The Division Courts in Western Canada are presided over the Judges of the County Courts, and have jurisdiction er atmost all claims on debt, account of money demand hether payable in money or otherwise up to $\mathbf{£ 2 5}$, and in el torts to personal chattles to $£ 10$. The suits are generally determined by the Judge in a summary manner; in ertain cases, however, a Jury is allowed.

2. The next space of this calcula'ion occupies from ten at night till twe next morning.
3. The nearer to mid-day or noon the phases of the moon happen, the more foul or wet weather may be expected during the next seven days.
4. The space of this ealculation occupies from ien in the forenoon to $t$ wo in the afternonn. These oliservations refer principaliy to the Summer, though they affect Spring and Autumn nearly in the same ratio.
6. The Moon's change, first quarter. full and last quarter. happening during six of the afternoon hours (i e. from four to ten) may he followed by fair weather; but this is mostly dependent on the wind as is noted in the table.

Eclipses.. In the year 1867 there will be two Eclipses of the Sun, and two of the Moon.
1.-An annular eclipse of the Sun, March 5-6, 1867, invisible in Canada.
2.-A partial eclipse of the Moon, March 19, 1867: At the time of the last contact with the penumbra the point of last contact will be below the horizon. The first contact with the shadow occurs at $142^{\circ}$ from the northernmost point of the moon's limb towards the East, and the last contact at $107^{\circ}$ towards the West. First contact with the Penumbra, March 20, Brockville, 12h 59.2m.
3.-A total eclipse of the Sun, invisible in Canada, Aug 28
4.-A partial eclipse of the Moon, Sept. 13, 1867, visible.
