



INVENTION—AN ILLUMINATOR RANKING WITH SPERM OIL, WITH A FIRE TEST OF 480 DEGREES—GREAT EXPECTATIONS.

From the date when keros From the date when kerosene oil came into general use efforts have constantly been making to carry the manufacture of petroleum still further towards perfection, a point which confessedly has not yet been attained in that manufacture. The desiderata have been, for the purpose of illumination, a smokeless, odorless and non-explosive oil, or the equivalent of sperm oil; and, for the purposes of lubrication, an oil which shall have the qualities of stainlessness and durableness or non-volatility.

stainlessness and durableness or non-volatility.

The effect of the new process in the burning oil is to raise the fire test, lower the specific gravity and remove the odor. The existing provision of law is that kerosene oil offered for sale shall be equal to a fire test of 110 degrees of Fahrenheit.

Any oil which will take fire at a lower temperature is deemed dangerous. The safety of the new oil is known in the fact that it will staff a fire test of 480 degrees.

The new process, as applied to lubricating oil, rids it of its odor and of its strain ing properties, and it increases the dura

The new process, as applied to lubricating oil, rids it of its odor and of its strain ing properties, and it increases the duration of service, or what in the trade is called the "viscosity" of the oil. As thus used it is to be taken in the meaning of the second definition of Webster, viz.: "That quality of soft substances which makes them adheres or as not to be easily parted." The word "cohere" would be more suitable in this case than adhere. The new lubricating oil is not sticky or gummy, and is not adhesive in that sense, but its globules or atoms hold well together in service, and are not dissipated into the atmosphere, but are used up by being worn out in the bearings of the machinery. The viscosity of the oil will give it value in the proparation of currier's oils, for reasons which workers in leather will readily understand.

One principal effect of the process is that it disengages the tarry particles contained in the "distillates," which is the technical designation of the oils as they come from the still. After treatment by the new process, the oil clears itself of
