



A new Edition of Bishop Durieu's Chinook Bible History.

The late Bishop Durieu spent a great many hours in composing Chinook Bible History for the use of the Indians. The History of the Old Testament was printed on the Mimeo graph.

in 1899, and about 300 Copies,
Were bound and circulated among
the Indians. The History of
the New Testament followed,
but no more than 16 or 32
pages were issued on the Mimeo-
graph, when photogravuring was
adopted for the printing of the
Wawa; and mimeographing
was discarded, as too slow and
too laborious for the number of
copies required. So the History
of the Old Testament was reedi-
ted, and the History of the New.

Was commenced, and continued at the rate of two to four pages per month. Both Histories are complete in the numbers of 1894, to 1896.

But as it is nearly impossible for the Indians to find their way in the successive numbers of the Wawa, where pages of both Testaments are found, intermingled; it is necessary to make a special edition of the Bible History. It is now under press, and will be ready in a few weeks.

The whole thing is complete in 112 pages, and is accompanied by an engraving of the author, and one of Bishop D'H. Menez.

The price is only Twenty Cents per copy. The 112 pages in shorthand, are equal to 500 pages of common print in English. It is sufficient to compare with the Old Mimeographed edition, which has 250 pages for the History of the Old Testament alone.

We would have been very glad to issue an illustrated edition

- - - - - 85 - - - -

of the Bible History for the Indians. But the thing is far above our means. All that can be done, at present, is to bind the Chinook text with an illustrated Bible History in English, and yet the price might be found too high. Not seldom a remark like this is heard: "How dear are those papers!" Just now consider the expense. The plates for the Bible History have cost two Dollars a piece, make it in a round figure, two Hundred Dollars.

Now the cost of printing is
100 Dollars more, and another
100 Dollars will have to be spent
in transportation, postage, etc.,
and you will find that it will
require to sell 2000 Copies at
20 Cents each to cover the expen-
ses incurred.

It is true to say that plates
could be got now for one half
the price of what the above
112 plates have cost. But it
still makes it very difficult
to issue new works such as
the life of the saints, which

would be so useful to the Indians.
Another consideration is, that a
number of these plates having
already been made for the Warwa,
the expense of a new edition is
greatly reduced thereby; but to
issue a work with new plates
would be very difficult.

To those who consider that
the papers issued in Shorthand
are very small for the price, it
is proper to remark, that as
one page of Shorthand contains
as much as four common

pages, the papers are more valuable than common English prints. See how long it takes to read one of those pages. Some again find that the characters are too fine: they would prefer, shortened four times as big. But then the plates would cost four times as much, which would make it impossible to issue the work.
