MAY.
23. Both Houses of Parliament agree to an Address to the Queen for the removal of Sir John Barington from the office of Judge of the Court of Admiralty, Ireland.

28. A motion for radical reform is made in the House of Commons by Mr. O'Connell, and rejected by a majority of 319 to 13. A motion for a Committee on the state of the representation is then made by Lord John Russell, and is lost by a majority of 213 to 117.

29. A meeting of subscribers and gentlemen is held at the City of London Tavern, for the purpose of forming a Irish Bank Banking Company.

— From returns made by Mr. Irving, the Inspector-General of Imports and Exports, it appears that for the last 20 years—the greatest quantity of hops imported into Great Britain was 53,555 cwt., in 1818, when the amount was 33,555 cwt., and in 1849, the average duty was about £2.0.0 a year for the other years.

JUNE.
1. Returns are made to the Home Office, by the Commissioners of Police, from which it appears that the number of men employed is 2,314, the divisions 17, and the population 1,213,181.

3. Mr. Speller makes a motion, in the House of Commons, for the introduction of post laws in the land, which is negatived without a division.
