The Dodds Insolvent Case. all Judge Miller rendered the following judgment:—It don't seem to me that the examination shows that the defendant should be kept in confinement. In Hood's case it was contended that the \$1,252 were obtained by the defendant from plaintiff on the understanding that the money was to be applied in reducing a coming due draft, and that the defendant denies and states that the defendant denies and states that the money was offered him by Mr. Hood, who said that he didn't want it, and that it would help him (the deft.) to make some payments. The defendant says that he at first refused the money that he afterwards took it and applied it in payment of debts. I cannot, on the examination, hold that the defendant has been guilty of any fraudulent disposal, concealment or retention of his estate, or any part thereof. It was contended that the defendant had contravened Sec. 3 of the Act, because he did not file a deelaration under oath, staing whother or no the statement of his assets and the schedule of his creditors were correct. The section in question requires the Assignee to prepare such statement and schedule, and the Assignee on oath states that he omitted to do it. In Ry Thomas, 15 Chan. R 196, the late Chancellor Vankoughnet decided that an Assignee's neglect of duty was no reason for depriving a debtor of his discharge.

A Fort Garry correspondent is informed on the authority of Governor Morris that the land question is to be settled as follows:—The apportionment of reserved lots will be proceeded with immediately under the superintendence of the Lieutenant-Governor and Col. Dennis, and at the same time measures will be taken to regulare the rights of commonty and the hay privilege, as laid down in the Manitoba Act. The Crown, as soon as the surveys are finished, will grant lotters patent to holders of land holding titles from the Hudson Bay Company in those parts of the country where Indian rights were extinguished prior to the incorporation of the territory with Canada. The surveys are proceeding at present. As to parties occupying lands where Indian rights have not been extinguished, the Government will confirm their occupation without conditions. Old settlers not being half toreds will be placed on the same footing as these, and with their children will receive grants of land subject to the ratification of the Dominion Parliament.

A me time she memory at the parious of making subscriptions of a "santable memorial" to the Scottish Reformer, but there was a considerable difference of opinion asto what knot of a memorial would be likely to give sadisfaction to Knox himself. Various plans were suggested—such as a stained glass window in St. Cilies Cathedral, a statue, the issue in a popular form of Knox's "History of the Reformation," te, but note of them seemed to give satisfaction. Mr. Macfie, M.P., refused to take the chair, "because the idea of creeting a monument to John Knox seemed to hum most incongruous." Mr. Duff "ventified" to say "that nine-tenths of the giple of Scotland would have nothink to do with a stained-glass window. Dr. Begg thought a memorial would be an "insult to the memory of Knox." Dr. Thomson's "own leanings were to wards a great column." Professor Blackie objected to the publication of Knox's work, because it could be done for a paltry hundred pounds. Dr. Smith's difficulty with regard to a statue was that "he should not like John Knox to be honoged." In the end a committee was appointed to consider the subject; and perhaps it will come to the conclusion that the best means of honoring the memory of John Knox is to leave it alone. Illustrious men as a rule fashion their own memorials before their departure, and infinitely prefer walking alone to being handed down to posterity on the shoulders of their admirers.—Pall Mall Gazette.

#### Russia's Advances in Asia.

Russia's Advances in Asia.

A somewhat "sensational" cable dispatch announces, on the authority of the semi-cificial Sts Petersburg Gatos, that the British Foreign Office has protested against any attempt on the part of Russia to penetrate the counties lying between Khiva and Afghanistan. That there is some measure of inherent probability cannot be decied. The Russian occupation of Khiva, against which the Khau of that territory recently made an ineffectual attempt to obtain the aid of the Vicercy of India, brings Russian troops very close to the frontier of Hindostan. The possession of Khiva gives Russia the control of the river Anu, whose source is on the or posite side of the water-shed where the Indus takes its rise. The Anu is said to be navigable as high up as Kimdusb, beyond which is the territory of Badula. A gaainst whose occupation the Bri ish protein, if given at all, has probably been directed. The possession of Badukashan would enable the Russians practically to turn the difficult passes leading into the valley of the Indus by Cabool and Peshawar. For the water-shed between the Amu and Indus consists of out a single ridge, and is flanked on its eastern side by a valley leading directly to the Indus north of Cashmere. Even these advantages might not make Russian a very formidable enemy to a Government fighting so much nearer its base of operations, but neighborhood so close to another European power would not improbably give native resistance to British rule in India a somewhat unpleasant impetus. Afghanistan, however, has shown no signs of doing anything for the Russians, and the natives of British India generally seem to have little desire to exchange one foreign ruler for another.
