R. Cochran received the following dispatch from Kennett, Hopkins & Co.:  
"Chicago, Oct. 4.—The wheat market opened on firm grounds which was the signal for listing from abroad and they were soon supplied. The news was not only good, but the Northwest was a free seller, probably on hedges, and this added to the weakness. December advanced the greatest weakness, and it is believed that the fall market, the same as the July and September lots did. Foreign advices offer no encouragement to holders.

Corn and oats relatively quiet. Small amounts for tomorrow are sustaining prices. An upward movement cannot be expected while wheat remains so weak, but purchases on spot will probably prove profitable.

Provisions generally easy, though October pork is higher on purchases for Armour.
