GRAND JURY HAS THE CASE NOW

Preparations for the Great Trial of Pare, Fave, Mackie and Holden—Said Experts to Confront Pare's Evidence and Confession—The Safe and Combination Will Be in Court.

Napanee, Nov. 22.—At noon yesterday W. H. Ponton, the hero of the Dominion Bank robbery trial, surrounded himself with a jury of twelve of his peers whether he will leave the jail on route to the penitentiary or as a free but singularly unfortunate young man.

The Napanee branch of the Dominion Bank was entered and robbed of \$28,000 on the night of August 27, 1897. The combinations of the vault and safe were worked, the sum of \$28,000 was taken, and the safe was not until 24 hours after the commission of the crime.

The Pinkerton detective agency was given control of the case, and Detective Dougherty and Walker, the men delegated to ferret out the robbery, after looking over the scene, as once arrived at the conclusion that it had its origin inside the bank.

The arrest of W. H. Ponton, the teller, followed on October 5, 1897. At the preliminary examination Ponton refused to plead, but the evidence adduced was not sufficient in Magistrate Daly's opinion to send accused for trial. Later, however, other men imported into the case, and the Magistrate admitted the four accused for trial. This trial began, and the judge having changed the grand jury yesterday.

In the Court Room.
