#### WAITING FOR THE VERDICT.

##### MR. HECSTON'S POLITICAL LIFE HANGS IN THE BALANCE.

The Report of the Privileges and Elections Committee Discussed in the House—A Lengthened Debate Which Is to Be Continued to-day—What Will Be the Result?

OTTAWA, Sept. 21.—In the House to-day Mr. Girouard moved the adoption of the report of the Committee on Privileges and Elections. In doing so, he said that if he had consulted his own inclination he would have asked the House to adopt the report without discussion. He concluded the system of trying such a case before a Parliamentary committee, which must be moved more or less by partisan feeling. The committee believed that Mr. Geffroy should be paid for his services, as well as Messrs. Oler and Henry. Questions from the two reports, Mr. Girouard said they substantially agreed as regards Thomas McGreevy, but differed as regards Sir Hector Langevin. He declared that there was no evidence to justify the report of Messrs. Davies and Mills, that Sir Hector knew of the conspiracy to defraud the public. With the engineers and the inspectors and Thomas McGreevy in the plot, the first Larkin, he said, was not necessary to require the assistance or connivance of Sir Hector Langevin. The minister relied on the reports of his chief engineer (Larkin), who must assume the responsibility of the positive proof produced that the minister knew of wrongdoing on the part of his chief engineer. His denial ought to be accepted. He showed that the Public Works Department under Mr. Mackenzie often awarded contracts to the contractor who tendered. For example, Patrick Larkin was awarded the contract for the Lewis Graving Dock through Sir Hector Langevin. He admitted that there were many suspicious circumstances, but that he should have something stronger than the report before continuing the minister. Sir Hector was the victim of his long intimacy with Thomas McGreevy. He blamed the contractors for the practice of bribery for political purposes. So long as electors deemed hired speakers, elaborate organizations, etc., necessary, the minister should subscribe for political purposes must continue and a portion at least would come from the public purse. The bad feature of the case was that there was no gratifying circumstance, namely, that only the best of the party was guilty. This case will teach public contractors that if they subscribe for political purposes they must keep within the law.

#### BALMACEIDA'S SUICIDE.

Chilian News Have No Fear to Deny—Restoration of Peace Throughout the South American Republic.

VALPARAISO, Chile, via GALVESTON, Texas, Sept. 21.—The suicide of Balmaceda yesterday morning in his bedroom at the Argentine Legion in Santiago is the one absorbing and exciting topic of conversation in every part of this city.

There is a mingled feeling of savage rejoicing at his death and of bitter regret that he should have killed himself instead of falling into the clutches of the infuriated citizens, who would have delighted to rend him limb from limb for the long list of cruelties for which they hold him responsible.

It is impossible for anyone not in this country or not a native to realize the intensity of the hatred that was entertained toward the ex-President.

It is the general belief that Balmaceda's death will hasten, in a great degree, the restoration of peace throughout Chile. Now that the chief enemy of the victorious Government has been removed, it is likely that his followers will abstain from any further violence, and that they are very likely to be reconciled to the new Government.

Italy, France, Sweden and Norway have followed the lead of the United States in recognizing the new Government. It is likely that it will be remembered, as the second nation to do so. No official recognition has yet come from England. This creates considerable comment.

### THE LAND FOR THE PEOPLE.

#### Mr. John E. Gorst Says a Change Must Be Made.

LONDON, Sept. 21.—Sir John E. Gorst, Political Secretary of Indian Affairs, in an interview to-day upon the English land question declared to commit himself to any definite plan for the settlement of this grievance. He said, however, "something must be done or a revolution is inevitable. I do not mean a bloody revolution, but I mean that the people will demand possession of the land they live upon. They are dissatisfied with the present law. Consequently they will have things altered. Allotments may palliate, but they will not solve the difficulty. The Conservatives ought to attempt the solution of anything that would stop emigration and keep the people from locking into the town. Give them an interest in the soil; that is true consideration. I am now enquiring into the condition of the rural laborers and the smaller class of farmers. I am a learner, and an enquiring by personal contact facts which will justify me to form a definite policy upon the English land question. The Stat. to-day predicts that Sir John E. Gorst will be the leading Tory-Democrat, and that he is preparing to bid high for the rural vote.

At this session it was shown by Mr. C. Charbonnet, then bookkeeper to Larose, that in addition to other accounts proved at the last meeting, there was another one of \$172 for clothes to E. Dion, sold by Mr. Larose, and the account in the book was marked "E.B.," which meant "Talbot's bookkeeping," and was identified as such.

#### A BIG MIDNIGHT BLAZE.

Destruction of an East End Slaughter House—Grand Trunk Car Burned.

The scene of the fire is 100 yards east of the Don Station of the Grand Trunk Railway. It is at the foot of Beach-street, the southeast of William Davies' big packing house. There is a railway siding close to the premises, and here was a car loaded with hay.
