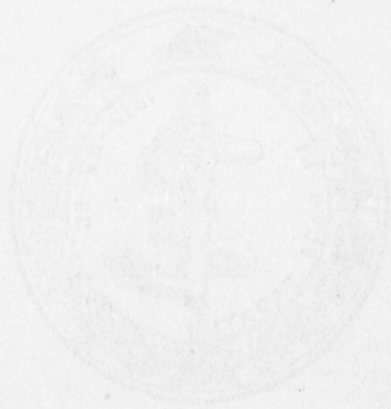

# CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

OF THE

## ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

### CONSTITUTION.

1. That this Association be denominated "The Ontario Rifle Association."

2. Any person being a subscriber of \$1 per annum, shall become a member of the Association.

3. Donors of \$20 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a prize of no less than \$40, to be competed for at the annual prize meeting, shall be entitled to be enrolled as life members of the Association.

4. Any Battalion or Rifle Association in the Province subscribing not less than \$10 annually to the funds of the Association, shall be considered as being in connexion with it, and shall be entitled to a number of memberships, in the proportion of one to every half-dollar thus subscribed. Each subscribing Association is to elect from its members the persons to hold such memberships, and return their names and addresses, when elected, to the Secretary of the Association, to be registered by him one week previous to the match.

5. There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons named by the Council.

The Lieut-Governor of the Province of Ontario, for the time being, shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."

6. There shall be a President.

7. There shall be four Vice-Presidents,—one for each Military District.

8. There shall be a Council, composed as follows:—

1st. Four members from each of the Military Districts, who shall be elected primarily at this meeting, and hereafter at the annual meeting.

2nd. The District Deputy Adjutants-General of Militia.

3rd. The Brigade Majors.

4th. The President, of local affiliated Associations and Clubs being members of the Association,—

Five of whom shall form a quorum ; and in the event of vacancies occurring in the elective members, from any cause whatever, the remaining members of the Council shall have the power of filling such vacancies.

9. The Council shall choose for their members elected, the President of the Association.

10. There shall be a Vice-President for each Military District, selected from among the members of the Council for such Districts, and who shall be elected by the Council.

11. There shall be a Treasurer, and there shall be a Secretary at Toronto, both to be appointed by the Council, and holding office during pleasure.

12. The Council shall have the sole management of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting—such account having been previously audited by a person or persons not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of the affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts and deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.

13. The Council shall be regulated in their proceedings by such by-laws as may from time to time be enacted by them ; no by-law being in any case altered, or new one proposed, without at least one month's notice of such intention being given to each member of Council.

14. The annual prize meeting shall be held at such times and places as may be determined on by the Council.

15. The prizes shall be competed for in accordance with such regulations as may be passed by the Council from time to time.

16. An annual report, embracing the audited account of the finances, shall be drawn up by the Secretary, and shall (having been previously submitted to the Council) be published as soon after the prize meeting as may be found practicable.

17. There shall be an annual meeting, to be held at such time and place as shall be selected by the Council.

Secretaries of Rifle Associations affiliated, or desirous of affiliating with the Ontario Rifle Association, will confer a favour by forwarding the names and addresses of the office-bearers of their Association, as soon after their election as possible, in order that they may be published in the annual report.

### BY-LAWS.

The next annual meeting of the Association shall be held at Toronto, in June, 1875.

There shall be two ordinary meetings of the Council; the first of which shall be held on the day after the annual meeting of the Association and the second at such other time as the Council may then determine upon.

Extraordinary meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary, if required by any six of the members of the Council—notification being sent to each member of the Council at least ten days previous to such meeting—and the requisition for the meeting, and the notices to the members, must state the object or objects of such extraordinary meetings.

The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at all meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary, and open to the inspection of any members of the Council.

There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three members of the Council.

The Treasurer is authorized to deposit from time to time in the Savings Department of the Ontario Bank, all sums of money paid over to him on behalf of the Association.

All expenditure of sums for current expenses which may be required by the Secretary, must be authorized by the signature of the President of the Association, or, in his absence, by some member of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner.

Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association.

A detailed statement of all Receipts and Expenditures shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer.

REPORT OF COUNCIL

Your Council herewith beg to submit their sixth Annual Report of the proceedings of the Association for the year ending 31st December, 1874.

The Annual Match was held on the Association Ranges, Garrison Common, Toronto, on the 1st September, lasting four days, and may, upon the whole, be considered as having been satisfactory.

The number of entries was not as large as in previous years, but as two matches were added to the usual list, and the entrance fees in the All Comers raised, the receipts from that source were increased, while the prizes were a little less in the aggregate than in 1873, as will be seen by the comparative statement here given :

As already stated, two competitions were added to the usual list, viz., the District Match and the Wimbledon Match.

The District was open to Teams of fifteen from each Military District from Ontario, and the prizes awarded, were, a Silver Cup (value, \$200.00), presented by Lieut.-Col. Gzowski, and \$100.00 by the same gentleman to the winning district, supplemented by a sum from the Association for individual prizes. The Cup to be shot for annually, and remain in possession of the Vice-President of the winning District for the year.

The Wimbledon Match was introduced to meet the plan arranged by the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association for the selection of

representatives from Ontario upon the Wimbledon Team of 1875, requiring a three days' competition to be held in each Province.

By holding such competition during our Annual Meeting, it was thought that a better and larger representation would be had, besides saving a special journey to Toronto.

These expectations were not, unfortunately, altogether realized, as three different ranges had to be fired on each day, and two targets only were available, many competitors found it impossible to complete their firing in this and other matches, while a great many entered and made use of the match for the purpose of practice, to the exclusion oftentimes of those who were really anxious to compete for places on the Team.

The sum of \$200 was apportioned to this Match, to be divided among the members of the Association who really proceed to Wimbledon in 1875.

The scoring in this competition was that of Wimbledon for 1874, and a new butt and canvas targets were specially prepared, but as the mechanism was at the last moment found not to work well, the iron target, painted in accordance with the new regulation, was substituted.

From the accompanying Balance Sheet it will be seen that the balance at the credit of the Association is very small, while there are a large number of accounts still unpaid.

An explanation of the deficit is therefore given, with the conviction that during the coming year all liabilities will be wiped off and a surplus again provided.

The actual receipts for 1874 have been about \$400 in excess of 1873, while the expenses have been some \$800 less, but as the balance brought forward in 1873 was \$2,283, that of 1874 was only \$512, leaving \$1,700 less of a margin to work upon.

The principal expenses of the year, and which are not likely to occur again, were for fencing, \$397.33; repairs to butts which had been in use for seven years, \$230.97; new butt for Wimbledon Match, \$115.24; new glass and frames, \$139.39; new flags, brushes, etc., \$114.35; binoculars, \$176.86; umbrellas, \$61.22.

Although repairs are still needed to one range, they can be postponed for the present, and, after deducting the ordinary repairs, a saving of fully \$1,000 can be effected during the coming year; while on the other hand an increase in the receipts may be looked for from pasturage and practice fees.



Your Council would recommend that a change be made in the regulations for practice, as the experience of two years plainly shews that the ranges in that particular have not been self-sustaining.

The amount received for pasturage has increased upwards of \$200, and that in the face of a heavy drought which necessitated a large reduction of the fees for fully one half the season.

The fence heretofore spoken of was put up to prevent cattle from straying on the ranges, thereby maintaining uninterrupted practice.

The number of Affiliating Associations was increased by four, but the ordinary membership has fallen off from 42 to 29.

Binoculars and umbrellas were purchased for the use of the Register Keepers, thereby increasing their efficiency and comfort.

It is with pleasure your Council have to record the success of the Provincial Team at Ottawa, in September last, who succeeded under the control of Major Cotton, in winning the Merchant's of London Cup, value \$1,000, offered annually to competing Teams from each Province. Our Team was composed of Asst.-Surgeon Aiken, 37th Battalion; Sergt.-Major Cruit, 2nd G. T. Artillery; Sergeant Baillie, 47th Battalion; Privates Bell and Mills, 10th Royals.

We would recommend that the railway expenses of the Team be paid by the Association.
