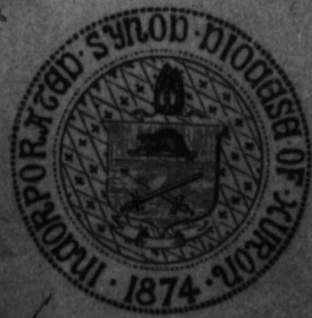

The Incorporated Synod of the Diocese of Huron.

TWENTY-FIRST SESSION,

(Being the Fourth under the Act of Incorporation of 1874.)

FIRST DAY.

The Synod was convened in London, on Tuesday, June 18th, 1878.

Divine Service was held in the Chapter House, at 11 a. m., when the Lord Bishop ordained nine candidates to the Diaconate, and advanced seven Deacons to the order of the Priesthood.

The sermon was preached by the Rev. Dr. Sullivan, of Chicago, from St. Luke, xvii, 20.

The Holy Communion was administered by the Bishop to the Clergy and Lay Representatives.

The Synod assembled in the Chapter House at a quarter-past 3 o'clock p. m.

The Bishop in the Chair.

The customary prayer having been offered by the Bishop, the rolls of the Clergy and Lay Representatives were called by the respective Secretaries, when 90 Clergymen and 76 Lay Delegates answered to their names.

Election of Secretaries.

Lay Certificates.

The Report of the Scrutineers appointed by the Bishop to examine the Certificates of the Lay Representatives was presented by the Lay Secretary, as follows:—

The Committee appointed to examine the Certificates of the Lay Delegates beg to report that they have done so, and find 156 Certificates, reporting the election of 196 Delegates.

The Certificates appear to be all in order, with the under-mentioned exceptions:—

Those from Tuscarora and Walpole Island give the names of two Delegates in each case, stating at the same time that there are 50 registered voters. The Constitution provides for the election of two Delegates only when the number of registered voters exceeds 50.

The Certificate from Kincardine gives the names of two Delegates, but omits to state the number of registered voters.

The Committee observes that in two cases it is stated that substitutes were elected, in case the Delegates were unable to attend. The Constitution provides only for the election of a substitute after the Delegate elected has resigned; and then at a meeting duly called for the purpose of electing a substitute.

Even the very difficulties and obstructions we have to encounter are made subservient by the faithfulness of our covenant-keeping God to the advancement of His cause, thereby furnishing us with fresh assurance that He unto whom all power is given in Heaven and in earth is with us in truth—fully realising, what was such an unspeakable comfort to the Apostle. *"If God be for us, who can be against us?"*

It is my fervent prayer, that the great Head of the Church may now be in our midst, and that He would bless this our assembly with the grace of the Holy Spirit, to guide and influence us in all our deliberations, that with brotherly love and simplicity of heart, we may endeavour to advance the kingdom of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

CONFIRMATIONS.

I desire here to acknowledge with thankfulness, the activity and self-denying zeal of many of our Clergy; that their

labors this past year have been even more abundant than heretofore, is evidenced by the exceptionally large number of candidates presented to me for confirmation, viz., 1,843, being more than double the number confirmed in the previous year.

GENERAL ACTIVITY AND PROSPERITY THROUGHOUT THE DIOCESE.

It has been most gratifying to me to witness, in my visitations, how active the Clergy have been in their local parochial labors, and how heartily the laity have co-operated with them in all their efforts to advance the best interests of the Church.

INCREASE OF CLERGY.

It is no small cause of devout gratitude to God, that we are enabled to record a still further increase in the number of our Diocesan Clergy, so that I can now not only supply missions that have long remained vacant, but also can occupy fresh fields of labour.

ORDINATIONS.

The large ordination, which it was my privilege to hold this morning, will be hailed with rejoicing by all who earnestly desire an increase of laborers in the Lord's vineyard, as a sign of hope for the future of the still unsupplied portions of our vast mission field.

Nine Deacons were this day added to the number of our working Clergy, and seven advanced to the Priesthood.

This is the largest ORDINATION ever held in this Diocese—the largest, I believe, ever held in the Dominion of Canada.

While we thank God and take courage from this sign of His blessing on our work, we must recognise in this large accession to our staff of Missionaries, a fruit of the appropriation to the Mission work of the "*Surplus Commutation Fund*," as without the addition thereby made to the resources at our disposal, it would have been impossible for us to have found means for the employment of additional laborers in the spiritual harvest.

HURON COLLEGE.

The very training afforded by this Institution, has created a demand for yet higher educational facilities, to meet the growing intellectual wants of our young men.

THE WESTERN UNIVERSITY.

The Alumni of Huron College have themselves been the first movers for the establishment of a Western University, and with reference to the announcement which I made on this subject at our last Synod, I have great satisfaction in stating now, that the Act of its Incorporation has been passed by the Legislature.

I believe that no undertaking having for its object the establishment on a permanent basis of a thoroughly Protestant University education has ever been submitted to the Christian public, which is more fairly entitled to their sympathy and co-operation and more calculated to yield an abundant return in present and prospective fruits of usefulness, than this, our Western University.

Now, that after many years of labor, my hopes for the advancement of higher Christian education in this country have so far been realized, I feel the occasion to be a fitting one for appealing on behalf of our Western University to the many friends of intellectual advancement, who, independent of locality and other external conditions, desire the establishment of our young men in those Protestant and Evangelical principles which constitute the only sound foundation of character, and the surest guarantee for the future spiritual and moral welfare of any people.

The urgent demand by the youth of this western portion of the Province for high intellectual culture has given a fresh impetus to our efforts to secure to the West a seat of learning, where not only the highest instruction combined with sound Christian principles may be afforded, but where, also, those Academic honours and distinctions may be bestowed which, when fairly and laboriously gained, are never without their due value in any country.

I dare not hesitate in asking for aid in this work, as every year we allow to pass without making an active commencement, must place us and the principles we profess at a great disadvantage, and be injurious to the interests of this large and important section of the country, and our undertaking is of such magnitude, that necessary as it is to us, I feel at this present time, in this new country, we cannot hope to accomplish our wishes without external help.

With a view of placing the entire subject more clearly before the Christian public, I here venture to sketch briefly the history of the present movement, from its original inception up to the present moment.

Huron College, hitherto the only institution for the higher education of young men in the western section of Ontario, was incorporated in 1862, as the Theological College of this Diocese. Its establishment was due to the conviction, which forced itself upon the mind of my revered predecessor—Dr. Cronyn—the first Bishop of Huron, of the need of some provision for training young men to supply the missions of this vast and growing Diocese with a body of Clergy sound in the faith and established in the pure Protestant principles of our martyred Reformers. This was one of the objects dearest to his heart, and his earnest labours for its attainment will ever be remembered with warm and lasting gratitude by all lovers of God's truth.

It was my privilege to be associated with the late Bishop in the founding of this Divinity College, twice proceeding to England, as his commissary to plead its cause and to obtain the necessary funds for its endowment.

Through the liberal gifts of friends of evangelical truth in England, not only were the grounds and buildings of Huron College secured for ever to the Trustees for the purposes of a Theological College and the two Chairs of Divinity and Classics permanently endowed, but several scholarships were founded for the assistance and encouragement of deserving students. Amongst the benefactors of the College, one valued friend alone, the Rev. Alfred Peache, endowed the Divinity Chair with the munificent gift of £5,000.

With these advantages, Huron College has faithfully fulfilled its trust, and efficiently served its designed end during

the last 16 years of the Church of the Cross.

the last 16 years, having equipped and furnished for the work of the Church in the Diocese nearly 60 able and devoted soldiers of the Cross.

While acknowledging, with deep gratitude to the great Head of the Church, the measure of success thus far vouchsafed to our efforts, we cannot but recognize that the time has come when an extension and strengthening of our educational machinery is called for.

It is evident, that in these days of active religious thought and enquiry, when the public mind is so universally agitated with controversy and excited by the bold discussion of the most vital truths, it is essential that those who are sent forth with the commission to teach and to preach, should be fully equipped with sound learning and well disciplined powers to enable them to cope with the many specious forms of error that are actively at work in the Church of Christ.

To secure such a training for our young men in General Knowledge, Arts, Literature, Science, and Languages, it is absolutely necessary that our existing system should be extended, our course of study developed into University proportions, and our present Professorial Staff commensurately augmented.

More than a year ago (February 1877) I was waited upon by a deputation, consisting of the very Rev. Dean Boomer, the Rev. Professor Halpin and a large number of the Alumni of Huron College, who presented an address expressive of their gratitude for the benefits already derived from the College, and their earnest desire to see the Diocese fully supplied with all the appliances requisite for the highest intellectual training.

For this end they were solicitous to add the crowning achievement of establishing a University based upon sound Evangelical and Protestant principles, to my previous labours in behalf of higher education in this portion of Ontario. The petition was accompanied with the warmest declarations of sympathy and assurances of co-operation in furtherance of the undertaking, and the Alumni, as a body, have since vouched the sincerity of these assurances by making the most noble and self-denying sacrifices in subscribing liberally to the University fund.

Fully concurring as I did in the views of the petitioners, I naturally welcomed so good an opportunity of attaining the realization of what had long been the aspiration of my heart.

Since then the subject has been kept before the public, the proposed undertaking having been freely commented upon by the press, and the general sentiment, as expressed in such comments, has been decidedly in favor of the enterprise.

In order fully to test the public feeling in its favor, a subscription list was opened, and in a short time the sum of about \$30,000 was subscribed.

In additional proof of the favor with which the project is regarded, I would state, that in the discussion of the measure in Parliament, it received the support of leading men of all political and religious opinions, and the Bill of Incorporation with University powers was passed by a large majority.

It is believed that, from all these circumstances, those to whom we appeal will recognise evidences of both the necessity and desirability of the enterprise we have taken in hand, and we cannot but feel justified in anticipating that those who have at heart the prosperity of our beloved Church, will aid us to secure in this Province in perpetuity the benefits of a truly Protestant and Evangelical University, by generously extending to us that assistance in word and deed of which we stand in need.

DIOCESAN MISSIONS.

In reference to our Missionary operations during the past year, I cannot conceal my satisfaction and thankfulness to God, in being able to record a continuance of prosperity, manifested by an increase in each of the voluntary funds for Diocesan purposes, making a total income of \$12,179.57, being an increase of income over last year of \$306.79 (irrespective of the sum of \$2,359.53 contributed by the Diocese for the sufferers by the St. John fire).

And this increase has taken place at a time when the country is still suffering under the financial depression of several years past; and notwithstanding that a pamphlet finding fault with the administration of the Synod, has been widely circulated. Nothing, we believe, under God, but the thorough loyalty and general good sense of churchmen throughout the

Diocese and their confidence in the just and impartial administration by this Synod of every fund committed to its trust, has rendered these attacks, to which I feel myself constrained to refer, comparatively innocuous.

While speaking thus thankfully and hopefully of the continued general prosperity of our funds, I cannot but express the regret with which I observe that the returns of several of our Parishes, which in former years have been, and some are still, recipients of our Diocesan funds—do not show a support of our Mission work at all commensurate with their obligations and capabilities. Some exhibit an actual falling off in their contributions, which argues a sad lack of interest in the highest of all causes committed to us. In connection with this, I would point out, that the barometer which indicates the state of healthy vigour or of waning life in which a parish exists, is necessarily this interest in the Mission work of the Church in the Diocese at large, distinguished from that of the congregation and its mere local claims, as shown by the rise or fall in the amount of aid voluntarily contributed.

This must always be more or less a subject for consideration when the claims of a Clergyman or Parish on the Diocese are brought forward, as it is plain that Diocesan claims must be based upon loyal Diocesan work. If in a smaller parish a Clergyman has exhibited little or no success in eliciting the active sympathies of his people, stirring them to earnest living work, there is no ground for expecting any other result from his removal to a larger and more influential sphere, than the drying up and dwindling away of whatever vital energies it may have.

It may be truly said, that there can be no more certain symptom of a low state of religious feeling in the individual professor of Christianity and in a congregation collectively, than apathy on the subject of Missions.

Where men think strongly they act with energy. Where they are deeply impressed with the importance of an object, they are zealously affected in promoting it. The very Pharisees would compass sea and land to make one proselyte—should evangelists in the Christian cause limit the sphere of their ministrations to a circumscribed locality and be slow to extend the kingdom of Christ beyond them?

The Apostle Paul confessed himself a debtor both to the Greek and to the Barbarian, though as an Israelite, of the seed of Abraham, and Tribe of Benjamin, his heart's desire and prayer to God for Israel was, that they might be saved. He thought it not much, that he was "in journeyings often; in perils of water; in perils of robbers; in perils of my own countrymen; in perils by heathen; in perils in the city; in perils in the wilderness; in perils in the sea; in perils among false brethren; * * * besides those things that are without, that which cometh upon me daily, the care of all the Churches."

He was ready to spend and be spent in his Master's service.

See him at Lystra rending his clothes, and running in among the people, and periling his life in his jealousy for God's honour, and for spreading Gospel truth! See him at Miletus steadfastly purposing to go to Jerusalem, unmoved by the knowledge of the bonds and afflictions, which awaited him in every city.

See him at Athens—the nursing mother of idolatry, the very centre of superstitious vanities, as he stood on Areopagus and looked round on the city of orators and poets and marked the groves and porches of her philosophers, the concourse of nations thronging to her crowded forum, the monuments of literature and science arising on every side in all the purest forms of art, unmatched as yet by the rivalry of succeeding ages, there would be much in the scene before him to rivet his attention, much to invite research, much to provoke comparison and contrast. As a citizen of no mean city, glorying in the name of Roman, and in the unpurchased freedom of his birthright, he would not view without interest the citadel of that famous people, whose restless activity had long struggled for the Dominion of the world, and had coped successfully with the mightiest nations which those times had known.

Such doubtless would have been the reflections of Saul ere he journeyed to Damascus—very different, however, were the thoughts which engrossed the soul of the converted Apostle of the Gentiles! "His spirit was stirred within him, when he saw the city wholly given to idolatry." He waits no longer for Silas and Timotheus: he longs to turn the inhabitants of a place, where there were almost as many Gods as men, from the service

of idols, and of Satan in them, to the service of the true and living God in Christ. He disputes in the Synagogue with the Jews and with the devout persons, and in the market, daily with them that met with him. He straightway preaches unto them Jesus and the Resurrection. How happens it then, that what so stirred the Apostle's spirit, falls with so much deadness on the hearts of the Christian world in general? It is no token for good, when the sympathies of the heart are checked, or the hand is closed by the cold and calculating enquiry, "*Am I my brother's keeper?*" He, who has himself tasted of the well of life, longs to roll away the stone from the top of the well, that others may taste of the same living water. He, who has felt his own personal helplessness and inability, and knows by experience, that the natural man receiveth not the things that are of God, is touched with a sense of deep compassion for that evil heart of unbelief, which is yet dead in trespasses and sin.

He, who has bowed in deep humility at the foot of the Cross, and there has touched as it were the extremest hem of Christ's garment, cannot refrain from speaking out of the abundance of his heart. He will tell unceasingly of the fountain opened for sin and uncleanness; and point to the Lamb, slain from the foundation of the world, and rest neither day nor night till the numbers of those are multiplied, who join with him in ascribing to the Redeemer "power and riches and wisdom and strength and honour and glory and blessing." His prayers for his brethren—wherever scattered—will be like that of his blessed Master, that they may be delivered from the evil.

I am fully aware and deeply sensible too, that our local wants are great and urgent, and I would not withdraw from the channels by which they are at present watered, one drop of the stream of charity. But we know on inspired authority that "he that watereth others shall be watered himself." "There is that scattereth and yet increaseth," that "he that openeth his hand maketh himself rich;" and that he is blessed by the giver of all good gifts in double measure, who casts his mite into Christ's treasury, in token of his love towards his Master's cause. I would say to all my brethren, who are sensible of their blessed condition in living beneath the influence of Gospel light—"to do good and to communicate forget not for with such sacrifices God is well pleased."

In order then to maintain our Missionary operations and supply the demand of our increasing population in the remoter parts of the Diocese, more strenuous efforts must be made by the members of the Church to supply the necessary means.

In thus appealing for material aid, I desire to guard against any expression that would imply an unscriptural estimate of the value of human means; I would unequivocally disclaim the sentiment, that our prosperity as a Diocese is to be measured by the silver and gold which are brought into our treasury. It is within the range of human capacity to collect and to expend a large annual sum for the attainment of the noblest of objects; but however well concerted the plans of a Christian organization may be, however wise its measures and extended its labours, all would come to nought unless its plans and measures and labours, are "begun, continued and ended in Him" "without, whom nothing is strong and nothing holy." "Not by might nor by power, but by my spirit, saith the Lord."

Let it not, however, be forgotten, that God has appointed His Church to be the instrument of her own enlargement, that she has received the light of divine truth, in order that she may exhibit it to the world, and that by her efforts, God has manifested His glory in the face of Jesus Christ to the conversion of sinners.

That she has not duly felt the sacredness of the truth, or been fully awakened to a sense of her immense responsibilities, the awful extent of Satan's empire at the present day is a decisive evidence.

Let her view of duty, her encouragements and hopes, be drawn from the Record of divine truth; and above all, let the constraining love of Christ be felt in all its heavenly influence; then will her dormant energies be stimulated; she will arise with becoming zeal to the Lord's work, and neither the messengers of salvation, nor the means of helping them forward in their labours will then be wanting, but the mystery of the Gospel will, according to the commandment of the everlasting God, be made known for obedience to the faith of all nations.

And I ask you for your constant prayers, that our heavenly Father may be with me and prosper me to do His will.

Now farewell, thanking you for the long continued sympathy and support which you extended to me on every occasion, I now commend you and your's to the safe and holy keeping of our God, and pray that you may be "steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, for as much as you know that your labour is not in vain in the Lord."

Presenting Memorials, Petitions, &c.

The Clerical Secretary presented,

(1) A communication from the General Manager of the Great Western Railway, acknowledging receipt of a resolution forwarded to him by the Synod at the last session.

(2) The following copy of a resolution received from the the Secretary-Treasurer of the Diocese of Niagara:—

That the co-operation of the several Dioceses in the Province of Ontario be sought, in an application to the Provincial Legislature for a general amended Church Temporalities' Act; and that for this purpose a committee of three be named by the Bishop, to communicate with the several Dioceses on the subject, requesting their appointment of similar committees, to which Joint Committee shall be entrusted the duty of maturing such a Bill as shall meet the requirements of the Church in this Province, and report the same at the next meeting of their respective Synods.

Reports of Committees.

Mr. John Beard presented the Report of the Committee on the systematic discharge of the duty of the Synod with respect to the Diocese of Algoma, and gave notice that he would move its adoption on the next day.

The Committee appointed to provide for the more systematic discharge of the duty of the Synod with respect to the Diocese of Algoma,—

Beg to report that they have given the subject full consideration.

That it appears from the Report of the Bishop of Algoma, presented at the last session of the Provincial Synod, that he has been compelled to devote a large portion of his time to soliciting that aid from the Church in Canada, which, in his opinion, in which opinion the Committee coincide, should have been furnished without such solicitation. It further appears from the same report that the result of his appeal has not been the provision of sufficient funds to enable him to carry on his work as it should be.

The Committee cannot but express the opinion that the Church in Canada does not appear to have realized its responsibility in the matter.

It was quite understood, when the Provincial Synod set apart a Missionary Diocese and elected a Bishop to take charge of it, that provision must be made for carrying on the work; and the Bishop had reason to express surprise and regret that instead of being enabled to devote his attention to the work he had been selected for, he was compelled to go through the country asking for Funds.

The Committee is of the opinion that it is the duty of each Diocese to contribute its proportion of the amount required to carry on the work in the Diocese of Algoma. The Committee is aware that the income of the Synod is already insufficient to meet the demands on it, and does not therefore propose any charge on it in aid of this fund, but is of opinion that there are many members of the Church throughout the Diocese, who would be willing to contribute somewhat towards this object if it was brought specially under their notice, and therefore propose that an appeal be prepared and printed in the condensed report for this year which is circulated in the Diocese, trusting that the prominence which is thereby given to the subject will cause greater interest

That whereas there are certain Rectories in the Diocese of Huron, created under patent from the Crown; and whereas by an Act of the Provincial Parliament bearing date 15th August, 1866, all surplus revenue appertaining to such Rectories over the sums of \$3,000 in Cities, \$2,000 in Towns, and \$1,600 in Townships, became alienated from the said Rectories and the Synod empowered to distribute the said surplus among the Rectors or Incumbents within the Corporate limits of said Cities, Towns or Townships respectively;

Address to the Bishop.

In accordance with the resolution of the Rev. Canon Nelles, the following address to the Lord Bishop was read by the Rev. Canon Caulfeild:

Address to the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of Huron, by the Clergy and Lay Delegates of the Synod of the Diocese, June, 1878:—

In view of your Lordship's speedy departure from among us for a brief visit to the Mother Land, which you have announced in your address, we, the undersigned Clergy and Lay Delegates of the Diocese, in Synod assembled, desire to approach your Lordship with the expression of our sincere and loyal attachment both to your person and office. We are fully aware of the weighty considerations which have necessitated this temporary separation from us on the part of your Lordship, and we beg to assure you of our hearty sympathy in regard to the very important duties that must devolve upon you during your absence. It will, we trust, be a source of great satisfaction to yourself to participate in the deliberations of the great Council of the Church, convened by His Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury, and we have every confidence that your Lordship will worthily represent the Diocese over which you preside, and that the voice which has so often and so boldly been lifted up in the past on behalf of those Protestant and Evangelical principles which are the safeguard and the glory of our Reformed Church, will never fail to be heard in their defence when those principles are either assailed or endangered.

Another important duty devolving upon your Lordship is the advocacy of the claims of the contemplated Western University upon the sympathy and co-operation of our fellow-churchmen in England. Recognizing, as we do, the increasing necessity of such an institution to meet the demands of the whole Protestant population of Western Canada for a higher class of education, and especially the perpetuation of those true Evangelical principles so incorporated with the life and success of our Church, we thankfully and confidently entrust this matter to your Lordship's care. We thoroughly appreciate the many difficulties you must encounter in bringing this subject under the favorable consideration of those best able and most willing to assist us; still, we have every expectation that, with God's blessing upon your endeavors, you will yet be spared to see in the future flourishing University of this Diocese the full accomplishment of that noble plan for the Christian education of our people, which your Lordship has already advanced to so remarkable a degree.

In conclusion, we have great pleasure in being able at this season heartily to congratulate your Lordship on the happy and prosperous condition of the Diocese over which you have so ably and successfully presided. The rapid development of the country has made unusual demands upon the resources of the Church. These demands, however, notwithstanding the continued financial depression, have met with a most liberal response. We are gratified to find that the contributions to the Mission Fund are even in excess of the past year, whilst a great advance has been made by many of the older parishes in the direction of self-support. In the growing prosperity and stability of the Church in this Diocese, in the general peace and harmony that are everywhere prevalent, as well as in the unusually large Ordinations held by your Lordship in the last two years, we cannot fail to recognize the blessing of God upon your administration of its affairs; and we fervently pray that your Lordship may long be spared to watch over the affairs of our Diocese, and guide us to fresh effort for the glory of God and the advancement of His Church.

Commending your Lordship and family to the Divine protection, and praying that His blessing may attend you in all your journeyings, and, in due time, restore you to us again in peace and safety, we beg to subscribe ourselves your Lordship's attached and faithful servants.

The Bishop, in reply, thanked his brethren for the kind and affectionate address which had just been read. He could not conceal the great comfort which he derived from this expression of their confidence in his administration, which inspired him more and more to carry on the work of the Diocese with perseverance and zeal. Whilst there necessarily existed diversities of opinion amongst them, he was happy to believe that they had learned to love one another, and to unite in endeavoring to promote that blessed cause for which the martyrs died.

With reference to the Western University, if he was spared to carry out his wishes in its establishment, it would in all probability be the last educational effort of his life. He thought that our Western Church ought to be in a position to supply a high-class Christian education. He had no doubt that, relying on God's assistance, he should succeed in his object. There were kind Christian friends in England, who he expected would help this work.

Asking for the prayers of his brethren, both in public and in private, he commended them to the grace of God, and hoped that nothing would ever occur to mar that Christian sympathy which existed between himself and his clergy. He stood in the sight of God, with warm feelings in his heart towards all his brethren, to whom he was tied by a stronger and more sacred bond than earthly ties—the love of Christ.

Annual Diocesan Missionary Meeting.

The Annual Missionary Meeting in connexion with the Synod of the Diocese of Huron was held in St. Paul's Church, London, on Tuesday evening, June 19th, 1877.

The Lord Bishop of Huron in the Chair.

Prayer having been offered up by Rev. Canon Innes, the opening hymn—"The Church's One Foundation"—was sung.

The Chairman briefly addressed the meeting, referring to the continued prosperity of the Diocese, and the increase of the missionary work.

The Rev. C. W. Stoeking, D. D., Rector of Grace Church, Detroit, then addressed the meeting. He spoke of the Missionary work as one of the greatest privileges of the Church, and pointed out the practical benefits to be derived from a true missionary spirit. He congratulated the Diocese upon its increased power and prosperity.

The Chairman then called on the Rev. E. Sullivan, D. D., Rector of Trinity Church, Chicago.

Rev. Dr. Sullivan said that he was glad to hear that the Diocese was in such a flourishing condition, particularly during the last five years, which have been years of financial stringency. He thought it was on the other side of the line that they had rapid growth. Perhaps this was so commercially, but he could say that no Church in the States, in the same years, had grown in the same proportion. The secret was that the Diocese of Huron was waking up, and realizing the Divine mission. Growth was the sign of life. The principle was universal: The individual believer showed growth, and the Church of Christ should grow. It was only fulfilling the Divine command—"Go ye into all the world." The early Church was a missionary Church, and therefore it grew. The promise that Christ would be with the Church was coupled with the command to go forth and preach. The Rev. Doctor said there were tens of thousands in the Diocese who were perishing for lack of spiritual food, and he called upon those parishes which had enough, and to spare, to supply them with the comforting ministrations of the Church. Charity, it was true, began at home, but when the home wants are supplied, we ought to think of those perishing without. In the days of Malachi they had hard times, and the prophet, not the publican, explained the cause. The people had robbed the Lord by not giving Him His tithes, and at the present day we were not dealing fairly with the Lord. He believed that the correct financial system for the Church was voluntary contributions, given week by week by the congregation according to their means. He next referred to the torn state of the Church. As far as this dissension touched men or party, he did not regret it; it was the natural outgrowth of individuality. But he had no patience with Ritualism and gaudy ceremonial, which were only fit for mannikin clergymen. These dissensions were bringing the Church, through suffering, to perfection.

The Choir of St. Paul's then sung the anthem—"Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace," etc., Isaiah, xxvi., 3, 4, 13, 14.

The Chairman then introduced the next speaker, the Rev. H. Harris, D. D., Rector of Christ Church, Detroit, and acting President of the Convention of the Diocese of Michigan.

Rev. Dr. Harris drew a contrast between the missionary work in this country and the States. Here the mission was principally to lapsed members of the Church, while in the States the missionary work was largely to gain those who had never been connected with the Church, and he thought the Canadian system gave more interest to the work. Another secret of the success of Canadian missionary work was the endowments which were enjoyed in Canada. As largely as the Diocese had done, he believed that they could do better yet. Those parishes which had endowments could give more. There was a question frequently asked on the other side with reference to missionary work—Does it pay? We find the answer in the one verse, "What shall it profit a man if he gain the whole world and lose his own soul?" Was not the saving of a single soul worth the expenditure of a vast amount of property? There was another embarrassment. It was sometimes a fact that men were put in the missionary field who were not good at anything else. We should have the best and strongest men for the work. The secret was, we had not enough first-class men, and we had too many men who were a failure.

Hymn 91—"Hark the Song of Jubilee"—was sung, after which a collection was made in aid of the Mission Fund of the Diocese.

The Doxology having been sung, the Lord Bishop pronounced the benediction.

Notwithstanding the continued commercial depression under which the whole country is suffering, the Diocese, by the blessing of Almighty God, is steadily advancing, both in spiritual and material growth. In the numerous beautiful church edifices that have been built, and in the energetic commencement, and in many cases the successful completion of her various Parochial and Diocesan undertakings, our beloved Church of England has in this Diocese abundantly exhibited daily increasing signs of life and activity.

DIOCESAN INCOME.

It is a cause of sincere gratification to your Committee that they are able to report that every fund which forms part of our Diocesan voluntary income shows an increase over the returns of the previous year.

THE MISSION FUND.

The accounts show that the expenditure for the year amounted to \$12,979.49, being the largest amount hitherto expended in any one year since the formation of the Diocese without exceeding the income of the Fund and creating fresh liability.

Fifty missions received assistance towards paying the necessary stipend for their clergymen, besides the usual provision for Indian catechists and teachers.

SUPERANNUATION.

In addition to the sum of \$3,674.99 paid over to the Mission Fund, the surplus Commutation Fund was in the first place applied to the relief of nine superannuated clergymen, involving an expenditure for the year of \$3,018.38.

WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

This fund continues to prosper in a most marked degree.

The collections during the year amounted to \$1,154.59, being an increase over last year of \$7.62. The sum of \$2,500 has been added to the capital during the year, making now a total invested capital of \$52,196.08.

Three more widows must be added to the Pension List, making 14 in all.

The Committee feel truly thankful that they are able to meet all these claims from the income of this fund, and they appeal confidently to the members of our Church to sustain the cause of the widow and the fatherless.

MISSIONARY MEETINGS.

Notwithstanding the extraordinary mildness of the winter, which at times rendered the roads almost impassable, the meetings as a whole were well attended, and much interest in missionary work exhibited.

The number of meetings held was 192.

One-half of the proceeds of the collections are devoted to Foreign Missions.

The total collections amounted to \$1,191.59, being \$216.75 more than last year, and the largest amount ever received from this source.

DAY OF THANKSGIVING.

The proceeds of this collection are applied towards defraying the amount guaranteed by the Synod to the stipend of the Bishop of Algoma.

139 Congregations gave \$688.71 to this object, being \$18.91 more than last year.

The Committee would suggest that His Lordship the Bishop be respectfully requested to arrange that the annual Diocesan Day of Thanksgiving shall be permanently held on the second Sunday in October, and thus avoid any conflict with the Government Day of Thanksgiving, and also with the Day of Intercession, usually named by the House of Bishops in the month of November.

FOREIGN MISSIONS.

By the vote of Synod, the balance on hand, \$594.83, was given to Rev. Dr. Riley, Bishop Elect of Mexico.

Collections were made in the London Churches for the same object.

Collections were made on the Day of Intercessory Prayer appointed by the House of Bishops.

74 Congregations contributed \$390.26, being \$149.01 beyond last year's receipts.

This amount, together with the half of the collections made at the missionary meetings, awaits the disposal of the Synod.

The Hellmuth Ladies' College Missionary Association contributed their annual grant of \$48.67 to the African mission work.

St. Paul's, London, also gave a collection of \$90 to the Diocese of Saskatchewan.

The total amount contributed to Foreign Missions is \$707.30, being \$417.38 in excess of last year.

ST. JOHN FIRE.

In accordance with the wishes of the Synod, the Bishop issued a Pastoral requesting that a collection might be made in all our Churches on behalf of the sufferers by this appalling calamity. Notwithstanding the unfavorable period of the year and the financial stringency that prevailed, the appeal was most heartily responded to, and collections were made by 169 congregations, yielding, with a few donations, the sum of \$2,359.53, which was promptly forwarded to the proper authorities, and duly received and acknowledged with the warmest gratitude.

The Committee cannot help feeling that our covenant-keeping God, who put it into the hearts of our people thus to devise liberal things for their heavily-afflicted brethren in St. John, has amply blessed their efforts, and by His continued care and protecting providence over the successful working of the Synod during the past year, has fulfilled his promise "that the liberal soul shall be made fat, and he that watereth shall be watered also himself."

The Society for the Propagation of the Gospel In Foreign Parts.

The Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge.

The Colonial and Continental Church Society.

The Committee deem it but right to call the attention of the Synod to the continued liberality of these three noble societies.

The S. P. G. still continues its annual grant of £400 to our mission work.

The Col. and Con. Ch. Society places annually at the disposal of the Bishop and the Standing Committee the sum of \$651.

The S. P. C. K. has, during the past year, paid grants to 5 churches, amounting to \$867.04, and has also placed at the disposal of the Bishop for new churches, another grant of service books.

The printed accounts, as usual, show the position of the various other Trust Funds.

In Churches where Service is not held every Sunday, the collections should be made as near the above date as can be.

Where Churches are free [i. e., where the pews are not rented], and the Clergymen's stipend is dependent upon the Offertory, it is understood that such arrangements as are practical will be made; in all other cases, the whole of the collections should be devoted to the object named.

The attention of Clergymen is specially called to the following extract from the Widows' and Orphans' Canon:—"III. That in order to entitle the widow and orphans of any Clergyman to enjoy the annuity hereafter provided, he must, from his ordination or entrance into the Diocese, have become and continued to be an annual subscriber of at least five dollars to the funds of the Synod, or have become a life member of the former Church Society of the said Diocese, and have made all the collections and subscriptions called for, for the Synod, unless excused therefrom by a written dispensation from the Lord Bishop."

PAROCHIAL ASSOCIATION COLLECTIONS.

Collections should be made, as far as possible, FROM EVERY MEMBER OF THE CHURCH.

All Collections and Subscriptions for each financial year, and the lists of the names of subscribers in each Parish should be sent to the Secretary-Treasurer by the 31st of March, otherwise they will lie over until the next year's report.

This appeal is made to the members of the Church in the Diocese of Huron in accordance with the recommendation of a Committee appointed "to provide for the more systematic discharge of the duty of the Synod with respect to the Diocese of Algoma."

The Diocese of Algoma was set apart in the year 1873 by the Church in Canada, as represented in the Provincial Synod, as a Missionary Diocese, and a truly noble work it was, had it been well sustained. A Bishop was elected, and a moderate income was guaranteed for five years by the various Synods represented in the Provincial Synod at the time, but no systematic provision was made for funds to carry on the work, beyond the appointment of a Secretary-Treasurer in each Diocese.

It was quite understood when the Diocese was set apart, and the Bishop elected, that it was a purely Missionary Diocese, entirely unable to do anything, at present, towards its own support, and that it was the duty of the Church in Canada to provide the funds necessary to enable the Bishop to carry on the work, at least, with some degree of efficiency. The Bishop, in his last report, refers with much regret to the fact that he had been compelled to devote a great portion of his time to soliciting the aid which, in his opinion, it was the duty of the Church in Canada to furnish without such solicitation on his part, and that in consequence he had been unable to devote as much time to the work in his Diocese as he would otherwise have done. The result of the Bishop's appeals to the various Dioceses has been far from sufficient to enable him to carry on his work as he would wish. The Muskoka region, which forms part of his Diocese, is being settled chiefly by poor emigrants, who, for some time to come, will have all they can do to establish themselves, and may reasonably look to their fellow-colonists in the older settled portions of Canada to assist them, by contributing towards the funds required to furnish them and their families with religious instruction and the opportunity of enjoying the services of our Church. Many of those who now are enjoying their comfortable homes, and have the privilege of attending public worship every Sunday, will remember the time when weeks and months, and in some cases years, went by without their having such privilege, and such recollection will, no doubt, lead them gladly to avail themselves of the opportunity of saving their fellow-churchmen in Muskoka from suffering in the same way.

In course of time this portion of the Diocese will, no doubt, become self-supporting.

The rest of the Diocese, beyond a few scattered settlements chiefly on the shore of Lake Superior, is inhabited by the aborigines, many of them still in Pagan darkness. The limited means at his disposal has prevented the Bishop from doing much amongst them as yet.

A very few congregations in the Diocese of Huron have contributed liberally to this object, but this appeal is now made to the members of the Church generally to make an effort to discharge, at all events, the duty of this Diocese in the matter. Large contributions are not asked, from any, but opportunity will be gladly afforded to anyone who wishes to contribute in however small a proportion.

 APPENDIX I.

 THE GOVERNMENT RECTORIES.

Case submitted for the opinion of Hon. Adam Crooks, Q. C., by the Rector and Wardens of St. Paul's Church, London, and laid before the Synod by the Delegates of that Church.

CASE.

The Rector and Church Wardens of St. Paul's Church, London, Ontario, submit the following for opinion of Counsel:—

By Act of Parliament (29-30 Vic. Cap. 16), the Synod became bound to perform certain trusts in respect of the Rectorial properties sold under said act.

An effort is being made to induce the Synod to petition the Ontario Legislature for an act authorizing the Synod to deal with the Rectorial Income as it sees fit, the intention being to divert it from its present beneficiaries without their consent.

The following documents are submitted:—

1. The resolutions of Rev. J. T. Wright to be brought before the next session of the Synod of Huron.
2. A Circular entitled "The Crown Endowments."
3. A Pamphlet entitled "The Crown Endowments," with the motto "*Audi alteram partem.*"

QUESTIONS SUBMITTED.

1. Is, or is not, the Synod merely a Trustee to administer the Trusts according to law?
2. If a Trustee, would the Synod be justified in adopting the foregoing or any similar resolution?
3. If such a resolution were carried by a majority of the Synod, would the proposed bill be submitted to the Judges as an ordinary Estates Bill?
4. Who are the beneficiaries of the Rectories?

OPINION.

I. These questions cannot well be understood or answered without reference to the Statutes and decisions applicable thereto.

Sir John Robinson, at p. 234 of the *Attorney-General vs. Grasett* (in appeal), shows that a parsonage or rectory is a Parish Church endowed by law for the maintenance of a Minister who has the cure of souls. The 38th section of the Imperial Act authorised the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of his Executive Council, to constitute and erect within every Township or Parish one or more parsonages or rectories according to the establishment of the Church of England, and to endow every such parsonage with grants of land within the same Township or Parish in which the parsonage was established. The legal validity of these grants having been settled, the result was that the members of the Church of England in any parish which was so endowed were secured in the same rights as parishioners in England, which are in no sense general, but limited strictly to the particular parish, while the legal title and *usufruct* of the land granted was in the Incumbent for the time being.

III. There is a plain distinction between the provisions of the 37th and the 38th Sections of the Imperial Act. The former in its terms authorized allotments of land to be made for the maintenance of a Protestant Clergy generally, but gave them no estates or interests therein, while the express object of the 38th Section was to effectually grant to and vest in the respective Rectors the lands set apart as the endowment. Again, while the Act of 1854 alienated all the unsold Clergy Reserve Lands for municipal purposes, the Act of 1851 conferred the presentation to Rectories upon the Church Societies and referred the question of the validity of these grants to the Courts for decision.

IV. All the subsequent Statutes do not infringe upon the principles laid down by the Courts that these grants were for the endowment of the respective parishes, and had become validly vested in their respective Rectors. The Act of 1866 empowered the Synods or Church Societies to sell and dispose of Rectory Lands, but the Trusts of the proceeds are special and confined to the Churches in the Parish or Township to which the Rectory belonged and so still enure for the benefit of the parishioners thereof, although distributed as to the specified surplus amongst other Churches but in the same Township. The time for exercising this authority was limited to ten years, but in 1875-6 an act was passed by the Ontario Legislature by which this period was extended for a further ten years. This will now apply chiefly to the Diocese of Huron, as the Synod of Ontario in the same session and that of Toronto in 1878 obtained special acts which limit their powers of sale to cases of the death, retirement or removal of the Incumbent. The trusts of the proceeds are specially for the benefit of incumbents of Churches in the same Township in which the Rectory was originally established.

V. Under the acts relating to the Church Society and to the Synod of the Diocese of Huron, the Synod now has the right of presentation to Rectories or may delegate this by a By-law, and can exercise such powers of sale as are conferred by the Act of 1866, extended by the Act of 1875-6, but the proceeds of all Rectory lands sold, or to be sold, are subject to the special Trusts declared by the Act. In the meantime the legal title to unsold lands would appear to be in the Rector.

VI. My reply, therefore, to the several questions proposed is as follows:—

1.—The Synod is only authorised to exercise the powers conferred by the Act of 1866, subject to the special trusts thereof.

2.—The Synod, as such, does not represent any of the interests which are entitled to the benefits of the Rectory endowment.

3.—No resolution, therefore, of the Synod could be considered as in any way expressing the views of the persons interested in these endowments, or as binding upon them.

4.—The members of the Church of England in the respective parishes in which Rectories have been endowed, are interested and possess legal rights similar to parishioners in England, and can object to any alienation of them. The Judges, as Commissioners to whom Estate Bills are referred by the Ontario Legislature, have in several cases recognised this. Thus, at p. 161, Journals of 1875-76, in case of land held for the Church of England in Ottawa, "Special vestries should be called upon to deliberate; so, at page 75, Journals of 1877, as to land in Niagara, "nothing to show consent on the part of the congregation.

APPENDIX J.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON BY-LAWS.

At the meeting of the Standing Committee in September last a Report was presented, and the following Resolution passed:

Moved by Ven. Archdeacon Marsh, seconded by Rev. J. T. Wright,

That the Report be referred back to the Committee with instructions to send to each member of the Standing Committee a printed copy of the By-Laws recommended by the Report, to be adopted as Canons (excepting By-Laws on the arbitration and award between Toronto and Huron Dioceses.) The report to be brought up for discussion at the December meeting.

The following are accordingly submitted:

(A.) BY-LAW NO. 2, 1ST SECTION, PASSED DECEMBER, 1859.

Whereas, It frequently happens that persons from various parts of the Diocese, and from other Dioceses, make application for assistance in building Churches, Parsonages, &c., to the Clergy and Laity of the Church throughout the Diocese, without any recognised authority and proof of the facts of the case for which application is made; *Resolved*, therefore, that the Bishop be respectfully requested to establish as a rule in the Diocese that no clergyman or layman be permitted to collect money for any Church purpose beyond the bounds of his own mission, or to proceed to any other Diocese for the same purpose, without the sanction and approval of the Bishop, given as a heading to his Subscription List; and that it be the duty of such collector to communicate with each clergyman before he makes a collection in his parish; and that, on his return from his collection tour, every person collecting shall present his Subscription List to the Bishop, and account for all moneys received. And further, that no person from any other Diocese shall make collections within this Diocese without first obtaining the sanction of its Bishop, under his hand and seal.

(B.) BY-LAW NO. 26, ON COLLECTION FOR LOCAL OBJECTS.

Whereas, It is desirable that parishes and congregations seeking assistance from other parishes and congregations should give a guarantee that all expenses

That whenever any parish or congregation in this Diocese desires to apply to any other parish or congregation therein for assistance for any local Church object, before any such application is made, the parish or congregation shall give a guarantee to the Bishop that all expenses connected with such application or applications will be paid by such parish or congregation, so that all the funds obtained may be applied to the object for which the application has been made.

Passed by the Society and sanctioned by the Bishop of the said Diocese this 5th day of September, A. D. 1872.

The Committee recommend that the following be substituted for the two preceding By-Laws A. and B. :

CANON No.

ON COLLECTIONS FOR LOCAL OBJECTS BEYOND A PARISH.

Whereas, It frequently happens that persons from various parts of the Diocese, and from other Dioceses, make application for assistance in building Churches, Parsonages, etc., to the members of the Church throughout the Diocese, without any recognised authority.

Be it enacted,

1. That no person be permitted to collect money for any Church purpose beyond the bounds of his own mission, within this Diocese, or to proceed to any other Diocese for the same purpose without the sanction of the Bishop in writing.

2. That said collector, before collecting in any parish, shall obtain the sanction of the clergyman of said parish.

3. That on his return from his collecting tour, such collector shall present his subscription list to the Bishop and account for moneys received.

4. That when the collection is for the benefit of any parish or congregation in this Diocese, the said parish or congregation shall give a guarantee that all expenses connected with the said collection shall be paid by them, so that all the funds obtained by appeal to others, shall be applied to the object for which they were collected.

(C.) PART OF BY-LAW NO. 2, SECTION 4, PASSED OCTOBER, 1862.

That seeing it is absolutely necessary for the successful working of the Church Society and the furtherance of the various objects embraced by its Constitution, that all parts of the Diocese should co-operate: Be it therefore *Resolved*, That no assistance be given to any parish or congregation unless all the collections are regularly made by such congregation, and a Parochial Association established in connection with the same, from which collections are annually made for the Society; and further, that the Bishop be respectfully requested to apply the same rule to the S. P. C. K. Fund, for assisting in the building of Churches in the Diocese.

The Committee recommend the following:

CANON No.

PARISHES REQUIRED TO MAKE REGULAR COLLECTIONS.

That, seeing it is absolutely necessary for the successful working of the Synod, and the furtherance of the various objects embraced by its Constitution,

that all parts of the Diocese should co-operate: Be it therefore *Resolved*, That no assistance be given to any parish or congregation unless all the collections are regularly made by such congregation, and a Parochial Association established in connection with the same, from which collections are annually made for the Synod; and further, that the Bishop be respectfully requested to apply the same rule to the S. P. C. K. Fund, for assisting in the building of Churches in the Diocese.

(D.) BY-LAW NO. 26, RESTRAINING UNDUE EXPENDITURE IN CHURCH BUILDING, PASSED JUNE 27, 1865.

In all parishes or missions where any assistance is required from the Society to aid in building a Church or Parsonage, and in all parishes or missions where assistance is given under the By-Law for Managing the Mission Fund, towards the Clergyman's stipend, all such assistance, both in Church building, and in assisting in the support of the Clergyman, shall be dependent upon the following rules being complied with:—

That before any Church or Parsonage shall be commenced in such parish or mission, a report shall be made, by the Clergyman and people interested in the erection of said Church or Parsonage, to the Standing Committee, containing the following particulars, a copy of which shall be sent to the Rural Dean:

1. When a Church is about to be built; the locality and distance from any other Church; and the number of Church families within a circle of five miles of the proposed Church; and when a Parsonage is to be built, its position with reference to the Church or Churches in the mission.
2. What kind of Church or Parsonage is proposed to be built, and what it is estimated to cost.
3. What amount is subscribed towards the said Church or Parsonage, and in what manner; and what amount has been paid.
4. The assurance that the building of the said Church or Parsonage will not interfere with nor lessen the amount subscribed by the congregation or mission towards the Clergyman's stipend.
5. That the plans of such proposed Church or Parsonage shall be laid before the Standing Committee.

That it shall be the duty of the Standing Committee to report to the Society what should be the amount spent upon and what should be the size and material of such Church or Parsonage; and what sum should be granted by the Church Society towards the erection of such Church or Parsonage; such grant from the funds of the Society to be made on the following conditions:

1. That the deed for the site of the Church or Parsonage, free and unincumbered, shall be vested in trust in the Society.
2. That no larger nor more expensive Church or Parsonage be built than shall be agreed upon by the Society.
3. That no contract shall be given out until at least one-half of the Subscription List for said Church or Parsonage shall be actually paid and in hand; nor shall such contract cover work which shall cost more than fifty per cent. beyond the money in hand.
4. That the grant from the Church Society shall not be paid until the Church or Parsonage is enclosed and roofed, and, so far, paid for, but not by the debt being assumed by any person or persons, unless such person or persons relieve the congregation or mission from all future liability for the same; and further, before such grant is paid, the Churchwardens and Vestry, or Building

Committee, shall promise in writing that they will not engage in any further work upon the Church or Parsonage until the money necessary for such further work is actually in hand.

(E.) A BY-LAW RESPECTING THE POSITION AND LOCATION OF CHURCH EDIFICES.

Whereas, It is desirable that all Church edifices should be built in as commanding a position as possible, and it is essential that they be located so as to afford the greatest facility of access to their respective congregations which may be practicable.

Be it therefore enacted, etc. :

That before any grant shall be made by this society towards the building of any Church edifice in this Diocese, the eligibility of the site shall be certified by a Churchwarden from each of the two neighboring parishes or missions, and also by the Incumbents thereof. The said certificates to be forwarded to the Rural Dean, and reported on by him to the next meeting of the Standing Committee.

Passed by the Church Society of the Diocese of Huron and sanctioned by the Bishop of the said Diocese this 5th day of September, A. D. 1872.

The Committee recommend that the following be substituted for By-Laws D. and E. :

CANON No.

RESTRAINING UNDUE EXPENDITURE IN CHURCH BUILDING.

In all parishes or missions where assistance is required from the Synod to aid in building a Church or Parsonage, and in all parishes or missions where assistance is given under the Canon for managing the Mission Fund, towards the Clergyman's stipend, all such assistance, both in Church Building and in assisting in the support of the Clergyman, shall be dependent upon the following rules being complied with :—

That before any Church or Parsonage shall be commenced in such parish or mission, a report shall be made, by the Clergyman and people interested in the erection of said Church or Parsonage, to the Standing Committee, containing the following particulars, a copy of which shall be sent to the Rural Dean :

1. When a Church is about to be built ; the locality and distance from any other Church ; and the number of Church families within a circle of five miles of the proposed Church ; and when a Parsonage is to be built, its position with reference to the Church or Churches in the mission.

2. What kind of Church or Parsonage is proposed to be built, and what it is estimated to cost.

3. What amount is subscribed towards the said Church or Parsonage, and in what manner ; and what amount has been paid.

4. The assurance that the building of said Church or Parsonage will not interfere with nor lessen the amount subscribed by the congregation or mission towards the Clergyman's stipend.

5. That the plans of such proposed Church or Parsonage shall be laid before the Standing Committee.

That it shall be the duty of the Standing Committee to decide what should be the amount spent upon, and what should be the size and material of, such Church or Parsonage ; and what sum should be granted by the Synod towards

the erection of such Church or Parsonage; such grant from the funds of the Synod to be made on the following conditions:

1. That the deed for the site of the Church or Parsonage, free and unincumbered, shall be vested in trust in the Synod.
2. That no larger nor more expensive Church nor Parsonage be built than shall be agreed upon by the Synod.
3. That no contract shall be given out until at least one-half of the Subscription List for said Church or Parsonage shall be actually paid and in hand; nor shall such contract cover work which shall cost more than fifty per cent. beyond the money in hand.
4. That the grant from the Synod shall not be paid until the Church or Parsonage is enclosed and roofed, and, so far, paid for, but not by the debt being assumed by any person or persons, unless such person or persons relieve the congregation or mission from all future liability for the same; and further, before such grant is paid, the Churchwardens and Vestry, or Building Committee, shall promise in writing that they will not engage in any further work upon the Church or Parsonage until the money necessary for such further work is actually in hand.
6. That before any grant shall be made by the Synod towards the building of any Church edifice in this Diocese, the eligibility of the site shall be certified by a Churchwarden from each of the two neighboring parishes or missions, and also by the Incumbent thereof. The said certificates to be forwarded to the Rural Dean, and reported on by him to the next meeting of the Standing Committee.

(F.) BY-LAW NO. 7, ON THE EPISCOPAL FUND.

And be it further enacted by and under the authority of the said Act, and by and with the sanction of the Bishop of the said Diocese:

- 1st. That all former resolutions passed by the Society, with reference to the disposition of the Episcopal Fund, be and are hereby rescinded.
- 2nd. That the Episcopal Fund, and the securities lately received from the Diocese of Toronto, on the death of the late Bishop of that See, and the elevation of his successor, the late Archdeacon of York, shall form one fund, from the income of which \$400 shall be paid to an Archdeacon, and the balance, after paying the necessary expenses connected with this fund, shall be paid to the Bishop.

And this section of this By-Law shall take effect on and from and after the 26th day of August, A. D. 1868.

The Committee recommend the confirmation of this By-Law as Canon—, on the Episcopal and Archdeacons' Fund.

(G.) BY-LAW NO. 19, ON THE PATRONAGE OF RECTORIES.

Respecting presentation to the Rectories in the Diocese of Huron.

Whereas, By the provisions of the fourth section of the Consolidated Statutes of Canada, Chapter seventy-four, entitled "An Act Respecting Rectories," the right of presenting an Incumbent or Minister to any Parsonage or Rectory is vested in, and is to be exercised by the Church Society of the Church of England Diocese within which the same is situated, or in such other person or persons, bodies politic or corporate, as such Church Society by any By-Law or By-Laws to be by them from time to time passed for that purpose, may think fit to direct or appoint in that behalf;

Be it therefore Enacted, By the Church Society of the Diocese of Huron, constituted by the provisions of the Act of the Parliament of the late Province of Canada, entitled "An Act to Incorporate the Church Society of the Diocese of Huron, and for other purposes therewith connected," and by and under the provisions thereof, and by and with the consent and sanction of the Bishop of the said Diocese, and in the exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the first mentioned Act, That the patronage of the Rectories vested by Act of Parliament in this Society shall be exercised by the Bishop of the Diocese.

And be it further Enacted, By the authority aforesaid, and by and with the like consent and sanction of the Bishop of the said Diocese, that this By-Law shall take effect upon and from and after the twenty-second day of September, A. D. 1858.

The Committee recommend the confirmation of this By-Law as Canon No.—, on the Patronage of Rectories.

The Committee also recommend that the following, having been by-laws or rules of the Church Society, be adopted as Rules of the Standing Committee.

1. That all applications for aid from the Synod must be with the Secretary-Treasurer at least three days before the meeting of Standing Committee, otherwise they cannot be entertained until the following meeting.

2. That grants made from the General Purposes Fund, and not claimed by the expiration of two years from the time that they are promised, be cancelled.

3. That it shall be the rule of the Standing Committee that whenever an application for a grant from any of the funds of the Synod in behalf of any Parish or Mission is under consideration, that the parties in connection with such Parish or mission making such application, if present, shall be respectfully requested to withdraw while such application is discussed.

7. If a vacancy occur by the death, removal or resignation of any Representative, the Clergyman shall proceed to hold a new election within one month, due notice being given by him during divine service, on some Sunday preceding the meeting, provided that no such election shall take place between the time that the See becomes vacant and the election of a Bishop, saving and except when a vacancy occurs by death, removal or resignation during the above interval, or within one month previous to the vacancy of the See.

8. It shall be the duty of the chairman, within six days after the election of Representatives, to send to the Secretaries of the Synod the certificate above referred to, taking care, when more than one is elected, to give the number of registered voters. A Committee of two shall be appointed by the Bishop to act, in conjunction with the Secretaries, in the examination, some day before the meeting of Synod, of the Certificates as to election of Lay Representatives, said Committee to report on the first day of session of Synod, immediately after the election of Secretaries.

9. That the Synod shall meet annually, on the third Tuesday in June, or oftener, at the option of the Bishop.

10. Each Clergyman within the Diocese shall send to the Bishop, through the Secretary-Treasurer, the name of any congregation hereafter established under his charge; describing its locality, in order that it may be recorded in the book in which a list of the congregations is kept.

11. When the Bishop is not present, he shall appoint his deputy to preside in his place. A quorum of the Synod shall consist of the Bishop, or his deputy, and not less than one-fourth of the whole number of both Clergy and Lay Representatives respectively, except in case of the Synod assembling for the election of its Bishop, when the quorum shall consist of at least one-half of the Clergy and Lay Representatives respectively.

12. A Clerical and Lay Secretary shall be chosen annually by the Synod from among the members thereof, who shall remain in office until the next annual meeting of the Synod. Their duty shall be to take minutes of the proceedings of the Synod, to preserve its journals and records, to attest the public acts of the body, and faithfully to deliver into the hands of their successors all books and papers relative to the concerns of the Synod, which may be in their possession; and in case of a vacancy in the See, to summon the Synod for the election of a Bishop.

13. A Secretary-Treasurer shall be appointed by vote of Synod, whose duty it shall be to attend to all the business of the Synod when not in session, including the receipt and taking charge of all moneys belonging to the Synod under the direction of the Bishop, the Standing Committee and the officers of the Synod.

14. That the paid officers of the Synod shall be the Secretary-Treasurer and an assistant, if required, also the Auditors; and that the Secretary-Treasurer shall furnish security to the satisfaction of the Bishop and the Standing Committee.

15. There shall be annually elected by the Synod, immediately after the election of the Secretaries, two Auditors, whose duties shall be to examine all accounts of the *Secretary-Treasurer*, and to report on them to the Standing Committee.

16. There shall be a Standing Committee, presided over by the Bishop, ten of whom shall form a quorum, consisting of 30 clergymen and 30 laymen, who shall be elected annually by ballot out of the members of the Synod, by each order respectively. Immediately after the election of the Standing Committee the Bishop shall appoint a time during the session of Synod at which a meeting of the Committee shall be held for the purpose of organizing and appointing any necessary sub-committees that may be required, to take action before the first regular quarterly meeting in September. It shall be the duty of the Standing Committee to manage all the funds which were held by the Church Society, and administer the same in accordance with the Canons of the Synod. It shall be the duty of the Standing Committee to prepare in due form all such matters as the Bishop may desire to have brought before the Synod, and all such other matters as may be forwarded to them, through the Secretary, by any member of the Synod, previous to the first day of May in each year, and to have such portions printed as may appear to them expedient; and a circular containing a statement of such business to be submitted to the Synod shall be forwarded to each Clergyman and Representative, two weeks before the meeting of the Synod, which business shall stand first in the order of the day.

17. That before the Synod shall enter upon any business at any of its meetings, the following prayers shall be said:—

PREVENT US, O Lord, in all our doings, with Thy most gracious favor, and further us with Thy continual help; that in all our works begun, continued and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy holy name, and finally, by Thy mercy, obtain everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord.—AMEN.

O GOD, from whom all holy desires, all good counsels, and all works of piety and charity do proceed, we humbly beseech Thee to prosper with Thy blessing the designs of this Synod, and to comfort with Thy grace those benefactors who contribute to its support. Visit with Thy favor our Sovereign QUEEN VICTORIA, and all in authority under her; and so rule their hearts that they may in all things seek Thy honor and glory. Bless the ministry of Thy servants, the Clergy; the endeavors of all who are engaged in spreading the knowledge of true religion in this Province, and the labors of those Missionaries who are promoting the same in foreign parts. Inspire continually the Universal Church with a spirit of truth, unity and concord; and because it cannot continue in safety without Thy succor, preserve it evermore by Thy help and goodness; and may Thy Holy Spirit direct all our consultations to the advancement of Thy glory and the good of Thy Church, through Jesus Christ our Lord.—AMEN.

Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trespass against us. But, above all, for Thy inestimable love in the redemption of the world by Thy blessed Son; for the means of grace and the hope of glory which Thou hast given us in the same our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ; to whom

18. That if any vacancy occur by death, removal or resignation of any officer, notice of such vacancy shall be given to the Standing Committee, and the Bishop shall appoint a successor until the next meeting of the Synod.

19. That the Standing Committee shall meet in London on the first Wednesday in the months of March, September and December, and in the month of June, on some day during the week in which the Synod meets; provided, however, that the Bishop shall have the power of changing the time of meeting in any of the said months, if he should see good cause. A public Missionary meeting shall take place on some evening during the week in June in which the Synod meets. The Standing Committee, in case of the incapacity of the Bishop, shall have power to call a special meeting of the Synod at any time.

20. That in order more fully to promote the objects of the Synod, annual subscriptions and donations shall be collected from each congregation in such manner as shall be deemed most effective, and every endeavor made to augment the resources of the Synod. All moneys raised shall be transmitted to the Sec.-Treas.

That six collections be made annually, the proceeds of two of which shall be devoted to the Widows' and Orphans' Fund, and that of the other four to Missionary purposes, and at such other times and for such purposes as the Bishop may direct. The collections to be forwarded to the Sec.-Treas. of the Synod. It shall be the duty of every Clergyman to give notice of these collections, and to call the attention of his congregations to the importance of the objects, and their claims for liberal support.

21. That all money shall be paid by cheques, signed by the Bishop (and in his absence, or during the vacancy of the See, by the person administering the Diocese) and countersigned by the Sec.-Treas.

22. No act or resolution shall become law without the concurrence of the Bishop, and a majority of the Clergy and Laity present; provided that, ordinarily, the votes of the whole Synod shall be taken collectively, but that at the desire of the Bishop, or at the request of five Clergymen, or of five Laymen, the votes of each of the above-named orders shall be taken separately.

23. In case of a vacancy in the See, it shall be the duty of the Secretaries of the Synod, within ten days from their knowledge of such vacancy, to give notice thereof to every Clergyman and Lay Representative; and at the same time to summon a meeting of such Clergymen and Lay Representatives, to be held at London, within six weeks, for the election of a Bishop, and to give at least one month's notice thereof. At such meeting for the election of a Bishop, the Senior Dignitary present shall take the chair, and shall vote whether there be an equality of votes or not. The Clergy and Lay Representatives present shall vote separately by ballot, and a majority of the votes of each order present shall determine the choice, provided always, that it shall be competent for such meeting to postpone the election to such further period as to them shall seem expedient.

24. Every proposition for an alteration in the Constitution of Canons of the Synod must be sent to the Standing Committee, to be forwarded to the members of the Synod, and no alteration shall take place unless agreed to by majorities of two-thirds of the Clergy and Laity respectively.

25. Each Clergyman shall make an annual statistical report to the Bishop, according to the form to be supplied by the Secretary, under the Bishop's direction; which report shall be forwarded to the Bishop within one month after Easter.

26. The following objects for which the Church Society was incorporated, shall be included amongst the objects for which the Synod is incorporated:—

FIRST.—For the encouragement and support of Missionaries and Clergymen of the United Church of England and Ireland within the Diocese of Huron, and for creating a fund towards the augmentation of the stipends of poor Clergymen, and towards making a provision for those who may be incapacitated by age or infirmity, and for the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy of the said Church in the said Diocese.

SECONDLY.—For the encouragement of education, and for the support of Day Schools and Sunday Schools in the said Diocese, in conformity with the principles of the said Church.

THIRDLY.—For granting assistance, where it may be necessary, to those who may be preparing for the Ministry of the Gospel in the said Church, within the said Diocese.

FOURTHLY.—For circulating in the said Diocese the Holy Scriptures, the Book of Common Prayer of the said Church, and such other Books and Tracts as shall be approved by the Standing Committee.

FIFTHLY.—For obtaining and granting aid towards the erection, endowment and maintenance of Churches according to the establishment of the said Church in the said Diocese; the erection and maintenance of Parsonage Houses; the setting apart of Burial Grounds and Church Yards; the endowment and support of Parsonages and Rectories, according to the same establishment, and the management of all matters relating to such endowment.

APPENDIX L (2.)

ORDER OF PROCEEDINGS.

1. Each meeting of the Synod shall be preceded by public morning prayer; and on the first day the Holy Communion shall be administered.

2. The business of every day shall be commenced by special prayer for the Divine guidance and blessing, according to a form authorized by the Bishop.

3. After prayer, the Clerical Secretary shall call over the roll of the Clergy, as furnished by the Bishop, and mark the names of those in attendance; and the Lay Secretary shall then call over the names of the Representatives, and those present shall answer to their names.

4. The Secretaries and Auditors shall then be elected by the Synod, and they shall continue in office until their successors are appointed.

5. The Order of Business on each day shall be as follows:

- (1) Calling the Rolls.
- (2) Reading, correcting and approving the minutes of the previous meeting.
- (3) Appointing Committees.
- (4) Presenting, reading and referring memorials and petitions.
- (5) Presenting reports of committees.
- (6) Giving notice of motions.
- (7) Taking up unfinished business.
- (8) Consideration of motions.

6. An address from the Bishop shall be in order at any time.

7. The Synod shall meet each day immediately after divine service, and adjourn at one o'clock p. m.; meet again at three o'clock p. m., and adjourn at six o'clock p. m.; meet again at half-past seven o'clock p. m., and adjourn at ten o'clock p. m., unless otherwise ordered by the Bishop; and every member attending the Synod shall be in his place, and remain during each session of the Synod, and shall not leave until the final adjournment, except by permission of the Bishop or Chairman.

RULES FOR THE PRESERVATION OF ORDER.

1. When the Bishop or other person presiding has taken the chair, no member shall continue standing.
2. When any member is about to speak for the information of the Synod, he shall rise and address the chair.
3. No motion or amendment shall be considered as before the Synod (excepting such as may be proposed by the Bishop or Committees), unless seconded and reduced to writing: and no motion except in course, shall be considered till the succeeding day of meeting.
4. (A) No member shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same subject, except by permission of the chair, save the mover of a resolution or amendment. (B) If two or more gentlemen rise to speak on a motion, the second gentleman rising, or so ruled by the Chair, shall be the next speaker on the floor of the Synod. (C) The mover of a resolution or amendment shall have the privilege of speaking a second time, after every member of the Synod who desires to speak has spoken on such motion or amendment. This shall close the debate.
5. When a question is under consideration, no other motion shall be received, unless to adjourn, to lay it on the table, to postpone it to a certain time, to postpone it indefinitely, to commit it, to amend it, or to divide on it; and motions for any of these purposes shall have precedence in the order here named.
6. Motions to adjourn, or to lay on the table, shall be decided without debate.
7. When a motion has been read to the Synod by the Secretary, it cannot be withdrawn by the mover without the consent of the chair.
8. Each member shall have the right to require, at any period of the debate, that a question in discussion be read for his information.
9. A member called to order, while speaking, shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.
10. All questions of order shall be decided by the Chair.
11. When a proposed amendment is under consideration, a motion to amend the same may be made; but no further amendment to such second amendment shall be in order, until such second amendment shall have been disposed of.
12. All amendments to any question or amendment shall be decided on before the question or motion on which they rise is proposed for decision.
13. Whilst any question is being put from the Chair, the members shall continue in their seats, and shall not hold any private discourse; and when a motion is so put, no member shall retire until such motion is disposed of.

14. In voting those who vote in recorded.

16. When the Synod is about to adjourn, every member shall keep his seat until the Bishop, or other person presiding, has left the Chair.

APPENDIX L (4).

1. All Committees shall be appointed by the Chair, unless named by the Synod, and the names shall be publicly announced while the Synod is in session. At the time of appointment it shall be stated whose duty it is to convene the Committee, and in the event of this being overlooked, it shall be the duty of the first-named member to convene.

2. The Reports of Committees shall be in writing, signed by their Chairman, and shall be received in course, unless a motion be made for their recommendation.

3. The Chairman of the Committee, or some member deputed by him, shall explain to the Synod the bearing of any portion of the report, if requested by any member of the Synod.

4. All Reports of Committees, recommending any action or expression of opinion, shall be accompanied by a resolution for the action of the Synod thereon.

COMMITTEE ON MISSIONS

from each Rural Deanery, appointed by the Bishop under
Canon 24, Section 5.

5. To carry out the above plans and objects there shall be appointed annually by the Bishop, during the session of the Synod, for each Rural Deanery, two Clergymen and two Laymen, being Communicants, who, with the Archdeacon and Rural Dean of the locality, shall constitute a *Committee on Missions for that Rural Deanery*, of which Committee the Archdeacon or Rural Dean and any two appointed members shall form a quorum.
