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Household Hints and Helps.

Acidity of Stomach-Carbonate of soda is a good cure, but the diet should also be regulated and sweets, acids and excess of potatoes avoided. Take a course of Dr. Williams' Pink Pills, If constipated use some good laxative.

Anaemia — Prevent all unnecessary waste of vitality. Get fresh air, nutritious food, establish regular habits and take Dr. Williams' Pink Pills after every meal. Treat also with friction, rubbing body briskly with warm dry hand.

Antidote—Mix some salt in a glass of warm water and swallow quickly. This will immediately induce vomitting. The white of a couple of eggs should then be swallowed, followed by some strong coffee.

Ants in Cupboards—Take an old sponge, slightly wet it and sprinkle sugar on it. This should then be placed in the cupboard, when the ants will crawl into the sponge. Afterwards drop the sponge into boiling water.

Asthma—In a violent attack coming on suddenly sometimes a whiff from a pipe will act like a charm. In some cases if the attack is caused by an injudicious meal it is best to empty the stomach by an emetic. Constitutional treatment—Dr. Williams' Pink Pills for Pale People.

Bad Smclis—(To remove) A deodoriser can be made with permanganate of potash placed in a jer where the smell is offensive. Put half an ounce into a pint of water. Celery or parsley leaves rubbed on the hands after cutting onlons will remove smell.

Baldness-To avoid premature baldness avoid tight hats, never work with head near heat or gaslight.

Bandages- Should be applied equally so that the pressure will be the same on all parts. If fastened with a pin take care that the pin does not touch the wound; always bandage a limb upwards; for example from the hand up to the armpit.

Bedrooms—Don't burn gas, even turned low, during the night. Don't let offensive matters remain in the room; if unavoidable ring out towel in cold water and use as cover. Coffee beans burned are a good deodoriser.

Bedsores—Before the skin is broken it is a good plan to rub the part night and morning with strong spirit, such as brandy, but when once the skin is broken Baby's Own Powder may be used with much relief to the patient,

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Bee Stings—As soon as stung get the blue bag and rub it well into the wound. The application of ammonia will immediately relieve the pain or an onion cut in half and rubbed in well will serve as well.

Billous Complaints—To expel the bile downward a laxative pill is allowable. This may be followed by an effervescent drink. In the meantime a little cure should be directed towards the dlet. But the only permanent cure is to improve the digestion. Dr. Williams Pink Pills will permanently cure bile.

Black Dye—To five pints of water add half a pound of bruised gall, quarter of a pound of green vitrol and one pound of logwood.

Blacken Brown Boots, to-Cut a potato and rub boots thoroughly with it. When dry blacken in the usual way. Repeat process several times.

Black Felt Hats—May be effectually cleaned and the dirt removed by rubbing well with benzine. Afterwards hang up in fresh air to remove the smell. Benzine is dangerously inflammable and must never be used at night or in any room containing fire.

Blackheads—Are merely dust deposits in the pores of the skin, and should simply be squeezed out and the place well washed with warm soap and water; or the skin may be steamed and worked with the fingers.

Blacking for Harness—Take four ounces of mutton suet and twelve ounces beeswax; melt; add twelve ounces powdered sugar candy; four ounces soft soap dissolved in water and two ounces of powdered indigo. When well mixed add haif a pint of turpentine. Apply with sponge and polish with brush and cloths.

Bieeding (to stop)—A loss of blood is always alarming but once wash it away with clean cold water and the wound is often quite slight; bleeding can be stopped with alum. Common whiting or pipe clay applied thickly to the wound and kept in position by dry lint is useful.

Blisters—Arising from burns or scalds can be prevented generally by applying immediately after the accident white of eggs. This may also be used in sunburn and freckles.

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Blotches on the Face—Are best treated with Internal remedies, correcting the liver and stomach. The face should be well washed three or four times daily. Outdoor exercise is necessary. Dr. Williams' Pink Pills are a remedy for this unsightly ailment.

Blushing—Should be overcome by the victim accustoming himself or herself to company; mixing with people as much as possible; by the exercise of will power, by leading a healthy out-door life; by thinking less of oneself and more of others.

Bolls—Should be brought to a head with a hot poultice. A baked potato cut in half will do as well. When ripe and ready to break the boil should be lanced with a needle. Clean the needle first by putting it in hot water. Take a course of Dr. Williams' Pink Pills to purify the blood.

Boots (to Polish)—Rub well with fresh cut potato; when nearly dry polish with blacking in the usual way. They will take a higher gloss.

Bottles—Bottles are cleaned effectively by putting coal ashes into them, and shaking them well up with water. If shot is used great care should be taken to remove it all.

Breath Tainted by Onions-Chopped parsley leaves eaten with vinegar will remove the taint.

Brown Boots (to Clean)—Remove stains with lemon juice, then polish with beeswax dissolved in a little turpentine. This is the best polish and preservative.

Bruises—Apply cold water, and if possible elevate the injured part so as to retard circulation.

Burns-Exclude all air from the injured part. Wrap in cotion wool. Apply oil of any kind or white of egg. Take care in removing clothes. Don't break blister.

Burning Oil—May be almost instantly quenched by throwing flour upon it; but in any case don't throw water on oil. Endeavor to stiffe the flames, and for this purpose flour, sand and earth may be used.

Cabbage Water-Should not be poured down sinks as it causes offensive smell. Pour it on ground when cool it is an excellent fertilizer for fruit trees and rhubarb.

Carbuncle — Warm, soothing poultices should be applied from first to last. When the swelling becomes conical the doctor will lance the top. When the abcess has been opened it is as well to give a liberal diet and Dr. Williams' Pink Pills.

Carpet Sweeping—It is not generally known that fresh grass is better than tea leaves to use when sweeping a carpet. Tea leaves frequently make dirty marks or stains, whereas the grass is clean and fresh.

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Carpet Stains—If the stain is not large pure benzine will be found very effective; rub it well in with a clean linen rag and repeat till the stain is removed. Benzine will not in the least injure the color of tae carpet. It is, however, dangerously inflammable and must not be used at night nor in a room where there is a fire.

Chafing in Infants—Is very often due to neglect of proper cleanliness, and the wrinkles of the neck and the part behind the ears become chafed. Baby's Own Powder dusted over the sore parts will be found an excellent remedy.

Chicken-Pox—The eruption first appears on the body but spreads rapidly. The typical rash consists of red pimples which rippen into vesicles these burst and dry up. There is no pitting unless they are scratched. The treatment consists of light diet and warmth. The period of infectiousness is three weeks from the commencement of the disease, if every scab has fallen off and no child should be admitted into school under a shorter period of absence. 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Chilblains—Dry the hands or feet carefully after washing. The local application of any grease is very soothing. An onion cut in two and rubbed on the part is also very effective. Dr. Williams' Pink Pills should be taken to improve the circulation of the blood.

Chlorosis—Called green sickness, because of the green tinge it gives the complexion. It affects young anaemic girls. Symptoms: debility, palpitation, pains in the loins, etc. A tonic should be taken with outdoor exercise and wholesome food. Choking—Remove the obstruction with the ingers; failing this smack the back violently. Tickle the the taroat with a feather to induce vomitting. If a child hold up by the heels and shake violently. Do not give up even if the patient is insensible. It is a good plan to break the white of an egg into a cup and give it to the patient to swalow.

Clean a Frying Pan—Pour in hot water, let it boll up and stir it well. Then wipe dry. If a smell remains in the pan from fish or onlons put catmeal in the pan and shake it over the fire till the meal scorches.

Clean Gilt Frames with a sponge dipped in spirits of wine or oil of turpentine. Do not wet the sporge too much; just enough to remove the dirt. Leave to dry.

Clean Leather Chairs—The cushions should first be rubbed with a damp cloth and then wiped quite dry. Beat the white of an egg to a stiff froth and apply quickly with a soft rag to the chair covering.

Cleaning Cluth-Dh'solve a lump of ammonia the size of a wa'nut in a teacupful of water. Sponge cloth, will with this (brush if very dirty) and hang in air to dry. This will restore color. Press with hot iron over damp cloth.

Cleaning Windows—This may be done very effectively with chamois skin or with a little methylated spirit which is a method much used by contractors.

Cleaning Oilcloth-The best thing for cleaning linoleums, ollcloth and tiles is sour milk.

Closed Up Ear—The usual remedy is to blow the nose vigorously and endeavor to force a passage but relief will be obtained by syringing with warm water; hot applications if used should be around the ear not over it.

Coffee—Is a direct stimulant to the nervous system and a powerful preventative of loss of heat, it therefore should be taken on occasions of exposure to cold.

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Coffee in the Sick Recom—Is a powerful deodorant. The best way to employ it is to freshly pound the coffee in a mortar and sprinkle the coffee on a red hot iron surface. The fumes will immediately have the desired effect.

Cold Feet in Bed—You cannot sleep if your feet are cold. Sleep commences at the extremeties so keep feet warm. Before going to bed pace up and down the room and get the feet in a glow. A hot water bottle may be used with advantage or socks can be worn in bed when necessary.

Cold in Head—The treatment is generally very simple and may be confined to a hot bath for the feet.

Cooking Smells—A little cedar sawdust if thrown on the top of the range will prevent the smell of cooking rising from the kitchen to other parts of the house.

Copper Utensils—Notning should be allowed to get cold in copper vessels for fear of poison. In poisoning from copper pans give an emetic Ipecac wine or warm sait and water with mustard in it.

Corns—On going to bed at night cover corn with Hanson's Magic Corn Salve and upon arising in the morning soak the foot in warm water and corn can be easily removed.

Court Plasters—Requires some judgment as to its use. It may be used for slight wounds with perfect security, for deep wounds, however, apply strips only so as to keep edges of wound close and leave room for the secretions of the wound to escape.

Cracks in Woodwork—Stop with putty to which a little Japan black has been added. Putty so treated defies the weather for years.

Cramp in Stomach—Rub the stomach in a circular direction ; then if cramp is severe ; apply a flannel soaked in turpentine and take some ginger in very hot water.

Cramp in Legs—Kick out the leg at the same time press down the heel as much as possible and draw up the toes. If done promptly this will stop an attack of cramp. Another remedy is to stand on cold hearth.

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Dust in the Eye—Close the eye and blow the nose violently. Draw down the lower lid and remove the dust with the corner of a handkerchief. If the eye becomes inflamed drop in one drop of castor oil; exclude light.

Dying Fire—May be stimulated by a handful of moist sugar or a few well dried potato parings. A couple of handfuls are sufficient and this is worth remembering, when lighting the fire often there is difficulty in obtaining wood for the purpose.

Earache—A little sweet oll should be dropped into the ear and cotton wool inserted to keep out the cold air. The ear should be syringed with warm soap and water if inflammation is due to presence of wax.

Ear Inflammation—Often causes an abseess. This may end fatally. The ear should be syringed with hot water. If inflammation is severe call a doctor.

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Flowers—When faded may be revived more or less by placing them half way up their stems in very hot water and left there to cool. Then cut off the ends and place in cold water.

Fomentations—Hot fomentations may be given by flannel dipped in boiling water and wrung dry in a towel before aplying; a second flannel must be got ready so that a change can be effected without delay.

Frost Bite—Treatment consists in slowly and very cautiously restoring the circulation. The part may be rubbed with cold water or snow and the patient put to bed in cold sheets. Avoid hot rooms or drinks.

Fruit Stains—(To remove) Hold the article over a basin, and pour boiling water on it. Salt, if applied promptly to the stain will serve to keep the cloth damp till it can be treated as indicated.

Furred Kettles—It will be found that water will soon form a crust inside the kettle and it is a good precaution to place a clean oyster shell inside the kettle to atract the particles of earth and stone.

Gargle-(How to) A mouthful of gargle should be taken the head thrown back and the gargle then set in motion by breathing through it. Do not swallow it.

Gilt Frames—To prevent files spotting gilt frames pour boiling water on onions and let them stand for a week. Strain and sponge frames with the liquid. Do this twice every spring and summer.

Glasses—Should not be washed in hot water as this may crack them nor in warm water as this makes them dull. Use cold water with a little soda if the glasses are stained.

Glaze Linen-Dissolve teaspoonful of borax in half a teacupful of boiling water and add a pint of cold starch. Finish off with polishing iron.

Gloves—Are frequently solled with perspiration and i is a good plan to dust a little Baby's Own Powder inside the gloves. This should be done when the gloves are new and unworn.

Glue—To increase the adhesion of glue and make it less brittle add one part of glycerine to three parts of glue.

Gnat Bite—When bitten by these little insects the best remedy is ammonia applied to the spot. Afterwards put on pure olive oil, unsaited butter or fresh lard. • These remedies should be well rubbed in.

Grease Eradicator—One ounce of soap cut small. One quart of water; boil. Add when cool teaspoonful of saltpetre and one ounce and a half ammonia, cork.

Greasy Pans—Should be wiped with soft paper as soon as done with, then filled with cold water in which there has been put a teaspoonful of ammonia or a piece of washing soda the size of a bean.

Gumboil—To relieve a gumboil a homely remedy is to take a thin strip of dried fig, dip it in milk, toast, and then apply hot to the swollen gum. Relief is speedy.

Hair Brushes should not be washed in hot water or dried before a fire. They are best washed in soda and cold water and stood on their handles in a draught to dry. This will preserve the bristles.

Hiccough—In very troublesome cases ice may be applied to the throat. In children an emetic may be given or they may take a piece of sugar saturated with vinegar.

Heat Stroke—(Unconscious from) Carry patient into shade and if in a room carry out into the open air. Rest head and loosen and remove the clothes. Throw cold water on the head, neck and spine. Do not crowd around. Give no stimulants. Send for doctor.

Hoarseness—A good remedy appreciated by actors and singers; bake a lemon as one would an apple, squeeze a little of the thickened and heated juice over a lump of sugar and eat.

Honey—Will be found useful to disguise any nauseous drugs; it is frequently employed in gargles; when indulged in freely it has a laxative effect. It is wholesome but should not be taken in excess.

House Plants—To make house plants grow saturate them every day with the coffee left over from breakfast. Five or six drops of ammonia to every pint of water once a week will make them flourish.

Husky Voice—When the voice is husky it will be found a great relief to bathe the face and neck in cold water and afterwards rub briskly with a rough towel till the skin glows.

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lce to Keep—For lack of a refrigerator the ice should be wrapped in a thick strong cotton cloth and put in the cellar in a large tub supported in such a way that the water may run away.

Insect Powder-Get fresh green pennyroyal, dry it, reduce to fine powder, and sprinkle it where you are troubled with moths and other insects. It will drive them away.

Iron Mould in Linen—The spots should be placed over an earthenware pot or plate and moistened. Put saits of lemon on the spots and rub in with a bone or clean wood. Afterwards thoroughly rinse in warm water.

Jewellery—(To clean) Make a lather of common yellow soap and warm water. Wash the articles in this and brush them well. Wipe them dry and polish with a leather sprinkled with rouge.

Keep Disused Teapot Sweet—It is a good plan when putting away a teapot to put in the pot a few dried tealeaves this will keep the pot sweet and clean.

Kitchen Refuse—Should be burnt as quickly as possible and should on no account be thrown simply into the dustbin. If not convenient to burn it keep proper sanitary metal bins which can be cleaned out weekly.

Knee – (Inflamed) Inflammation will be relieved by hot fomentations and the knee should be rested for three or four days. Then friction will restore tone and strength.

Knives—Only the blades should be immersed in water. The handles may be cleaned with a soaped finanel. To restore whiteness of handles soak them in alum water for an hour then clean, wrap and leave them in a cloth to dry.

Lack of Appetite—Often after cooking a meal a person will have no appetite, for this, beat a raw egg till light, stir in a little milk and sugar and season with nutmeg. Drink a quarter of an hour before meals.

Lamp Chimneys—May be cleaned by holding them over the steam of a kettle first, and then polishing them with a soft rag or a piece of newspaper.

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Lamps—Some lamps, irrespective of the amount of care bestowed upon them in the way of cleaning always seem to burn dimly. This may be remedied by dropping small pieces of camphor into the bowl containing the oll.

Lamp Filling—Do not fill a lamp with oil to its utmost capacity but always leave space for the spirit to expand with the heat. Otherwise there is danger of an explosion,

Leaden Pipes—If the water is carried through the house by means of leaden pipes the water should be allowed to run to waste before using in the morning thus getting rid of the water that has lain in the pipes all night.

Lead Polsoning—Arises from a great variety of causes, as lead is an ingredient in nearly all cosmetics and in the wrapper of many articles of food. The symptoms are colic, loss of appetite, constipation, anu in some cases paralysis. Give salt as an emetic. Call the doctor.

Leather—(To clean) Dissolve in warm water a small quantity of oxalic acid and wash the leather with a sponge which has been dipped in this solution. When dry it will appear almost equal to new.

Lemons—Lemon juice will be found useful in cleaning the nails. The complexion is improved by the skin being rubbed with a slice of lemon. Black heads are removed by its use. It is a great cleanser and few things are better than lemon juice and water in colds.

Life insurance Policies—The premiums should always be paid promptly. A life policy may be assigned to anyone during the life of insurer; money may be raised on them and if the premiums cannot be kept up the policy may be sold to the company for a sum called the Surrender Value.

Linen--(To stiffen) After ironing linen place it near the fire or in the sun, until perfectly dry, as the garments will be much stiffer than if left to dry slowly. This hint is useful with collars and cuffs.

Linseed Poultice—Linseed should be free from grit. Pour some bolling water into a basin stir the meal into a consistence; beat the mass smooth and spread it on muslin. Apply it as hot as can be borne.

Lip Sores—Are usually traceable to some stomach trouble, consequently the treatment should be largely confined to setting the stomach right. The swelling may be reduced by cold applications or sal amoniac, vinegar and water; otherwise keep the lip dry. Avoid olntments.

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Mother's Milk—If not available, a substitute may be found in cows milk (two parts of milk to one of water) with a little sugar of milk added. If this is returned add lime water; and substitute barley water for plain water. —

Mustard Poultice—The cleanest way is to spread ordinary table mustard on damp, rough brown paper with a knife, and allow it to remain there for a minute then whe it all away carefully and apply the damp paper to the part. Apply white of egg to the skin first; this will prevent the plaster causing a blister.

Nail Biting is not always a wilful habit to be cured by some little punishment, but sometimes an indication of the first stage of nervous degeneration. The habit should be treated as a disease. It affects the general health as the pieces of sharp nail are swallowed and may cause appendicitis. A little bitter aloes rubbed on the finger tips will cure it in children.

Perspiration Stains may be removed from white wool or silk garments by sponging with warm water into which ammonia has been poured and then with clean water. Press before drying.

Plano Keys—To prevent these turning yellow give them plenty of light. Always eave the instrument open on fine days to whiten ivories cover with paste made of the best whiting and water. Leave on four hours, wipe and dry carefully and repeat the process twice.

Powdered Alum often works like magic in case of nose bleed; a pinch of it should be snuffed; another remedy said to be of great utility is to simply raise ones arms above the head.

Prickly Heat—A person who has broken out with prickly heat will find relief by dusting the parts several times a day with Baby's Own Powder.

Putty—Putty that has become hardened can easily be removed from glass without damage by applying a hot iron. It will then be rendered quite soft.

Raisins—(To Stone Easily) Pour boiling water over them and drain at once. Open and remove pips. This is a quick and easy process.

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Rat Holes in a house are an almost certain sign that there is a defective drain somewhere close by and the same should be traced with the utmost care to its source.

Removing Sticking Plaster-In removing strips of sticking plaster, draw the ends upwards towards the middle and in such a way as not to tear the edges of the wound apart.

Ribbons—(To Clean) Brush with ammonia and water on both sides, rinse in cold water and leave on table to dry. Do not iron but press slightly damp under a board.

Saucepans should be scrubbed out with hot soda and water, the lids as well; if anything has been burned in the pans boll some soda and water in them and then rub the inside with sand.

Saive—A good salve for burns, bruises, cuts and blisters is made by melting together an ounce of bees-wax and an ounce of sweet oil. Allow it to cool and then add an ounce of spirits of turpentine. Mix well.

Scald—(Slight) A scald may be slight as to occasion only a little pain and redness, and these effects speedly pass away. The application of oll or white of egg relieves the smarting. If much skin is scalded see the doctor.

Scorch Marks may be removed from linen by the following process; Squeeze the juice out of a couple of onions, cut up half an ounce of white soap, add two ounces of Fullers earth, mix, and add half a pint of vinegar, Boll, spread when cool over linen, let it stop on, wash out.

Screws—(To loosen when rusted into wood) Drop a small quantity of oil on to the screw top. Allow time for the oil to sink in and then the screw can be easily removed. A red hot poker held to the head of the screw is another remedy for the trouble.

Scrubbing Brushes when not in use should be turned bristles downward. They will last twice as long in this way as the moisture does not soak into the backs and loosen the bristles. Always shake dry continuing the shaking some time after the brush ceases to drip.

Scurf or Dandruff—Use a greasy hair lotion. A simple remedy is pure lard melted down and allowed to cool; rub this well into the scalp.

Shiny Coat can be renovated by sponging with equal parts of boiling water and ammonia. Brush well when dry.

Shivering Attacks—It is best not to disregard these as they may be fore-runners of something more serious. The patient should be given a dose of spirits of camphor in hot water and should be put to bed between blankets. Apply a hot water bottle.

Shocks —(Violent) In unconsclousness from shock loosen the clothing, raise the head, apply stimulants to the nose, smelling salts, burnt feathers, etc., and put hot water bottles to the feet. Send for the doctor.

Sick Room-Generally speaking it is a mistake to darken the sick room; let the sunshine come in to drive away the shadows and purify the air. To air the slekroom swing a door rapidly and quietly backwards and forward it will pump the bad air out of the room and draw in the fresh air from a window which is down at the top. Cover the patient to keep him out of the draught.

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Silk-(To Iron) Silk should first be sprinkled with water and then rolled up tightly in a towel. After this it may be ironed, and the creases will readily be taken out of the silk. See that the iron is not too hot or it will hurt the colors.

Silver and Plated, Articles "will be kept bright if allowed to soak occasionally in strong borax water for four or five hours. The water in which spoons and forks are washed must be bolling hot when first used; this hint will save much trouble in cleaning. It is said that if camphor be put away with new silver that the silver will never tarnish as long as the camphor is there.

Sore Throat—Mix the julce of one lemon with six teaspoonfuls of honey, and take one tablespoonful when throat is troublesome.

Specks Before the Eyes are often due to liver complaint but they may also appear in a patient who is run down through overwork or an anaemic subject. Rest, quiet and Dr. Williams' Pink Pills will be found curative.

Sprain—(Slight) When the sprain is very slight the treatment may be confined to cold water bathing of the part and the application of arnica.

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Swallowing a Fish Bone — When this causes choking press root of tongue down with finger so as to induce vomiting. If this fails try a mustard emetic; and failing this swallow a large piece of soft bread and potato.

Sweeping Carpets—Some old fashioned people believe in sweeping with a broom that is wet with salt and water. It is said that this makes the colors of the carpets bright and collects the surface dust.

Syringing the Ear — Never use cold water. A finger bowl should be employed to hola the warm water and to catch the current as it returns from the ear.

Tainted Fish—If there be any doubt as to whether fish is good or bad it should be thrown away. Stale fish is very poisonous especially fish that has no scales such as eels and shell fish.

Tea Stains—The most obstinate tea stains can be removed or washed out after equal parts of glycerine and yolk of egg have been applied and allowed to dry. Use clear cold water.

Teeth-(Care of the) The teeth should be cleaned night and morning and after each meal. But the spaces between the teeth must receive particular attention. For this purpose use a very fine tooth plck and brush the teeth with Baby's Own Powder.

Test Heat of Oven —Put a plece of white paper in the oven; if the oven is too hot the paper will blacken or blaze up; if it turns light brown the oven is fit for pastry; if light yellow the oven is ready for sponge cakes, etc.

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Tinned Fruits, Etc .- When the tins are once opened the contents should be immediately poured out into a china dish. This precaution also applies to tinned fish, etc. When buying canned fruit or other tinned goods note whether the top of the tin is concave or convex. If it is convex (bulging) the contents of the tin are not good and should not be bought. To test for copper (poisonous dye) open the tin and then plunge in the contents a bright steel knife. It should remain there for a few moments when if copper be present even in the smallest degree it will be deposited on the blade. Such food should be thrown away.

Tourniquet — (To stop Bleeding and How to Make) Tie a tape loosely around the arm or limb above the wound. Put the end of a stick under the loose tape on the arm and twist the stick round and round ' when tight make fast to arm.

Tubs Shrinking—Everyone knows how liable tubs are to shrink and what an inconvenience this is. It is a good plan to paint them well with glycerine and it will be found that there will be no more trouble in this direction.

Umbrellas—When an umbrella is wet do not fold up but close it and let it stand handle down so that the wet can-run off evenly instead of getting confined among the ribs at the ferrule end.

Varnish which shows white marks should be well rubbed with linseed oil and turpentine in equal parts and well shaken together in a bottle. Apply with cotton rag and polish with soft cloth.

Verdigris on Brass may be removed by rubbing with liquid ammonia.

Voice—A good and harmless remedy for strengthening and clearing the voice is to beat the white of an egg with the juice of a lemon and sweeten it well with sugar. Use as required.

Waking Up Unfreshed-Very few people appear to wake up "like giants refreshed." Now one thing is essential to this end, the bedroom must be airy and clean, no dusty carpets or curtains and closed windows. Learn to sleep with the mouth closed.

Wall Paper—That has become stained with soot and dust, particularly behind pictures, may be cleaned with stale bread; grease spots on wall paper can be removed by laying over them course brown paper and then passing a hot iron over it.

Wash Plants attacked by blight with water in which enough course tobacco has been soaked to make it the color of weak tea. Water the roots also with a little of the liquid; it will destroy insects and promote growth.

CONTAGIOUS DISEASES.

Scarlet Fever-Symptoms begin from one to eight days after exposure, with sore throat, lassitude, vomiting and high fever. The eruption shows on the first or second day. The characteristic symptom is the red color of the body. The disease continues seven or eight days, and is contagious during the "peeling" period.

Whooping Cough-Symptoms begin to show from two to seven days after exposure, but the characteristic cough is not generally heard until the second week. The duration of the disease is from six to eight weeks, and it may be caught as long as the "whoop" lasts.

Diphtheria—Usually begins with sore throat, weakness and fever, from two to ten days after exposure. It is characterized by the white membrane in the throat. The duration of the disease is from one to three weeks, and it may be catching from three to four weeks.

Mumps—The swelling below the ear, under the jaw, shows from one to three weeks after exposure. Chewing causes pain, and there is an inability to swallow sour things. The mumps last about a week, and they are contagious from three to four weeks.

HINTS ON THE CARE OF CHILDREN.

A child requires pure, warm air. The of temperature of the nursery should be maintained at from 67 to 70 degrees Farenheit. A child thrives best in a room heated by a wood fire in cold weather.

Great care should be taken not to expose children to draughts.
