In the meantime on their immediate left a battalion from British Columbia was performing a feat of arms which has hardly as yet been equalled in this war.

NO JOBS IN CIVIL SERVICE FOR MEN WHO SHOULD BE IN KHAKI

Ottawa, Oct. 12.—"During the war no man of military age may be cointed to either the inside or the outside civil service unless a badge has been issued to him," is the significant statement in an order in-co council which was issued today. The possession of such a badge means that the possessor has offered to enlist and has been exempted from military service. About a year age the government instructed the heads of the various departments that preference was to be given in nts to men who had been on service overseas. A further order has been passed to ensure effective operation of the policy and to prevent the appointment of men eligible for military service to govern nents to either the inside or the outside civil service preference must be given to men of overseas service who have been honorably discharged and more especially those who through disability are unable to resume their former occupations.


Meant to the Enemy.

Monday and Tuesday's advance on the Somme is the most decisive event that has occurred on the Western front since the Battle of the Maine. Victory is a word that one hesitates to apply to any tactical success, however great. It has much too great an air of finality. Yet the Allied achievements this week on the Somme can hardly be described otherwise. They have changed the whole situation in our favor, and have demonstrated our final mastery in the siege-warfare that has prevailed on the West since late September 1914. At Yerdun the Germans put forth their whole effort to the last ounce, but they achieved nothing like this. Our effort, so far from being at its height, is growing in weight, day by day and though there are probably many months of hard and bitter fighting before us, there is no longer any need to limit our expectations,
