Mr. G. O. Miller, of Middleton, one of the best known plum growers of the Province, spoke with reference to the black knot pest, and stated that the constant application of the knife was the only effective remedy.

The afternoon session opened with an address by Prof. Faville, on "Fruit Culture throughout the Province," as observed by him during his lecture tour last season.

The evening session opened with a paper by Mr. W. W. Hubbard, of Sussex, N. B., entitled "The Relation of Spade Husbandry to Fruit Growing."

The executive board was reappointed with but few changes.

Friday's afternoon session opened with a paper by Dr. DeWitt, on "How to Start and Grow an Ideal Apple Orchard."

The annual Roll-Call of the above church was held on Tuesday evening last. A pastoral letter had been previously sent to every member of the church.
