RESOLUTIONS *unanimously adopted at the Annual Meeting
of the Auxiliary Society for the District, held at Montreal,
on Friday Evening, May 14th, 1847. The Hon. JAMES
FERRIER in the Chair.*

After the reading of the Report by the Rev. C. CHURCHILL,
it was resolved unanimously,

1.—That this statement of the operations of the Wesleyan Missionary Society, which has been submitted to this Meeting, be printed and distributed throughout this District, and that it calls for the expression of our devout acknowledgment to Almighty God for the measure of success which has been vouchsafed to this and other kindred Societies during the past year.

R E P O R T .

THE COMMITTEE OF THE CANADA EAST DISTRICT AUXILIARY MISSIONARY SOCIETY have great pleasure in again presenting their Annual Report of the proceedings of the WESLEYAN MISSIONARY SOCIETY for the past year.

The following is the Financial Statement, as read at the late meeting of the Parent Society in May last :

On this statement the following remarks are respectfully offered. If the Income of the year be examined, it will be found that there is an increase on the whole of £2,838 13s. 8d., and that this advance has arisen from an increase in every general source of Income. The increase on the Home Receipts is £2,067 15s. 9d. The following are the particulars. The Receipts from the Home Auxiliaries, including the Contributions received at the Mission-House, amount to £82,950 7s. 5d., and show an Increase of £1,515 1s. 11d. The Juvenile Christmas and New Year's Offerings amount to £4,770 19s. 8d., being an increase in this delightful source of Income of £284 10s. 3d. The Receipts from Ireland have been £6,462 5s. 10d., showing an Increase of £262 3s. 10d. The Receipts from Foreign Auxiliaries on the Mission Stations are £11,788 6s. 5d., being an Increase of £114 1s. 10d.; and the Miscellaneous Receipts in the form of Colonial Grants, Legacies, Dividends, New Donations on Annuity for Life, &c., have amounted to £9,790 3s. 10d. being an Increase of £656 16s. 1d. on this item for the year.

INSTITUTIONS FOR THE TRAINING OF NATIVE ASSISTANT MISSIONARIES AND SCHOOL TEACHERS.

This feature in our Missionary operations is one which has attained a position entitling it to special notice in our Annual Reports. For this purpose we have detached from the accounts of the different Stations the information lately communicated, so as to present the whole in a consecutive and complete form.

1. At Colombo, in South Ceylon, one of the Missionaries, the Rev. A. Kessen, B. A., has been appointed Rector of the Native Normal Institution, under the Central School Commission, appointed by the Ceylon Government. The examination of this Institution was conducted by the Bishop, at a late visit, and elicited considerable applause from its successful working.

2. At Auckland, in New Zealand, this country, in 1820, had only one Missionary, and no members till 1830, then only two, and in 1836 only 20, but now 3571. A grant of 190 acres of land has been obtained, and from funds obtained in the Colony, substantial buildings have been erected, the principal front of which presents a fine specimen of Gothic Architecture. The premises are spacious and convenient, occupying a commanding position above the surrounding country, and immediately surrounded by seven acres of cultivated land. The Institution was publicly opened by the Lieutenant Governor, and nine single, with one married man, have been admitted, all recommended by the Missionaries as persons likely to be useful, with proper qualifications for the work of the Ministry. They are already employed occasionally on the Sabbath in preaching the Gospel, as opportunities offer, and often in circumstances among their own countrymen, when the regular Ministry could not find so ready access.

3. In the Friendly Islands, which Mission was established in 1820, and with a return of only five Members in 1827; we have also an Institution for training Native Teachers, in which seventeen persons are receiving instruction. Eleven of these are Head Teachers in the Vavou Circuit, and two men, with their wives, have qualified themselves as Teachers of Infant Schools, and some are training for Assistant Missionaries. They possess a pair of Globes, with Grammars, Lexicons, Greek Testaments, &c, and everything requisite for extended and successful operations.

4. In Fejee,* also, a similar Institution, but on a smaller scale, has been commenced. Five persons are going through a course of

preparatory studies as Assistant Missionaries, and at the last District Meeting, it was resolved, that in order to meet more fully the case of the Native Helpers and Local Preachers, Branch Institutions should be formed in the different Stations. One of the Missionaries has prepared a system of Theology, in the form of lectures, and a volume of Sermons has been prepared and printed for the use of the Native Teachers generally.

5. In Southern Africa, two Institutions are in active and vigorous operation—One at Haslope Hills—the Watson Institution, has already been the means of diffusing much good, having been established several years; and another at Farmerfield, which has sent forth three Local Preachers during the year, while seven Class Leaders have also received training, to enable them efficiently to discharge the duties of their office.

6. At Freetown, in Sierra-Leone, Western Africa. For some few years, an Institution has been in operation of the same kind, and with similar results. In 1844, three young men well trained and well qualified for the work, were placed in the Schools as Assistant Teachers; since that time several others have been placed at different Stations, some of them qualified to assist the labours of the Missionary, and eleven students are still receiving instruction in English Grammar, Latin, History, Natural Philosophy, the use of the Globes, Composition; and above all, they are reported as "well grounded in the fundamental truths of religion and most of them have their minds well fortified with the doctrines of Evangelical truth"*

7. At Akrah, Cape Coast, a Station only very lately occupied, an Institution has also been established under the care of the Rev. Mr. Wharton, who while labouring in the West Indies nobly offered himself for this work and was removed to this important charge; he says "there are only five at present under Instruction, but four of these are most acceptable Local Preachers."

DEPARTMENT OF TRANSLATIONS AND PRINTING OPERATIONS.

1. In CEYLON NORTH.—At Jaffna, the Rev. Peter Percival has been engaged to revise the Bible in the Tamul language, under the auspices of the Jaffna Auxiliary Bible Society.

In SOUTH CEYLON, At Negombo,—the Rev. R. S. Hardy is engaged on a Manual for Catechists and Local Preachers in two parts, compri-

sing, 1st. the Evidences of Christianity; and, 2nd. a Theological Dictionary. He also publishes a periodical in Singhaleese, entitled the "Treasure of Ceylon."

3000 copies of the Pentateuch have been printed, for which the Bible Society has granted 500 reams of paper. They have also published Doddridge's Rise and Progress—A Manual of Prayers for Christian Families—A Compendium of History and Chronology in Tamul,—and a Wesleyan Hymn Book in Tamul, containing 400 Hymns.

In BANGALORE, the Mission Press under the care of the Rev. J. Garrett, is an agent of great usefulness. Thousands of copies of valuable books issue from it every year, and by very ingenious improvements, which the Missionaries have made in the Cauaree type, the labour of three weeks can now be performed in three days, at proportionably reduced expense.

2. SOUTH SEAS, VAVAU.—1200 Elementary books have been printed; 1200 Lessons for Infant Schools; A quarterly periodical has been commenced but the principal labor has been directed to a Tonga and English Vocabulary, and a new and Improved version of the New Testament.

3. FEJEE.—Sermons and Hymns have been translated and printed at the Mission Press, in the Lakemba, Rewa, and Bau dialects, with 3000 copies of an Abstract of the Liturgy. The translation of the New Testament is in operation.

4. In Albany and Kaffraria, the Missionaries have translated a great part of the Bible, and are still laboriously engaged; 93,750 half sheets have been printed during the year, and it is proposed during the ensuing year, to print 2000 copies of each of the other Books of the Bible not already published, besides 3000 second Catechisms in Kaffer, and 200 Rules of Society in Dutch.

It was confidently expected that in February, 1846, the improved Edition of the entire New Testament, in Kaffer, would be printed off, nearly the whole being the work of Wesleyan Missionaries alone, both in translation and in printing; three fourths of the Old Testament was also in hand either in MS or already printed.

In addition to these, a Kaffer Vocabulary, by one of the Society's oldest Missionaries, has been published in London, under the superintendence of the Rev. Mr. Boyce, author of the Kaffer Grammar, in which the leading principles of the language were for the first time accurately developed.

HOSTILITY AND OPPOSITION.

Under this head there is reason for devout thanksgiving to God that much less has to be recorded of a character inimical and unfriendly

to the work than has been the case in many former years. At the same time the character of the opposition that has been met with, has been of a kind unknown in the earlier history of Christian Missions. It is true that wars and rumours of wars are still recorded in the history of some of our Missions, at the present time; but this will be the case until, under the mild and peaceful influence of practical Christianity, the nations "shall learn war no more." But it is unhappily principally under the influence of opposition from within the pale of nominal Christianity than from without, that the hands of some of our devoted Missionaries have been caused to hang down. We shall endeavour faithfully to depict a few leading features of opposition, in both kinds.

In New Zealand, painful feelings have harassed the minds of the friends of Christian Missions, owing to the sanguinary war, carried on between the British forces and some Native tribes; later intelligence, however, has much relieved this distressing anxiety. A letter from Rev. W. Lawry, powerfully depicts their situation. He says: "Our Stations at the Hokianga and Waima, where we have four families, are within a few hours walk of the battle field, and our beloved brethren there live in dread and alarm, their wives and daughters often taking a little rest, with their clothes on, ready for the midnight rush of the lawless and enraged warrior."

At the Waimate one Society of 80 members has been induced to leave us and go over to the Church of England, at the instance of Ministers of that Church, holding High Church views.

In the South Seas, Popery is making a vigorous effort to establish itself. French aggression has threatened the Island of Tonga, and the late King had dictated, prior to his death, a letter to the Queen of England, imploring protection—that protection has been promised by the British Government, in answer to his application, which was forwarded through the Mission Secretaries. At Wallis Island, Popery has been introduced, and already one of our Native Agents, John Mahe, has fallen a victim to the fury of the Popish party; the Priests have openly denounced this religion as of the devil, and cursed its adherents. A beautiful little chapel, built and decorated by the Natives, was at the instigation of the two priests, who announced themselves as sacred men of God, set on fire in the night and burnt to the ground.

At Lakemba, in Fejec, a Romish Bishop and two priests arrived, but the King refused to receive them; however, the Bishop contrived to leave the two priests at an outer Island, under pretence of waiting a passage to another place; still it is gratifying to learn, that they had not at the latest accounts, made any favorable impression on the mind of the natives.

In Southern Africa, since the publication of the last Annual Report of the Parent Society, a painfully disturbed state of feeling has existed in Caffraria great apprehensions for the future prosperity of the Mission; a destructive and sanguinary war has already led to the suspension of some of our otherwise prosperous operations, and the lives of some of our Missionaries have been placed in the most imminent danger.

In Western Africa, on the Slave Coast, a war between the King of Dahomey and the Akus had placed the life of our Missionary, Rev. Samuel Annear, in the greatest peril. Subsequently an irruption from the Porto Nuovians, again placed him and his family in critical circumstances.

Other instances of opposition from the Church of Rome and from that milder yet not less noxious form of error, Puseyism, might be adduced, but it will be a more pleasing task to turn to a more favorable view of our successes and prospects which will be afforded us by a

GENERAL RETROSPECT.

The Missions in Europe, including Ireland, France, Germany, Switzerland, and Spain, are generally speaking in a very prosperous condition; there are 50 Missionaries, 31 Stations, 4964 members, 6042 children.

In CEYLON and Continental INDIA, heathenism appears to be giving way before the truth. Many heathen Temples are entirely shut up, and a number more nearly deserted. As a mark of indirect success, mingled with much of a more direct character, it is worthy of remark that the Missionaries in Madras correspond with a band of Christian soldiers, at Aden, in Arabia, who consider themselves under their pastoral care; even in Arabia, we have an humble place for the worship of God. They also correspond with Moulmain, in Burmah, and with Hong Kong in China. On the subject of that foul remnant of heathenism, *caste*, to which some of the native Christians, and even native Missionaries cling, a commission of enquiry has been instituted by the Bishop of Madras. The Missionaries of all denominations have engaged in the investigation, and it is likely to lead soon to its entire extinction.

In Ceylon and Continental India, where our Missions were first established in 1813, no Members being returned till 1815, and then only 50, we have 23 Stations, 1661 Members, and 7391 Scholars.

The next Missions on the regular list, are those of Australasia and Polynesia. These are peculiarly interesting to the Christian Public, not only from the fact that great success has attended our efforts, but that of late years, great facility has been afforded for inter-

communication between the islands and the main land of Australia, by the periodical trips of the Mission Ship. The Triton, which was purchased with the proceeds of one part of the Centenary Fund, has in the last seven years saved by the single articles of freight and passage money alone, sufficient to defray the expenses of building a more commodious and substantial vessel, which was launched and sailed in November last, named the John Wesley, bearing to the Islands of the Pacific, 16 laborers in the Mission field, with wives and some children, a noble object for the prayers and faith of God's people in every land, and indeed the very first vessel built expressly for the purpose of being engaged in the Mission work alone.

It is a matter of the deepest and holiest gratification to be able to state that in what was lately cannibal Fejee, not less than 2250 have formally renounced heathenism, upwards of one thousand of whom have united themselves with the Church of Christ.

In Australia and Polynesia we have 52 Missionaries, 33 Stations, 14,040 Members, and 16,974 Scholars.

We next turn to Southern Africa, including the Cape of Good Hope District, those of Albany and Kaffraria, and the Bechuana Districts; uninterrupted prosperity attends the former of these; Sabbath and Day Schools, Doreas Societies, Tract and Bible Distribution Societies, are in active and vigorous operation in immediate connection with direct ministerial efforts. In Caffreland much disturbance has been suffered in connection with the late war, since the publication of the Annual Report, but in the Bechuana District the prospect was still encouraging. In Western Africa, the cause of Christ is in great prosperity, new doors are opening, fresh instances of good developing, on the Slave Coast, at Cape Coast Castle, at Ashanti, at Sierra Leone,* and at the Gambia the Missionaries are thanking God and taking courage. The total numbers in all Africa are 61 Missionaries, 52 Stations, 7946 Members, 10,257 Scholars.

The Missions in the West Indies, next call for a passing notice; in the five Districts we have 86 Missionaries, 50 Circuits, 55,947 Members, 19,273 Scholars. These were established in 1785, with 2 Missionaries and 1108 Members.

* As a proof of the sympathy the Africans themselves feel in the removal of the late Sir Thos. Fowell Buxton, Bart. the friend of Africa, they are not only erecting a spacious chapel in Freetown, to be called "Buxton Chapel" but they have subscribed a large sum for a monument to be erected there, and one hundred pounds towards one to be erected in Westminster Abbey.

Nothing more in this General Retrospect remains but to notice the Missions in British North America.

In Western Canada we have 19 Missionaries, 23 Stations, 2,981 Members, 1,711 Scholars.*

In Eastern Canada, 17 Missionaries, 15 Stations, 415 Members, 2,945 Scholars. In New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, our oldest Station; 1785. Prince Edwards Island and Cape Breton, with Newfoundland and the Hudson's Bay Territory, we have 65 Missionaries, 57 Stations, 11,496 Members, 7,032 Scholars.—Total in British North America under the British Conference, 101 Missionaries, 95 Stations, 18,592 Members, 11,688 Scholars.
