EXPLANATIONS OF PRINCIPAL ARTICLES
OF THE CALENDAR FOR THE YEAR 1882

On the left hand page of each month are given the Day of the Month, Day of the week, Time of Sunrise and Sunset, to the nearest minute of local mean time, and the data requisite for Solar observations, for time and latitude, namely: Equation of time ("sun fast or slow of clock,") for the instant of Apparent Noon at Greenwich, with the hourly variation of the same. The Sun's Declination with its variation is given for Greenwich Mean Noon, and the Sun's apparent Semi-diameter for every day in the year.

The Declination at Greenwich Apparent Noon, when required, can be obtained by multiplying the hourly variation by the equation of time reduced to the decimal of an hour, and applying the result to the Declination at Mean Noon, as here directed below:

From the Sun's apparent Semi-diameter may be found the sun's horizontal Parallax, on dividing the Semi-diameter by 107.44, (the ratio of the sun's diameter to that of the earth.) Thus on July 1st, (Sun in apogee) semi-diameter $\frac{15m. 46s. - 0.96}{107.44} = 8.''805$ hor. parallax;—Decem. 31 perigee $\frac{15m. 18.2m.}{107.44} = 9.104$. To find the days length. Subtract the time of sunrise from 12 hours and add the time of sunset; or multiply the time of sunset by 2, previously adding the Equation of Time if sun is fast, subtracting if slow. Example:

On the right hand page of each month are the changes of the moon, its Rising, Southing, and Setting, and the time of High Water at Charlottetown, all reduced to the nearest minute of local mean time. The bearing of the Moon at the times of full and change, the times of Perigee and Apogee, in crossing the Equinoctial, and of reaching its greatest Declination are given for the purpose of assisting weather forecasts, it being generally found that the Lunar Equinoctials are marked by atmospheric disturbances, the stronger the more nearly the times agree with those of the moon's changes and perigee.

ECLIPSES.

During the year 1882 there will be but two Eclipses, both of the sun, but neither visible at Charlottetown.

1st. A Total Eclipse of May 16. Greenwich mean time of conjunction, 19h. 41m. 2 sec., partially visible through the whole of Europe and Asia and Africa, except the southern extremity, the central line of totality from Timbuctoo, Egypt, Arabia, Persia, north of India and China.

2nd. An Annular Eclipse, November 11. G. M. T. of conjunction, 11h. 26m. 18.1sec., only partially visible at Borneo, Japan and Australia. Only land where the annular phase can be observed is the southeast coast of New Guinea.

Transit of Venus.

The most important astronomical event not only of the year, but of the century is the Transit of Venus across the sun's disc, on December 6th. Greenwich mean time of conjunction being 4h. 20m. 28sec., renders it favorable for observation at Charlottetown, except that the time of the last contact is too near the sunset to be well seen. 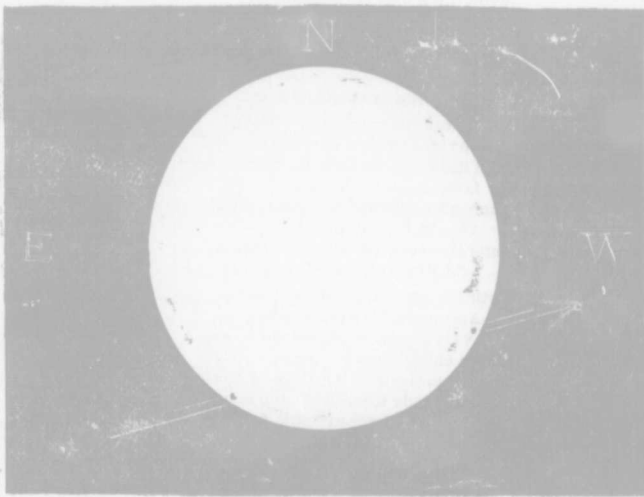

The arrow marks the apparent track of the planet as seen at Charlottetown; the line parallel to it shows the track as calculated from the position of the Earth's centre.

The essential point in observing the transit will be to determine accurately the time of the first and last Internal contact.

PLANETS.

MERCURY.—Mercury will be at his greatest apparent distance from the Sun, West rising before, East setting after the Sun on the following days, Feb. 6th, E., March 20th, West, June 1, East, July 19th, West, Sept. 28th, East, November 7th, West.

VENUS.—Venus will be in superior conjunction with the Sun, Feb. 20th, in inferior conjunction, December 6th, when she will transit the sun's disc. Between these dates she will be an Evening Star, coming to her greatest apparent distance in August and September.

MARS.—Mars will be an Evening Star throughout the year till in conjunction with the Sun December 10th.

JUPITER.—Jupiter will be an Evening Star during the early part of the year, coming in conjunction with the Sun May 29th, reappearing as a Morning Star early in June; in opposition to the Sun December 17th. There will be an occultation of Jupiter by the Moon April 19th, but invisible at Charlottetown.

SATURN.—Saturn will still be in the neighborhood of Jupiter, but their apparent distance continues to increase throughout the year. He will be in conjunction with the Sun May 5th, and in opposition November 14th.

URANUS.—Uranus will be an Evening Star till September, reappearing as a Morning Star, after his conjunction with the Sun September 11th. Uranus will be in conjunction with Mars July 27th, and with Venus July 29, when he may be found by the aid of a telescope close below those planets.

NEPTUNE.—Neptune will be in conjunction with the Sun May 6th, in opposition Nov. 9.

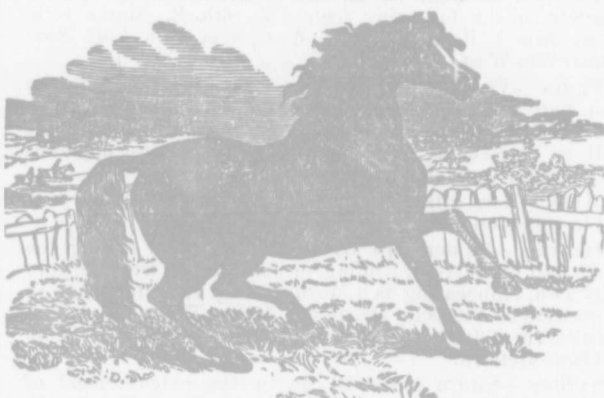

FORECASTING THE WEATHER.

Men have, from a very early period, studied the weather, on account of its great influence on their pursuits, in order if possible to predict its nature and prevent those losses to the Farmer and the Sailor which result from violent storms.

The earlier students based their predictions on the phases of the moon, but an examination of the Greenwich observations for more than half a century has shown that this theory is entirely unfounded. Weather prophets like Moore, Zadkiel, and Vennor claim in their Almanacs to be able to forecast the weather day by day for a whole year: but meteorological science in the British Isles, and the Signal Service of the United States, with the Weather Bureau of the Dominion, does not claim to forecast with any certainty, the weather for more than three or four days at the most.

If an observer could obtain, at regular and repeated intervals, readings of the Barometer at stations distributed over a large area, he would be enabled to trace the march of the storm, for it has been found that the wind always blows towards the place of the lowest barometer reading; and so by means of the telegraph, he may warn those places the storm is approaching. Still, mistakes are often made, and the forecasts are not always infallible, so that much remains to be done before meteorology can be ranked among the exact sciences.

THE WEATHER AND PROBABLE EVENTS, 1882.

In Newfoundland the winter of 1882 is likely to be extremely severe and stormy.

A warm wave is likely to occur over a large portion of North America, during the month of November, 1881, and again during January and February, 1882.

A frigid wave may be expected towards the close of November and entry of December, 1881.

The winds and storms of March will probably arrive ahead of time, and render the closing days of February exceedingly disagreeable.

The latter part of April and entry of May, 1882, will remind one of winter again, and the spring is likely to be cold and backward generally.

The winter of 1882 is not likely to be characterized by heavy snow falls on this side of the Atlantic.

December, 1881, will be a month of storms in the lake region.

The summer of 1882 will be generally unfavourable to agriculture, owing to cold and wet weather.

There will be brief periods of severe cold during the winter of 1882 and longer ones of warmth.

The time of High Water, Charlottetown, is given for the nearest minute each day once in the twenty-four hours. To find the time of the intervening tide, take the mean of the two adjacent tides. The following tables give the time of high water at full and change for the places named, with constants to be applied as directed to the time of high water at Charlottetown. To find the time for the places named these results are but approximate as the time in different localities are variously affected by winds, &c.

MAY.—Venus and Mars are evening stars. Jupiter has disappeared in the Sun's rays.

JUNE.—Jupiter may be seen before sunrise towards the end of the month. Venus and Mars after sunset.

JULY.—Venus and Mars are evening stars. Jupiter is a morning star.

AUGUST.—Venus and Mars are evening stars. Jupiter is a morning star.

SEPTEMBER.—Venus may still be seen a while after sunset. Mars is too near the sun. Jupiter is on the meridian about sunrise.

OCTOBER.—Venus is an evening star. Jupiter is still seen in the morning.

NOVEMBER.—A solar eclipse is caused by the moon passing directly between the observer and the sun.

DECEMBER.—When an inferior planet, Mercury or Venus, passes directly between the Earth and the Sun, it is called a Transit. This happens with Venus on the 6th inst.

2. The phases happening from 4 to 10 p. m., may be followed by fair weather; but this chiefly depends upon the direction of the wind.

3. If a storm arises from the East, on or immediately preceding the Spring Equinox, or a week after, the following Spring or Summer will be wet four times out of five; if from the West, North or S. W., the Spring and Summer will be dry five times out of six.

The rate of Postage on a letter posted within the Dominion of Canada, for transmission by Mail to any place in Canada, is three cents per half ounce weight; but the Statute provides that this rate must be prepaid by Postage Stamp at the time of posting the letter.

Any such letter posted wholly *unpaid* (or prepaid less than one full rate of *three cents*) cannot be forwarded to its destination, but will be sent to the Dead Letter Office, with the reason plainly written or marked upon it—" *postage not prepaid.*"

Letters as aforesaid posted in Canada, and addressed to places in Canada, when weighing more than half an ounce, and liable therefore to two or more rates of Postage, will be transmitted by mail to destination, though not fully prepaid, if as much as one full rate of three cents has been prepaid thereon by postage stamps; and in such cases will be forwarded charged with double the amount of deficient postage not prepaid: Thus, if such a letter weighing more than $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., and not exceeding 1 oz. in weight, be posted prepaid 3 cents only, it will be rated 6 cents unpaid—" *more to pay*"—and forwarded to its address.

On letters posted at an Office to be delivered from it, commonly known as "*drop letters.*" the rate is 1 cent per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.; to be in all cases prepaid by postage stamp affixed to such letters when posted.

The charge for the Registration of a letter is 2 cents, to be prepaid by Registration stamp.

CANADA AND NEWFOUNDLAND.

Letters for Newfoundland are charged at the rate of *five cents* per half ounce, and must in all cases be *prepaid.*

CANADA AND THE UNITED STATES.

The rate of postage upon letters passing by mail between Canada and the United States is the same as to places within the Dominion, and must in all cases be prepaid by postage stamp.

The Registration fee to the United States is 5 cents, to be prepaid by Registration stamp.

TRANSIENT NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS.

Addressed to Great Britain must be prepaid by postage stamp *one cent per 2 oz.* each packet.

PARCEL POST.

To any part of the Dominion, for each parcel weighing Not more than 4 ozs., 6 cents,

Exceeding 4 ozs., and not exceeding 8 ozs., 12 cents,

Each additional 4 ozs. or fraction. 6 cents.

Parcels should not exceed 5 lbs. in weight or 24 inches in length, or 12 inches in breadth, and should be marked "by *Parcel Post.*" Parcels may be registered by affixing a 5 cent Registered Letter Stamp thereto, in addition to the Postage.

MISCELLANEOUS POSTAL MATTER.

CANADA AND THE UNITED STATES.

When posted addressed to any place in Canada or the United States, and not exceeding 5 lbs. in weight, 24 inches in length, and 12 inches in breadth, or depth, must be prepaid by Postage Stamp at the rate of 1 cent per 4 ounces in weight, and must be put up so as to admit of inspection. Such books, papers, returns, etc., must not be accompanied by any instructions or directions.

Legal and Commercial papers generally are liable to letter rate of Postage.

The rate of postage on Seeds, Cuttings, Bulbs and Roots is 1 cent per 4 ounces, the weight of a package not to exceed 24 ounces.

PATTERN AND SAMPLE POST.

CANADA.

Patterns and Samples of merchandize, not exceeding 24 ounces in weight, when posted in Canada for places within Canada or Newfoundland, must be prepaid by postage stamp at the rate of *One Cent* per 4 ounces weight, and put up in such a manner as to admit of inspection.
