New Railway Freight House.

The new freight house for the Eastern Road, just finished on the spot where the old Mill Pond has been filled in at Portland Bridge, will give the great accommodation that has been long wanting, and the choked up business of the Railway will now have, as soon as the outside platforms are finished, and the ballasting done, that it will want in the next fifteen years.

The Eastern end of the building is within 100 feet of Portland Bridge. It has an entrance from the Bridge, and also entrances from Mill street and Pond street. Messrs. Clark and Stackhouse were the contractors for erecting the building and ballasting the approaches to it.

The building is 395 ft. long, and 130 feet broad. It has three tracks running the whole length of it, which will accommodate 30 cars at one time. The delivery side is to the south.

It is furnished with three platform scales, of Fairbanks' make, capable of weighing four and a half tons of weight. The office of the station master and assistants are on each side of the western end of the building.

They are heated by steam. At the south eastern end of the building runs a platform 210 ft. long and 15 wide. At the north eastern end a platform 300 ft. long and 30 ft. broad runs. The shorter one is for delivering freight, the other is for receiving; the short one will accommodate 7 cars and the long one 10, making inside and out the building room for 17 cars.

For the past fortnight, there has been more than the usual activity in the coastwise freight business, and the carriages effected have been large. At this moment, shippers are pretty well supplied, and the coastwise freight business is very active.
