to the doctrine of the Church.

VI.—In the schools, young men preparing for the Ministry, or as Teachers, shall be regarded as a separate class. When sufficiently advanced, those intending to take Holy Orders shall, excepting under special circumstances, enter some Theological Training College.

VII.—The clergyman who has charge of the schools and the general oversight of the Institution shall be styled the Principal.

VIII.—No teachers or agents shall be engaged in the schools, or other departments of the Mission, without the advice of the Superintendent and the sanction of the Committee.



PROSPECTUS
OF THE
Sabrevois Mission Schools.
MONTREAL.

THE aim of the SABREVOIS COLLEGE is to give to our boys and girls a sound and practical education in French and English. We take pupils from the A B C and prepare them for the Model School or commercial life or for matriculation in Arts, Science, Medicine, or any of the liberal professions at McGill or any other Canadian University.

The College has the advantage of being centrally situated. The building is well adapted for the work, comfort, discipline and health of boarders, as well as for the supervision and influence of the teachers. The city affords great aid for the development and expansion of the pupils' intellects. As far as possible the best religious influence is exercised over them in the Institution, and they attend services in l'Eglise du Redempteur, which is in close proximity to the College.

- I. The College will re-open October 2nd and will close about May 1st.

- II. It is understood that the pupils admitted are to remain until the end of the session.
- III. During study hours the pupils are constantly under the supervision of a teacher.
- IV. Pupils must provide themselves with bed requisites (bedstead and mattress only are furnished by College), towels, napkins, slippers and toilet soap. All their linen must be marked.
- V. Board and tuition fees are to be paid monthly or quarterly, in advance.
- VI. All pupils must be present at all the religious services.
- VII. The use of tobacco and intoxicating liquors is strictly forbidden in the College.
- VIII. Pupils are not allowed to leave the College without the permission of the Principal.

English students are admitted for \$10.00 a month.
Shorthand, Typewriting and Instrumental Music extra.

A valuable opportunity to learn French is offered to English students, who may be admitted to the Institution, provided there are vacancies not sought by French students.

The use of the English language in the Institute, except as required in the curriculum, is discouraged as much as possible.

ANNUAL REPORT, 1898-99.

To the Friends of the Work:

In the operations of the year now ended there are no special features to report; if there have been anxieties there have also been encouragements, and alike for anxieties and encouragements, for shadow and sunshine, we are bound to give thanks.

The one supreme anxiety is the question of ways and means. This is the point at which the difficulties, for some years past, have been, and still are, most acutely felt. For more than half a century the church in the Diocese of Montreal has been well to the front in sustaining this work. But of late years the Diocese, and especially the city of Montreal, is so incessantly canvassed for money in aid of church extension in all parts of the Dominion that the resources formerly available for French evangelization are now largely deflected in other directions. Far from regretting or begrudging the aid given by Montreal churchmen to objects external to their own diocese, the Sabrevois Committee rejoices that the local church is in a position to lend a helping hand in so many directions. With all the greater confidence, therefore, the Sabrevois Committee appeals to the church people of Canada to assist in rescuing the Mission from its embarrassments. From various parts of the great Province of Quebec French Roman Catholic youths of both sexes are looking in the direction of the Church of England, and to all such the Sabrevois Mission College presents an open door. The honour of the Church of England is involved in preserving this *open door*. Should the church be beaten here then she will be defeated in a citadel which she has held against terrible odds for more than 50 years.

Last autumn the Committee sent to England a special agent, Rev. H. E. Benoit, to lay the state of affairs before our friends there. Mr. Benoit is meeting with some encouragement, but not to such an extent as would warrant the slightest slackening of effort on the part of well-wishers on this side the Atlantic. Early in the present year Rev. F. W. Barnes represented the Mission in parts of Ontario and Quebec, but having lately undertaken other duties the work of collecting is now in the hands of Mr. W. B. Heeney, B.A., of the Diocesan Theological College, for whom we bespeak a warm welcome. Speaking of collections, we are glad to say that the parent society (Colonial and Continental Church Society, London, England) continues for the present its annual grant of £100 sterling.

We thankfully acknowledge a gift of \$500 from the late Rev. R Lewis, of Maitland, Ontario. This contribution to the funds came most opportunely, and enabled the Committee to close its accounts for the year with a slight improvement in the financial position. Mr. Lewis generously bequeathed a further sum of \$500 to the work on condition that the entire indebtedness be paid off within six months of his decease; this time will expire in September next.

At the last meeting of the Provincial Synod, held in Montreal in September, 1898, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

"Your Committee recognizing that the French Mission in the Province of Quebec, commonly called the Sabrevois Mission, is carried on, not in the spirit of proselytism, but rather to provide a spiritual home and preserve in the membership and faith of Christ's Church those amongst our French fellow citizens who, from various causes, are unsettled in their faith and inclined to drift away altogether from Christianity, recommend that Mission to the sympathy and support of the church in this ecclesiastical province."

In view of this resolution and of the great importance of the work among the masses of the French people of this Province, it is hoped that the day is not far distant when the Sabrevois Mission will be carried on, if possible even on a larger scale, as a department of the work controlled by the Board of Domestic and Foreign Missions of this ecclesiastical province.

We make grateful mention of the good work being done by the Ladies' Committee, of which Mrs. M. H. Gault continues to be the honoured and energetic President. Mrs. Gault and her Committee have toiled on, and still toil, with an enthusiasm that never weakens and a patience that never tires.

Before closing these remarks, we earnestly request all into whose hands a copy of this Report may come to read carefully the subjoined reports, etc., which are included for the information of the church at large. Enquiries are solicited, and further information will most gladly be given by any member of the Committee or by the undersigned.

In the meantime we may state that *our immediate wants are:*

1st. \$10,000 to pay off mortgage on the Mission schools:

2nd. \$10,000 as endowment for clerical stipend, clergyman to minister in the church and parish, thus freeing the Principal from all other duties except those connected with the schools.

Twenty thousand dollars is not a very large sum when the wealth and the numbers of our people are considered; yet it

would put the Sabrevois Mission on an absolutely certain and prosperous financial footing.

We tender our thanks to Messrs. Riddell & Common, Chartered Accountants, for their kindness in auditing our books.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE LADIES' COMMITTEE OF THE SABREVOIS MISSION FOR 1898-99.

I have pleasure in submitting the Annual Report of the Ladies' Committee. The meetings have been held quarterly as usual at Bishop's Court, and have been fairly well attended.

Mr. Mudge, by special request, has kindly been present at these meetings, keeping the Committee informed as to what was being done, and conferring with them on questions of the management of the college. An extra meeting was called to hear the report of the monthly visitors and decide upon some special rules for the students.

The work of the Committee has been effectively conducted under the leadership of their President, Mrs. M. H. Gault. The usual collections have been made, amounting this year to \$349.50, and in addition the sum of \$11.00 for the Special Debt Fund. The Mission Boxes brought in \$68.75, enabling the Treasurer to pay for the new floor in the dormitory, which had become an *absolute* necessity. A Recreation Room being very much needed by the students, in order to provide the necessary funds for this purpose it was decided to ask the Rev. R. G. Boville, M.A., to deliver a lecture. This he cheerfully consented to do, and the Very Rev. the Dean of Montreal kindly placed the St. George's school room at their disposal free of all expense. The lecture, ably illustrated by exceptionally good lime-light views, was most instructive and interesting, and attracted a very large audience. Mr. Fisk and Mr. Wilkes greatly contributed to the enjoyment of the evening with excellent rendering of several songs. The amount realized, \$225, was devoted to this Recreation Room.

The efforts of the Ladies' Committee have, therefore, resulted in a total subscription of \$654.25. The lady President contributed the sum of \$100 to the General fund of the Sabrevois Mission, which is not included in the total receipts of the Ladies' Association ; \$40.00 of this amount was for the special debt fund.

The College has been regularly visited by the Ladies of the Committee. They feel greatly encouraged by the bright outlook for the Mission, and are making the most strenuous efforts to wipe off its debt and give the College a free scope for continuing and adding to its good work.

SABREVOIS COLLEGE ANNUAL CLOSING EXERCISES AND REPORT OF PRINCIPAL LARIVIERE.

My Lord, Ladies and Gentlemen :—

With the expiration of another scholastic year, I am reminded of the duty of presenting to the friends of this Institution a brief report of the work that has been done, and also of the measure of success that we have met.

Our schools re-opened the 15th of September last. Our register shows that 86 pupils have been in attendance during the session, of whom 59 have been boarders, and 27 day pupils. Although our teaching staff, as compared with that of previous years, has been somewhat weakened numerically, yet the school has not suffered in any way in that special direction. I am fully confident that the work has been done most faithfully, thoroughly and efficiently. This necessarily means extra hard work on the part of the teachers, and to-day we have the satisfaction that we have not worked in vain.

We are proud of the progress that some of our pupils have made, and we are satisfied in this respect with the progress of every one of them.

Intellectually the class of pupils that we have had would compare, I think, favourably with the pupils of any school in this city. Physically, too,

they are strong and robust, and they are now returning home in the very best state of health. We have had, during the year, no sickness to speak of, and if on the one hand we find our bills for bread, butter and coal rather large, on the other hand we are glad to see that the doctor's bill is nil. In this respect, I think, everyone will admit that the expenses are on the right side of the equation.

The final examinations have been conducted by the following gentlemen : Rev. Canon Dixon, Rev. R. H. O'Malley, M.A., Rev. H. Jekill, B.A., Rev. C. Rollit, Mr. W. B. Heeney, B.A., Prof. J. W. Tucker, B.A., and the teachers of the College. I shall before closing mention the names of the fortunate pupils who have captured the prizes.

We stated in our last year's report that some of our students intended to present themselves for the A. A. examination, and some for the Matriculation in Arts. It is very pleasing to me to be able to say, with reference to our students, that all those who presented themselves for the said examinations were successful.

Our school is represented at the McGill Normal by Miss Maggie Seaman and Miss Olive Somers, and Mr. John Seaman has been at the Montreal Diocesan Theological College since last Christmas.

Of our present students, Miss Maude Copping intends to present herself next June for Matriculation at the McGill Normal, and Mr. Lancaster for Matriculation in Arts.

This Institution has furnished its fair quota of students to Theological Colleges, and to-day, in almost every diocese of our Dominion, clergymen can be found, and several also in the United States, who owe their primary education to the Sabrevois Mission Schools.

With regard to the Church, I have nothing to report beyond the ordinary routine. Our time being completely taken up with the work of the school, we could hardly undertake any additional pastoral work. And may I be allowed to say, with our French Congregations, pastoral work is of vital importance. In connection with the Church of *L'Eglise du Rédempteur*, a hard-working, devoted and self-sacrificing clergyman is at present a great desideratum. Much work might be done ; the harvest is great indeed, but the labourers are too few. French Missionary work in connection with our church is getting every year better understood by church people in general.

We feel thankful to God for the sympathy and generosity of those warm and genuine friends who take a special interest in that particular branch of God's work.

Those French Protestants who have cast in their lot in the great Catholic and Apostolic Church of England feel that they owe to the chief Pastor of this diocese, the Rt. Rev. Bishop Bond, a debt which can never be repaid by them. Through him was the work, so to speak, initiated in prayer and faith, and through his persistent efforts has the work ever since been carried on and sustained. This French work must therefore finally redound to the honour and glory of our Blessed Saviour the Lord Jesus Christ.

Mistakes may have been made in the past, and are also liable to be made in the future, yet we feel that no criticism however sharp and acrimonious provided it be fair and honest will injure the work; on the contrary, criticism will only help the work to emerge from a humbler to a larger sphere.

We know that we have the prayer, the sympathy, the tangible help of our friends; but we want also the prayer and sympathy of every churchman of our fair Dominion.

Remember the biblical axiom: "Give and it shall be given you." This axiom is in perfect accord with that scientific one which reads:—"Ex nihilo nihil fit." If there are any churchmen who are indifferent to our work, and who are under the impression that we are not meeting with any success, let them apply these two tests and judge for themselves, and we are sure to have them finally for our best and warmest friends.

In the history of Sabrevois Mission the name of a particular lady cannot be omitted. We all know that, even from the very beginning of the Christian era, women played a very important part in the introduction of Christianity in many a pagan nation.

The names of Bertha and Hilda stand in relief on the pages of the history of the Church of England.

We believe in the Apostolic succession of women. The line has never been broken, and the mantle of those saintly women has undoubtedly fallen on the President of the Ladies' Committee, Mrs. M. H. Gault.

Many Hildas are also to be found among the members of that said committee. In the name of the Lord we thank them for the zeal and the interest they have displayed in reference to the work in which we are engaged. As God's servants we desire and pray for a larger measure of that Divine Spirit in order that we may be more efficient for the task which is laid upon us.
