### ANNUAL REPORT

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OF THE

## ST. GEORGE'S SOCIETY.

FOR THE YEAR ENDING JAN. 5TH, 1865.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT.

The Annual Meeting of the St. George's Society was held on the 5th inst., at the Society's Rooms, Dexter's Hotel.

A. Jno. Maxham, Esq., read the President's Report Geo. Fitch, Esq., that of the charitable committee and Geo. Vcasey, Esq., laid on the table his financial statemen -balance on hand \$405 30.

The following is an abstract of the cases of relief, taken from Mr. Fitch's Report.

#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT.

#### GENTLEMEN,

We have this day met according to custom to receive the Annual Reports of the Society's operations for the past year, and your Managing Committee in resigning their trust beg leave to present you with the following record.

Each preceding report has spoken of the increasing claims upon the bounty of the society, but it is as pleasing a fact, as it will we trust be gratifying to you, to learn, that while the calls upon its bounty have been more numerous, your committee have had the satisfaction of meeting every difficulty and rendering the aid needed to meet the wants and necessities of our indigent and deserving fellow countrymen.

Since the last annual meeting, the accession to our numbers is not as great as we had to reason to hope, being only *four* ordinary members and two ordinary members becoming life-members.

On the other hand we have to deplore the loss by death of several of its oldest members, viz Henry Jessop, Esquire, formerly Collector of H. M Customs, who was a zealous member of the society: and Hammond Gowen, Esquin and th he was classic useful We Harve

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death lessop, was a lowen, Esquire, a retired merchant and one of its earliest members; and the Revd. R. R. Burrage, chaplain to the society till he was removed from Quebec,—a gentleman of high classical attainments and a most earnest, indefatigable, and useful member.

We have also to mention the death of Mr. George Harvey, Mr. J. C. Stokes and Mr. Edwin Hawkins, the latter who met his death at that memorable and lamentable occurrence, the explosion of the laboratory at St. John's Gate.

Our Patron Saint's day was celebrated as usual. Divine Service was held in the cathedral in the morning. A touching and eloquent sermon was preached by his Lordship the Bishop of Quebec, who forcibly shewed that, by the discharge of duties of one towards another, the social compact is held together, and thence, the individuals who compose this and societies that are kindred to it, become bound to each other by a more immediate relation, than that in which they stard to others of the community; urging us to go on in the good work, as it was by such compacts, that we recognize the combined triumph of amiable, charitable and social feelings.

An excellent musical service was performed by the Ladies and Gentlemen of the Voluntary Choir, conducted by our able organist, Mr. James Pearce, Mus. Bac. Ox.

The collection amounted to \$51 14.

On reference to the Report of the Charitable Committee it will be seen that the amount expended considerably exceeds the past year to the extent of \$109.96 and has been attended not only with corresponding but most satisfactory results.

The arrangements with the Finlay Asylum still continue

and the advantages the Society derive from it, the members cannot be supposed to know, as such have fallen only under the notice of the Charitable Committee who for the information of the Society will place before them, in what these benefits consist. Ever since the Society has been in existence (till within the last two years) there has been no place, no institution, or asylum where Emigrants from our native land, in indigent circumstances, could be sent to : the result of which was, with the temporary relief given them they sought accommodation where best they could, in crowded inns, or taverns exposed to insult, discomfort, and imposition, apart from the contamination likely to ensue. Since however, by the suggestion and influence of our estimable and respected Chaplain, the Revd. Mr. Housman, a temporary arrangement has been sanctioned on the part of the Trustees of the Finlay Asylum, Mount Pleasant, permitting the Society to send Immigrante direct to that Institution, where they remain till either occupation is found for them, or fitting opportunity occurs to forward them to their destination, the trifling sum of a shilling a day being charged for their board at the Asylum.

We have also to allude to a similar Institution in this City, which has also opened its doors to the protection of such of those who come under the auspices of the society, as in the former there was not the accommodation or convenience for their reception.—Such your committee think is a great boon to the society, and one which it is an object to cherish and support—(neither of these Institutions, your Committee learn, is free from encumbrance, being dependant on the contributions of the charitable) and would suggest to the consideration of their successors in office, the propriety of making a Donation to these establishments

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when circumstances would permit and in so far as is consistent with the Charter of the Society.

The subject of the Repairs of the Wolfe and Montealm Monument has not been forgotten, and your committee have been waiting the action of the government in the matter.

Your Committee regret to see the lukewarmness shewn on the part of most of the members, that at the Quarterly and Monthly meetings (in a society numbering 200) so few attend. In the latter, frequently we can not form a Quorum, and desire to urga on its members the desirability of their taking a more lively interest in the operation of the society as well as in recruiting to increase our members.

I cannot resign my office, Gentlemen, without expressing my acknowledgement to the several gentlemen composing the Charitable Committee for their assistance and more particularly to one, I believe of its oldest, most staunch, and zealous members, I mean Mr. George Fitch, whose assiduous, untiring, and self sacrificing action in the interests of the society have rendered my office nearly obsolete.

It now remains with you to elect the officers for the present year.

Through the liberality and influence of the 1st Vice-President (Joseph White, Esq.,) who has ever been active and energetic in promoting the interest of the Society, several free passages have been procared, thereby effecting a considerable saving of the funds.

The Earl of Ellesmere, K. G., visited the United States in 1854, as one of the Queen's Commissioners to attend the opening of the New York Crystal Palace, which made him favorably known to the American people. He visited Quebec also at that time, and was the guest of the

Earl of Elgin. He expired at Bridgewater House, St. James, on Wednesday, the 18th March 1857. The deceased was born on the 1st Jan., 1800.

George Germain Ardouin, born at Quebec, 16th January, 1824. Died in Quebec, 23rd February, 1857, at the age of 37 years.

William Dupont, native of London, England, Died at Three Rivers, 5th November 1857, at the age of 58 years.

Robert Roberts, born in 1797, Halkin, North Wales, came to Canada.

1819. Died at Quebec, 2nd July, 1858, at the age of 61 years. Zaccheus Williams, born at Bangor, North Wales, 12th July, 1797. Died at Quebec, 19th November, 1858, at the age of 61 years.

John Robert Nathaniel Symes, Justice of the Peace, (senior Life Member of the Society.) Born at Camberwell, Surrey, 6th Jany., 1794. Came to Quebec, 22nd May, 1816. Died suddenly at the residence of his son. Dr. T. Fargues, Symes, Coroner, Meaford, C. W., 10th December, 1855, at the age of 64 years. Was treasurer from the formation of the So iety, for sixteen years consecutively. The Society has erected a monument to his memory in the Cathedral.

John Shaw, born at Devonport, England, 27 Oct., 1811, came to Canada, July 6, 1833. Died at Quebec, 8th July, 1859.

I. R. Eckart, born at Quebec, 16th March, 1805. Died by accidental drowning at Lake St. Charles, near Quebec, July 1859.

Wm. Dawson, born in Sunderland, England, 1786, elected a member of the Society in 1837. Died at Quebec, May, 1859.

Francis B, Noad, born at Quebec, Died at Montreal, 18th February, 1860, aged 39 years.

W. W. Wheeler, native of England. Died at Quebec, 20th November, 1860, aged 45 years.

Henry LeMesurier, Justice of the Peace, born at Guernsey. Died at Quebec, 25th May, 1861, aged 69 years.

James Taylor, born at Northumberland. Died at Quebec, 15th Nov., 1861, aged 46 years.

The Right Revd. George Jehoshaphat Mountain, D. D., D. C. L., Lord Bishop of Quebec, was the second son of Bishop Jacob Mountain, the first Anglican Bishop of Quebec. He was born, 27th July 1789, at Norwich, England, came to Canada, with his father, in 1793, and died after a brief illness at Bardfield, his country seat, on 5th Jany., 63. He was nineteen years Rector of Quebec and was consecrated Bishop, 14th February 1836. He was a diligent visitor among his flock. And in the dreadful visitations of cholera in 1832 and 1834 he literally lived night and day among the dying and the dead, while in '47 when the province was visited with the plague of typhus fever and the poor emigrants were dying by thousands at the Quarantine station, the Bishop took his turn at Grosse Isle regularly with the rest of the clergy; and again when the Cholera visited Quebec, in 1849 and 1854, he was diligent in visiting the hospitals. During many years and up to the time of his death, Bishop Mountain, besides his life membership contributed regu-



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larly to this Society a donation equal to four annual subscriptions; and at all times he took a great interest in its proceedings. G. B. Symes, born in Quebec. Died at Montreal, 12th June 1863.

Barnard Thompson, born at Peckham, Surrey England. Died at Quebcc, 19th January, 1863.
