PRICE OF BREAD.—Few in affluent circumstances are aware how much difference in the health and comfort of the great mass of the people is occasioned by a few cent increase in the price of a bushel, or of a few shillings advance on a quarter of Wheat. Mr. Barton, an English medical gentleman, has been making some inquiries connected with this matter, and the following extract will show the importance of having bread cheap in order to sustain life. Mr. Barton's reports comprise returns from seven manufacturing districts in Europe, distinct from each other:
