



BUSINESS EMBARRASSMENTS.

The W. T. Hurst Estate to Be Wound Un meeting of the creditors of W. T.

Hurst, boot and shoe dealer, Collingwood, was held at that place on Thursday. The assignee's statement showed assets of \$705, against liabilities of \$2686. This poor showing is accounted for by the fact that showing is accounted for by the fact that the insolvent has been pressed from all sides for some time and was unable to buy any stock. The principal creditors are William Griffith of Hamilton and Greene, McLaren & Co. of this city, whose claims are \$450 and \$250 respectively.
