THE EDITOR'S NOTES
On Tuesday afternoon last we boarded the B. & W., bound on a short vacation trip to the Rideau. At Elgin station we left the train and proceeded by carriage to Jones' Falls. Arriving there in the gray twilight of a beautiful evening. CHEESE IN FRONTENAC.
The Kingston Whig of last week says:—

At present the cheese market is very flat. Cheese is not wanted at any price, and Thursday buyers could not get limits from their respective firms to buy cheese. Dealers hope that before the end of next week the market will improve so that buyers will be offered. In speaking about the quality of cheese manufactured in the Frontenac district a buyer stated that salesmen in Brockville and Napanee could get half a cent more additional cheese per lb. than the salesman of this district. The reason of this is that the cheese made in Frontenac is inferior in quality to that manufactured in other districts. It was hoped that when an inspector of cheese was appointed for this district the cheese would be much better than in past years, but no improvement has taken place. In fact the cheese offered this season is not as good as it has been in former years. The cause is that men owning factories do not employ competent makers. If owners could be made to believe that to engage first-class makers would be to their interest take as good a place in the old country markets as any cheese made in Canada or the United States. The fault is that young men who are only served, probably a year, are engaged as cheesemakers at small wages. The result is that the cheese made by the amateurs has to be rejected by the buyers, and can only be got rid of at great reductions in price. The sooner factorymen awake to the importance of engaging first-class makers the more money they will make out of the business. In the past men who have invested in cheese factories in Frontenac have lost money, simply because the cheese they manufactured would not stand comparison alongside cheese made in other districts.
