ANADAS PRECIOUS METAL INDUSTRY.

According to the statistical year book of Canada the output of gold in the Dominion in 1897 was of the value of \$6,190,000, of silver \$3,322,905, of lead \$1,396,863 and of copper \$1,501,660. This is not a bad showing when it is considered that most of these values were derived from lode mining, which is but in its almost helpless infancy at present.

THE International Typographical Union has issued a circular, in which it is stated that an agreement has been reached between the committee of the United Typothetis of America and the shorter workday committee of the International Typographical Union, the International Brotherhood of Bookbinders and the International Brotherhood of Bookbinders. This provides that the United Typothetis of America agrees to inaugurate a shorter work day of the following basis: The 9 1/2 hour per day of the 57 hour week, starting on November 21, 1898, and the 9-hour day, or 54 hour week, on November 21, 1899. In the interim an agreement will be made to increase wages in competitive districts where at present there are serious inequalities.
