ADMISSION.

THE ACADEMIC YEAR consists of one Term commencing on the LAST THURSDAY IN AUGUST and ending on the FRIDAY preceding the First MONDAY IN JULY.

ADMISSION.—The Academy is free to all students from the county. For the present no fee will be charged students coming from beyond the county.

Students will be admitted on the following conditions:---

Those who have already passed the entrance examination to any of the High Schools or County Academies, those holding High School Certificates of any Grade, those holding Teacher's Licenses, those holding Provincial Normal School Diplomas, will be admitted without further examination. All others will be required to pass an examination on the following subjects:

★ (1) ENGLISH,—Punctuation, Sentence Building, Correcting wrong forms, Elements of Prosody, Figures of speech, &c. Prescribed text book in Grammar omitting notes and small print.

(2) (a) GEOGRAPHY.—Elementary Geography in full with special attention given to map drill.

(b) HISTORY.—History of British America. British History as in "Brief History of England."

(3) ARITHMETIC,—As in Kirkland and Scott. Algebra, fundamental rules. Special attention should be given to evaluation of Algebraic expressions.

(4) USEFUL KNOWLEDGE.—A paper containing questions cn useful knowledge as embraced in the Common School Course. Health Readers No. I and II, and Chemistry Primer should be read. Analysis of a few common plants as in Gray's Botany. Music according to Tonic Sol fa notation.
(5) DRAWING, WRITING and SIMPLE ACCOUNTS.—Con-

struction of Angles and Simple Geometrical figures to scale and their measurement. A simple set of Bookkeeping.

This examination will be held, beginning on the first Monday of July, 1895. The papers will be prepared by the Department of Education at Halifax, and will be forwarded to the Principal, under seal. Successful candidates will receive a certificate of having passed the High School Entrance Examination.

SUPPLEMENTARY EXAMINATIONS.—Candidates who are unable to be present at the regular examination, may, at the discretion of the Principal or Faculty, be admitted to a supplementary examination, after the opening of the School Year. This E amination will be held on the first Tuesday of September.

SPECIAL STUDENTS.—Students may be admitted to a special course on the recommendation of the Principal or Faculty, provided they do not encroach upon the privileges of the regular students.

CLASSIFICATION.—The work of Academy is divided into four grades or years, namely :—the *First Year* or grade "D" the *Second Year* or grade "C," the *Third Year* or grade "B," and the *Fourth Year* or grade "A."

HIGH SCHOOL EXAMINATION.—At the end of the year, examinations will be provided for the different grades by the Department of Education at Halifax. These examinations will be conducted in the same manner as the examinations for Teachers Licenses have been conducted heretofore and *High School Certificates* of "A," "B," "C," or "D" awarded to successful candidates.

TEACHERS EXAMINATION. – At the same time and place a "Minimum Professional qualification" examination will be provided in the following subjects:—(1) School Law and Management, (2) Teaching, (3) Temperance and School Hygiene. This examination will only be required of such students as are preparing for Teachers License and who do not already hold a Normal School Diploma or a Minimum Professional Qualification Certificate. For this Examination a fee of \$2.00 must accompany the application.

These examinations will be held as follows:—Grade A on the first Monday of July, 1894. Grade B on the following Wednesday. Grade C and D on the following Thursday and the "Minimum Professional Qualification" for teachers on Saturday.
