

Although our Province is rich in natural resources, yet the out-go, or drain for imposts and revenue is so great as to make it impossible for our people to find the capital necessary to open up avenues of communication for the successful development of these resources and their transportation to the markets of the world, and for the occupation and colonization of our public lands. For these reasons we ask and should receive subsidies—a generous return of a portion of our own money. The stimulus thus given to trade would well repay the Government for any outlay made in the way I have described.
