On the School Question, which has engrossed public attention during several years past, and is still a live issue, my views are so well known that it is scarcely necessary to say that the principles on which the School Act is based have my cordial approval. Holding for some years, respectively, the position of member and chairman of the Board of School Trustees, of this city, I have had in an especial manner, opportunities for testing the working of the system; and have used my best efforts to make the school law operate for the benefit of the general public. Conscious of faithful discharge of duty in these positions, I trust that the part taken by me in the administration of school affairs will receive your endorsement, and that the experience gained in the school service may justify you in believing that I will carefully scrutinize the administration of the law to the end that its practical working may be what its framers intended it should be—a public benefit.

On the various questions which may from time to time arise, I shall exercise my best judgment, giving to the measures of the Government the fullest support to which, in the conscientious discharge of a representative's duty, I may deem them entitled, considering with special care legislation bearing upon city interests.


