



The Court has Jurisdiction over all minor cases of Larceny, Misdem eanor and appeals from decision of Magistrates. Trials are byJury. § (Sittings—Second Tuesday in March, June, September, and December.

COUNTY COURTS.

The jurisdiction in cases of Notes of hand, &c., is limited to £100, in cases of open accounts to £50, and torts to personal chattels to £50. It has also equity jurisdiction up to £50, and jurisdiction in certain cases of ejectment.
